Death Prompts Lawsuit

A \$2 million lawsuit has been filed against three students at Mississippi State University over the death last year of another student, Curtis Huntley, in an alledged hazing incident at the University.

The suit was filed by the victim's father against three former pledges of one of the University's fraternities and their parents.

A University spokesman said Curtis Huntley, then a member of the fraternity, died from injuries he suffered when he jumped from a car as he was being driven to a mud hole used for dunking fraternity pledges.
