NATIONAL LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE AND CONVENTION '86 "THE PINNACLE VISION" A HUGE SUCCESS!!!

Over one hundred and sixty undergraduates and alumni faculty attended the 1986 National Leadership Conference & Convention at the University of Michigan from August 13-17, making it the most highly attended meeting of Alpha Sigs ever!! The Conference and Convention was themed "The Pinnacle Vision" with a goal of giving every undergraduate a vision of his chapter and for the whole fraternity. Highlights of the Conference and Convention included:

FEE INCREASE OF \$5.00 SET

The delegates of the National Leadership Conference & Convention in an effort to broaden the scope of services offered by the Fraternity, especially in the area of expansion, voted to implement an increase in undergraduate dues from \$40 per man per year to \$45 per man per year effective immediately. The delegates also approved a fee increase of an additional \$5.00 a year in 1987-88 to bring the total undergraduates pay in dues to \$50 per man per year.

The new fee of \$45 will be billed to the chapters \$25 for Fall term and \$20 for the Spring term.
