Bill Passes

An anti-hazing bill has passed the Ohio House of Representatives by a margin of 59 to 26, and is awaiting action in the State Senate. The bill makes hazing a fourth-degree misdemeanor, punishable by up to 30 days in jail and a \$250 fine. The bill also makes hazing a civil offense, allowing the victim to sue for damages.
