ZIZZO NAMED DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT

Steven V. Zizzo, Illinois '84, has been named Director of Development for the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation as announced by its Executive Director **Robert M. Sheehan, Jr.**, Westminster '76. The position will start July 1st when Brother Zizzo leaves his post as Chapter Leadership Consultant.

"Steve brings a lot of enthusiasm, dedication, and knowledge to the position of Director of Development," Brother Sheehan said. "The Trustees are very positive about this move and Steve's abilities. This shows the commitment the Foundation has to build the financial resources Alpha Sigma Phi needs to continue its mission as America's Premier Fraternity."

Brother Zizzo, who served his chapter as President, was the 1987 recipient of the Frank F. Hargear Memorial Award for outstanding undergraduate member, and Conference Coordinator for the 1986 National Convention. He was hired as Chapter Leadership Consultant in January 1988 and has served in that capacity since.



UPSILON AT PENN STATE RAISES \$112,000



BROTHER WILLARD SCOTT MEETS MIAMI ALPHA SIGS

Brother **Willard Scott**, American '53, was very hospitable to Alpha Sigs at the University of Miami when he was on location for the **The Today Show** at Miami Beach, FL, February 24th.

Four of the Gamma Theta pledges were brought up on the set with Brother Scott during one of his spots while other brothers and pledges were holding our flag in the background. Past HSP, **T.J. Mannix**, spoke to Brother Scott and found him very friendly and interested in Alpha Sigma Phi.

Brother Scott is now facing a challenge in his life. A memo written by Co-Anchor Bryant Gumbel of The Today Show to an NBC executive pertaining to Scott's decorum on the show was leaked to the media. The following story shows how much Willard is loved and how highly he is thought of. The U.S. congressman quoted in the article, **Frank Wolf**, Penn State '60, is also a brother. Brotherhood is indeed a lifetime experience and brings us together even when we're from different chapters.

SCOTT'S CLOUDY MOOD

Willard Scott heads for a week's vacation today, pessimistic about repairing relations with Today show anchor Bryant Gumbel, who returns Monday.

"It's a mess," the Today weatherman says. "I don't see how we can do a hell of a lot."

A Gumbel memo leaked Tuesday knocked Scott for "killing" Today with an "assortment of whims, wishes, birthdays and bad taste."

"I don't blame the messenger," Scott said. "I blame the guy who wrote the message."

More than 28,000 people phoned a USA Today hot line Wednesday: all but 854 of them said Scott helps the show.

U.S. Representative Wolf, R-Va., told the House Thursday that Scott "touches America's heart and focuses on her goodness."
