DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD ANNOUNCED

One of the highest honors an alumnus in Alpha Sigma Phi can receive is the Distinguished Service Award. Trusten P. Wadsworth (California '17), Berkeley, CA, has been named the 1982 recipient of this prestigious award.

The award will be presented to Brother Wadsworth by Grand Councilor Edmund Hamburger (Brooklyn Poly Tech '45) at the annual Founders Day Banquet of the Bay Area Alumni Council, on December 7 in San Francisco.

"Tux" Wadsworth served as HSP of Nu Chapter in 1924, and has served as Secretary, Editor, Treasurer and President of the Bay Area Alumni Council. He is recognized for developing and maintaining the Bay Area Alumni Council's strength through leadership, hard work, and sound example. He is honored as well for his outstanding leadership in re-establishing Nu Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi at the University of California, Berkeley. He received the Delta Beta Xi Award in 1975.

1982 DELTA BETA XI CLASS ANNNOUNCED

In 1864, Alpha Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity at Yale University successfully met the challenge of imminent suppression which threatened the young society. By their adoption of a tri-lateral alias, Delta Beta Xi was born and thus Alpha Sigma Phi was permitted to live. For eleven years, from 1864 to 1876, the traditions of Alpha Sigma Phi were continued on the Yale campus by successive sophomore classes who operated under this mask but who secretly pledged their allegiance to the Fraternity which Delta Beta Xi was created to perpetuate.

The Grand Council selects no more than ten men yearly to receive the Delta Beta Xi Award, in honor and recognition of loyal and distinguished service to the Fraternity.

Four alumni brothers have been named to the 1982 Delta Beta Xi Class. They are Donald Morgan (Purdue '57), the current Grand Marshal; Charles J. ("Bushy") Fox, (Cornell '09); Dr. Larry Spees (Ohio Wesleyan '57), GCA for Delta Epsilon Chapter and current Grand Province Chief for Province VI; and Charles R. McLean (Ohio State '53), former president of the Zeta Chapter Alumni Corporation. All awards will have been presented by the Grand Council (or their official representatives) by December 7. 
