

Bethany, West Virginia was the setting for Alpha Sigma Phi's largest national meeting ever. Over 190 brothers gathered to be a part of one of the best conferences of its kind. Brothers were welcomed by Beta Gamma Brothers who hosted the conference.

Several outstanding sessions were delivered such as: Barbie Tootle's "Human Dignity and Sexual Responsibility;" Ed King's "Secret Thoughts on Fraternity Ritual;" Mike Green's "Responsible Partying;" Dave Westol's "Legal Liabilities" and Christine Lyman's "Body Talk: Men's Sexual Health Issues of the 30's." Also offered were several workshops on Chapter Operations and Personal Development.

UNIVERSITY OF LOWELL CLOSES SORORITIES, FRATERNITIES

The trustees of the University of Lowell at Lowell, MA have voted unanimously to close the institution's six fraternities and four sorority houses.

Thomas Taylor, the university's Assistant Dean of Students, said hazing incidents in 1980 and last May had prompted the decision to revoke the organizations charters. He said the groups had repeatedly violated university rules, in particular by serving alcoholic beverages to minors and intoxicated people.

In 1980 a student with a heart condition died after he was forced to exercise on a hot day as part of a fraternity rite, Mr. Taylor said. Last May a student went into a coma after being placed in a sleeping bag in a hot attic room. The student recovered and is suing Pi Lambda Phi Fraternity.

Fraternity and sorority members say they are all being punished for the actions of a few, but the university believes that all of the organizations have been irresponsible, Mr. Taylor said.

FLORIDA STATE FRATERNITIES VOTE TO BAN KEG PARTIES

Fraternities at Florida State University have voted to ban large keg parties in fratenity houses and to forbid the purchase of alcohol with fraternity money.

The Inter-Fraternity Council, which sets policy for the university's 22 fraternities, also voted this month to ask fraternity members and guests to bring their own alcohol to Greek functions.

The move was a response to changes in the state drinking law and to the adoption by the university of a stricter on-campus drinking policy, said William K. Haggard, Director of Student Activities and Organizations. The State of Florida's decision to increase the drinking age to 21 became effective July 1.

"I think it will have a very positive effect on the fraternities' social life," Mr. Haggard said. "It was a very responsible move on their part."

The new policy, which will be enforced by the Inter-Fraternity Council, will require fraternities to issue invitations two days before any party where alcohol is served, to have two police officers on hand, and to end the party by 2:30 a.m.

STUDENTS FOUND TO HOLD TRADITIONAL VIEWS ON SEX

Although college students today have sex less often than those seven years ago, they are more satisfied with their sex lives, according to a survey of 1,200 college students.

The survey results are reported in the August issue of $\underline{\text{Glamour}}$ magazine.

The survey found both male and female students had more traditional views on sex, marriage, and children than those questioned in a similar survey in 1980.

Fewer men and women reported feeling pressure to be sexually active. More students of both sexes plan to marry and have children than in 1980.

Half of those polled said AIDS had affected their lives. Seven percent said they knew someone with AIDS, and 25 percent said their college health services had made no organized response to AIDS.
