The Phoenix flies Four new colonies

The Spring of '86 has brought new growth to the "Old Gal" with four new colonies! Two of the new colonies are reactivations of dormant chapters at the University of Iowa, Alpha Beta Chapter, and Tufts University, Beta Iota Chapter. A top priority of the Fraternity's expansion program has been the reactivation of dormant chapters. Over the past five years eleven chapters have been reactivated, including U.C.L.A., Cal-Berkeley, Illinois, Miami, Tulane, Missouri, New Jersey Institute of Technology, Marshall, and Baldwin-Wallace. The other two new colonies this spring are located at Plattsburgh State University (NY) and William Paterson College (NJ).

The Phi Delta Colony at William Paterson traces its beginnings to the high school friendship of Chris White, Stockton State '84 and Frank Ruscil. White, a charter member and former HSP of his chapter at Stockton State shared his "founding father" experience with Ruscil, who then decided that his classmates should benefit from the Alpha Sigma Phi experience. Ruscil now serves as the president of the colony which has grown to 44 members, after an initial pledge class of 33 men. Grand Senior President Donald R. Morgan, Purdue '57, presented the Colonization Certificate to the group at ceremonies on January 18. Also in attendance at the dinner and ceremony were Past Grand Senior President (1978-80) Richard A. Dexter, Oregon State '60, Director of Chapter Development Tom Welsh, Westminster '79, Chapter Leadership Consultant Rich Kahler, Radford '82, and a host of area alumni.

The William Paterson campus is located in Wayne, NJ, about one-half hour from New York City, and has an enrollment of 10,000 students. A predominantly liberal arts college, William Paterson is state supported and has a rapidly developing Greek system. Over ten Greek organizations have started there in the past five years, and already Phi Delta Colony is gaining prominence. Their goal is a December chartering.

The 24 members of Phi Epsilon Colony at Plattsburgh State University were officially colonized on April 26th. When Eric Kirleis pledged Alpha Sigma Phi at Beta Epsilon Chapter, Lehigh University he took his lifetime vows seriously. When he transferred to Plattsburgh last fall, he decided to carry the spirit of the "Old Gal" with him. The colony has received extensive help from university Greek Advisor Ed Englebride, and is proud to have Faculty Advisor, Dr. Joseph B. Mosca, helping them. Grand Senior President Morgan and Chapter Leadership Consultant, Randy Lewis, Oregon State '81 represented the Fraternity at the colonization.

Plattsburgh is a part of the State University of New York system and traces its origin back to 1811. The university Greek system is growing, now with six fraternities and five sororities for the 5,000 enrolled students. Phi Epsilon is dedicated to improving fraternity life at Plattsburgh. Greek Advisor Ed Englebride says "Alpha Sigma Phi has an excellent core of men, we are excited to have you on campus!"

Alpha Beta Chapter, University of Iowa, was active from 1924–40. During that time the chapter boasted outstanding campus leaders, and fraternity leaders. Past Grand Senior President Charles T. Akre, Iowa '28 led the "Old Gal" from 1956–60. As a part of Alpha Sigma Phi's ongoing chapter reactivation program, the Fraternity has stayed in contact with the university. In 1984, the "Old Gal" was selected from among a group of other fraternities by the university Interfraternity Council to gain colonization permission in 1986.

A recruitment plan was implemented by Director of Chapter Development Welsh in February. During a two week visit to the lowa campus he pledged 12 men, then another eight on a return trip. The 20 man group was officially colonized at a banquet on April 13 with Grand Senior President Morgan presiding. University Greek Advisor Mary Skorup was a special guest of honor. The reactivation effort

has been highlighted by outstanding university support.

The Alpha Beta Colony is proud of its past and is building an even prouder future. The colony extends its appreciation to local alumni John Harrison, Iowa '31 and William Super, Purdue '73 for their support and advice!

Another high school friendship. Andy Martin, Cornell '83 was excited about Alpha Sigma Phi—even more so after attending the National Leadership Conference at Penn State last summer. He shared his enthusiasm with Chris Koenders, a high school friend and student at Tufts University. Even though he's a senior, Koenders felt that his university needed a quality fraternity like Alpha Sigma Phi. He enlisted the help of his friend John Keller and they spread the word. The result: 29 men pledged and an official colonization banquet held for the new Beta lota Colony on May 3. Grand Councilor, Charles Vohs, Penn State '75 presided at the ceremonies.

Beta lota Chapter was founded in 1931 as a chapter of Alpha Kappa Pi Fraternity. After the consolidation with Alpha Sigma Phi in 1946, Beta lota remained strong until its closing in 1978 due to low membership. Over 450 chapter alumni are still active today, and the alumni corporation has seed money for new housing left over from the sale of the old house. John F. Zamparelli, Tufts '47 is helping the colony and develop housing plans.




Ross O. Swimmer receives Distinguished Merit Award

Grand Senior President, Donald R. Morgan, Purdue '57 presented the 1985 Distinguished Merit Award to Ross O. Swimmer, Oklahoma '62 at special ceremonies in Washington, D.C. on December 5. Ironically, that same day Swimmer had been sworn in as Assistant Secretary of the Interior for Indian Affairs. In accepting this federal appointment by President Reagan, Brother Swimmer was required to give up his position as Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation.

After graduating from Oklahoma, and its law school in 1967 Brother Swimmer began an active involvement with the Cherokee Nation. In 1975 when he was elected to his first term as Principal Chief he was the youngest man ever to have reached the office. His ten years in office brought great progress to the tribe. During that time he also served as President of the First National Bank of Tahleguah.

The Cherokee Nation's economic development and reduced dependence on federal aid has marked Brother Swimmer's terms as Chief. Last year Parade Magazine and The Today Show both highlighted the tribe's progress under Brother Swimmer's leadership. Since his election the tribe's income for administering programs for the Cherokee people has grown from \$5 million to over \$20

million annually—funds which provide college scholarships, community health clinics, new homes, job training, and countless other services. Great strides have been made to develop tribally-owned business which create jobs and establish a strong economic base for the Cherokee Nation.

Brother Swimmer's accomplishments, community involvement, and selection as chief administrator for Indian Affairs in our country brings pride to our brotherhood and we commend his example.
