

Pictured at left is the 1982 Alpha Sig Sweetheart, Dana Angeline. Nominated by Gamma Xi Chapter at Widener University, Dana was a good student (3.3/4.0 scale) and very involved with chapter activities, service projects and fund-raisers. She was active in a number of university clubs as well. As a member of the Screen Actors Guild, she was able to finance her entire college education by acting in TV commercials.

At the 1982 National Convention this past August, Dana was escorted at the Awards Banquet by Widener's chapter delegate Casey Liotta (Widener '81), serenaded with the Alpha Sig Sweetheart Song, and presented with Talisman roses and a sterling silver plaque commemorating her reign as the 1982 Alpha Sig Sweetheart.

Also pictured is the first runner-up for 1982, Lisa Jean Abt. Lisa, a student at Salem College, was the nominee of Beta Mu Chapter at Wake Forest University. A psychology major, Lisa has a long list of honors and activities.

# Please Note

#### A WORD ABOUT THE NAMES THAT APPEAR BELOW ....

Names of pledges and initiates, as they are reported to Fraternity Headquarters, are scheduled to appear in The Old Gal Gazette. Sometimes delays occur because of small, simple mistakes, such as:

- a chapter might fail to assign roster numbers on the form.
- a pledge's Biographical Data Sheet is incomplete (he didn't list his home address, etc.).
- names are spelled differently on the different forms (Pledge Report, Bio sheet, Initiation Authorization Request).

These little errors cause lengthy delays in processing pledges and initiates. If a new brother does not receive his BADGE, ID CARD and MEMBERSHIP CERTIFICATE within three weeks of his initiation, contact the Fraternity Headquarters! Chances are that there is a hold-up somewhere in the process.


