FRATERNITY'S RECOGNITION REVOKED

The University of California at Berkeley last week withdrew its recognition of the campus chapter of Beta Theta Pi Fraternity, some of whose members were involved in a fight in January with four Chicanos who said they had been beaten outside the fraternity house.

The university said recognition had been lifted because of a pattern of misconduct and rules infractions.

CHARGE OF HAZING BY FRATERNITY

Syracuse University officials last week were investigating a complaint against a fraternity accused of violating state and university anti-hazing laws.

A university spokesman said that until the investigation was completed, he would not discuss a UPI report that five pledges of Delta Kappa Epsilon had been confined in the fraternity house basement and forced to drink stale beer and eat parts of a pig fetus and the head of a turkey.

A complaint against the fraternity was filed by a residence hall advisor who lives on the same floor as one of the five pledges, the UPI report said.
