

Alpha Sigma Phi Sets The Pace; 1990 National Leadership Conference & Convention a Huge Success!

Our nation's capital, Washington, D.C., was the site of the "biggest and best" ever National Leadership Conference and Convention—**CREATING OUR FUTURE TODAY**. Held on the campus of The American University, more than 250 Alpha Sigma Phi undergraduates, alumni and faculty brothers, families and guests, came from across the nation August 8–12 to join in a vigorous schedule of workshops, ritual events and camaraderie.

The week for the undergraduates began on Wednesday with a welcome and orientation. Brother **Norman R. Hamilton, Stanford '47**, captivated the audience and conducted an

inspiring ice breaker presentation. This was followed by the formal opening ceremonies—the call to order and roll call of delegates by newly appointed Executive Vice President **John R. Chaney, Indiana '67**; ceremony of invocation by Grand Marshal **Robert G. Cabello, Eastern Michigan '70**; introduction of the Grand Council by Brother Chaney; State of the Fraternity Address by Grand Senior President **Edmund A. Hamburger, Polytechnic '45**; and the featured speaker presentation "Creating our Future Today" by Brother Hamilton.

The day's events were far from completed. The largest ever Black Lantern Processional—some 165 brothers adorned in black cowl robes and carrying lanterns—followed Grand Marshal Cabello through the campus and at the end of the symbolic journey, formed the Omega on the quadrangle. This premier event was accomplished through the organizational ability and leadership of Chapter Leadership Consultant, **Jeffery S. Owens, Illinois '87**.

The next several days contained hours of tackling such important issues confronting the fraternity world and undergraduates as chapter operations workshops on motivation, philanthropy, alumni relations, fund-raising, retreats, rush, public relations, service, career development, national headquarters operations and services, committee and chapter organization, finance, scholarship, standards of

excellence programs and social programming. Keeping abreast of these current challenges enables Alpha Sigma Phi to remain America's Premier Fraternity.

Intermingled with the chapter operations workshops, delegates were assigned to convention committees on finance; credentials, resolutions and law; chapter standards and ethics; and nominations. Personal development workshops on career choices, positive impressions and men's health issues were also offered to attendees.

Nationally recognized speakers challenged the participants throughout the entire week of activities. Dr. Stephen J. Trachtenberg, President of George Washington University, addressed the undergraduates on values and ethics. Brother **Larry Philippi, Bowling Green '75**, well known and respected advisor on fraternity issues, offered a presentation entitled "Rushing for our Future" and Mike Green, a recovering alcoholic, challenged the group with his lively "Booze and Brotherhood" presentation.

The goal of the leadership conference is to bring the best possible speakers, information and techniques to help our undergraduate leaders and alumni volunteers make a significant impact on their respective campuses. They, in turn, often sponsor these same speakers and topics locally which helps to enhance the image and reputation of Alpha Sig chapters nationwide.

Friday, August 10, saw the addition of the alumni conference to an already hectic schedule. Here, alumni brothers and Fraternity volunteers alike enjoyed educational programs of timely topics affecting them as brothers and volunteers in the fraternal and corporate world. At the alumni conference, out-going Executive Director **Robert M. Sheehan, Jr., Westminster '76**, discussed the role of volunteers; Brother **Robert B. Strecker, Washington '78**, addressed strategic planning; Brother **Gregory A. Sinise, Purdue '70**, discussed financial management; and Grand Councilor **Kevin J. Garvey, Westminster '75**, discussed alumni development. The alumni conference learned from Gary Bonas, Assistant Director of Student Activities, Villanova University, how volunteers are change agents. A private luncheon and an alumni round table with Brother Chaney concluded the alumni conference.

Both undergraduate and alumni conferees were challenged by Mark Usry, Assistant Professor of

Business Law at James Madison University, who gave a presentation on risk management; Ed King, Executive Director of Housing, Residential Life & Student Judicial System and Interfraternity & Panhellenic Council Advisor for Bradley University, presented "Secret Thoughts of a Fraternity Ritual"; and Eileen Stevens, Founder of C.H.U.C.K.—Committee to Halt Useless College Killings, presented "Death By Hazing."

The speakers clearly were well received and definitely represented a "Who's Who" of contemporary fraternity presenters. Nearly all other national fraternities employ one or two of these major featured presenters at each annual or biennial conference. At ours, we hosted nine this year alone!

Two faculty advisors from Delta Theta Chapter at Radford University, **Dr. William R. Kennan** and **Dr. Stephen W. Lenhart**, entered the Mystic Circle in the presence of 175 brothers in a ceremony at the campus chapel Friday evening. Chapter Leadership Consultant **Owen G. McCulloch, Oregon State '86**, recruited, trained and choreographed the ritual team. It was performed with great precision and emotion. Brother **Tim Schulien, Ohio State '84**, assisted in providing appropriate organ renditions.

Alpha Sigma Phi's annual Leadership Conferences would not be possible without the generous support of alumni gifts through the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation. The conference has been described by many young men as "the most positive experience of my life," and helps build character, teaches leadership, instills values and ethical standards, and enhances the excellence mission of each chapter.

Brother **Steven V. Zizzo, Illinois '84**, Vice President for Development, served as the Conference Director and Director of

Administrative Services, Bev Moody, as the Assistant Conference Director.

Throughout this issue are more exciting Conference events.

The 1991 National Leadership Conference will be held at Pennsylvania State University in State College, Pennsylvania from August 7-11, 1991. Exciting programs, challenging workshops and an endless supply of brotherhood await alumni and undergraduate brothers alike. Plan now to attend. □

Distinguished Alums Receive High Honor

Grand Senior President **Edmund A. Hamburger, Polytechnic '45**, awarded two brothers the Distinguished Merit Award of Alpha Sigma Phi at the Awards Banquet at the Capital Hilton. Brothers **James L. Caldwell, RPI '55**, and **Robert M. Sheehan Jr., Westminster '76**, were the 34th and 35th distinguished recipients of the award.

The Distinguished Merit Award of Alpha Sigma Phi was established in 1950 to recognize those brothers who have obtained prominence and distinction in their professions. The award is presented by authority of the Grand Council to those who are still active in their profession at the time of presentation.

Brother Caldwell was the featured speaker for the Awards Banquet held in the Presidential Ballroom with more than 270 in attendance. Brother Caldwell discussed various challenges in his life and the opportunities to make the most of them by "picking up pearls" as they roll along the floor in front of us. A most inspirational and emotional speaker, Brother Caldwell obtained his PhD in 1979 and is Advisory Engineer, Advanced Manufacturing Engineering for IBM.

Brother Caldwell was honored by President Ronald Reagan in 1985 as the Handicapped American of the Year. His outstanding professional accomplishments and perseverance through his health challenges reflect enormous distinction and accomplishment. Brother Caldwell's wife Sue was present at the banquet.

Outgoing Fraternity Executive Director Robert M. Sheehan, Jr. served "The Old Gal" for 11

plus years with great distinction in increasingly demanding roles as Expansion Consultant and then Executive Director of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity, Inc. and the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation. Brother Sheehan was director of the fraternity's Third Founding Campaign which raised more than one million dollars for the endowment.

He was editor of *The Tomahawk* for five years, served as Chairman of the Fraternity Executive's Association Interfraternity Institute for two years, and President of the Central Ohio Chapter of the National Society of Fund Raising Executives. During his tenure, Brother Sheehan completed his work on his Master of Arts degree and initiated doctoral studies in public administration at The Ohio State University.

Brother Sheehan was named a Balfour Fellow in 1990 and received the Delta Beta Xi Award, Class of 1983. Brother Sheehan's work touched the lives of thousands of undergraduates and alumni through fraternal love. His leadership, personal integrity and contributions will long be felt by the fraternity men he served.

As a part of Brother Sheehan's presentation of the award, he was presented with numerous mementos and a clock from the Grand Council. He was also "sauteed" (as opposed to "roasted") by past Grand Senior Presidents with whom he served.

Some earlier recipients of this award include Justice **Andy Douglas, Toledo '51**, Justice of Supreme Court of Ohio; **Dr. William B. Hutchinson, Washington '29**, Founding Director and President, Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center and **Ross D. Swimmer, Oklahoma '62**, former principal Chief of Cherokee Nation. □

My Brothers In Alpha Sigma Phi . . .

I stand before you pleased, proud, and honored to report on the state of our great Fraternity. As I look over the activities and reports since our last biennial convention, I am convinced that, every day, we indeed, are CREATING OUR FUTURE TODAY. Our theme for this 1990 National Leadership Conference and Convention suggests that we can create our future today. During the days of this convention we shall be pondering ways that we can lead our chapters and our national Fraternity to even greater levels of excellence. Indeed, we will build bridges for our chapters and brothers who will follow in our steps. I am reminded of "The Bridge Builder" written by Will Dromgoole, and I quote:

An old man, going a lone highway
came at the evening, cold and gray,
to a chasm vast and deep and wide;
the old man crossed in the twilight dim,
the sullen stream had no fear for him;
but he turned when safe on the other side
and built a bridge to span the tide.
'Old man,' said a fellow pilgrim near,
'you are wasting your strength with building here;
your journey will end with the ending day,
you never again will pass this way;
why build you this bridge at evening tide?'
The builder lifted his old gray head—
'good friend, in the path I have come,' he said,
'there followeth after me today,
a youth whose feet must pass this way;
this chasm that has been naught to me
to that fair-haired youth may a pitfall be;
he, too, must cross in the twilight dim—
good friend, I am building this bridge for him.'

But, my job tonight is not to enthuse solely about the hopes of our future, but to report on our Fraternity . . . our beloved Alpha Sigma Phi. Eight years go at the 1982 National Convention, I was elected to the Grand Council. Two years ago I was honored to be elected Grand Senior President. I wish to report to you tonight on what was our future then, and is now today.

Our Annual Leadership Conference, consistently rated by undergraduate brothers as one of the best college experiences for Alpha Sigs, will reach new heights as a record number of brothers have registered for this, the 41st biennial convention. Eight years ago, we hoped for 100 attendees and at this meeting we have 250. And, at our Awards Banquet Saturday evening, you will be a part of and witness first hand the largest gathering of Alpha Sigs in recent history—and perhaps ever—as many alumni will join us to celebrate our brotherhood. Our summer meetings make an ever-increasing

impact on our undergraduate and alumni brothers.

Over the past two years, our Fraternity has implemented many programs and policies in order to complete our mission TO BETTER THE MAN. These programs are available for all brothers to implement in each chapter to help make Alpha Sigma Phi the best on each and every campus.

In 1988 we met for our Convention under the theme, "Commitment to Excellence" and the delegates began to create the future. We established a new, revised Code of Conduct and minimum point grade average for initiation. Both established the standards to which every Alpha Sig is compared. Each holds himself to high ideals and to better himself as an individual and thus the future became better.

The delegates then went on to promote and endorse one of our most important programs today, "The Standards of Excellence"—a self-evaluation system by which every chapter can assess and establish priorities for its needs and is able to target areas such as rush, pledge education and alumni relations for improvement in a methodical way. And the future became brighter.

Beyond these outstanding programs, the Fraternity has responded to society's changing environment. In 1989, in order to protect our brothers, guests, and chapters in the social environment, we established a new RISK MANAGEMENT POLICY which has helped our chapters remain accident-free due to the mature, responsible implementation of the policy by each chapter. And the future became clearer. I tell you, myself, I am proud of you!

In 1990 the Grand Council approved our position statements publicly to reiterate values of our Fraternity which we hold so dearly in our ritual. Our position statement on substance abuse reminds us that all members of our Fraternity must be educated on the perils of substance use and abuse, and that peer pressure must be used in a positive manner to influence increase of responsibility and heightened awareness of the problem.

Our position on human dignity is mindful that there is no place in our Fraternity for those who think that anyone should be treated as a sub-human or lower-class citizen. In regards to racism and religious discrimination, we reiterate our position adopted at the 1952 National Convention and echoed in our current position statement: that the spirit of brotherhood knows no color, creed, religion, or national origin and that to think or act otherwise is counter to everything for which Alpha Sigma Phi stands.

Now I turn to the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation and the support of dedicated alumni. It is quite impossible to put a price tag on the countless hours of volunteer effort by our chapter advisors, association and corporation officers, since this is a labor of love and beyond price. Their tireless efforts through times of trial and tribulation give them greater satisfaction than any material recompense. And then there are the silent alumni. Those who you hear nothing about. They have no title or official responsibilities, they just do what they know is right when they can.

Before I conclude, I want you, the undergraduate brothers, to consider these Ten Commandments of Leadership as enunciated by Barbie Tootle of The Ohio State University.

The Fraternity . . .

The 1989-90 school year witnessed Alpha Sigma Phi's 145th year of continuing excellence. The August 1990 National Leadership Conference and Convention at The American University in Washington, DC was our biggest and best ever. A leadership opportunity of the scope and magnitude that was available to undergraduate leaders will spark successful projects on Alpha Sig campuses all year long. The Grand Council and National Headquarters Staff are proud to present this year's Annual Report on the Fraternity's operation.

Chapters/Membership. Two new colonies are working hard and are in the final stages prior to attaining chapter status. These are Gamma Epsilon Colony at SUNY-Buffalo and Phi Theta Colony at SUNY-Binghamton. Of particular delight is revitalizing chapters which, for one reason or another, have been closed, such as Gamma Epsilon Chapter at SUNY-Buffalo. One additional interest group has been pledged to the "Old Gal" at the University of Delaware. This dynamic group is awaiting formal IFC recognition prior to officially receiving a colony designation. The Delaware Interest Group also looks forward to their chartering. The National Headquarters staff is presently working on many more expansion opportunities.

While the number of men initiated into the Mystic Circle declined slightly during 1989-90, the pledge loss ratio was reduced by more than 50 percent. Changes on many campuses to a deferred rush situation during 1989-90 probably caused the aggregate number of initiates to decline. Sustained increases over the past several years will find Alpha Sigma Phi with our largest undergraduate membership ever!

National Leadership Conference. The National Leadership Conference continues to be one of the Fraternity's most important educational programs. The 1990 conference at The American University was an exceptional success. A full report on this premier event is included in this issue on pages 1 and 2. Chapter leaders attending these annual conferences rate them as one of the best personal development experiences they have had in their

lives. Just as important, these leaders report that the conference helps them develop and implement goals and plans for their chapter. During each of the past four years an Alumni Conference has been held in conjunction with the undergraduate conference. The alumni program helps local alumni advisors and association and corporation leaders learn to provide more effective guidance to the undergraduate brothers and to better operate their alumni organizations.

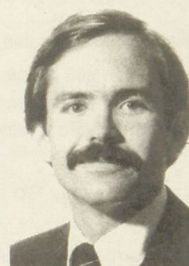

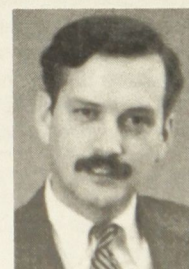

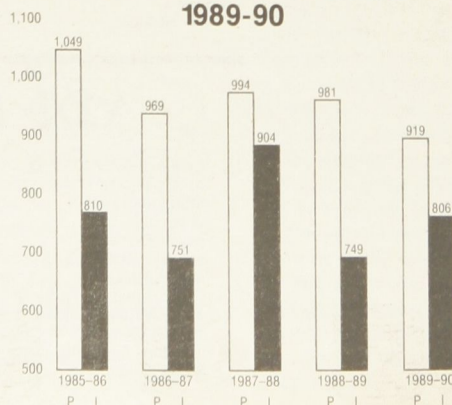

The Annual Report

Finances. Income and expense allocations for 1989-90 are broken down into percentages, by program category, on page 8. Conservative budgeting and year-end cutting measures instituted by the Grand Council helped to change the year's budget forecast of an \$18,515 loss into a slight surplus of \$882. Financial challenges always seem to be with the Fraternity as we strive to provide the highest level of quality educational and leadership programs to chapters and undergraduates, all the while dealing with inflationary pressure. It should be noted that for the first time, the undergraduate dues and fees received as income are significantly below the 50 percent level. Annual Loyalty Fund contributions and Educational Foundation Endowment grants must increasingly make up the balance in future years.

Alcohol Abuse and Hazing. Of all the challenges that face Alpha Sigma Phi and the Greek System today, by far the two greatest are the instances of Alcohol Abuse and Hazing found at any time in any chapter of any fraternity or sorority. Alpha Sigma Phi is taking an aggressive, pro-active approach against these abuses. First, we adopted new risk management rules regarding these abuses and have informed chapters that sanctions will be taken for violations. By adopting these policies we joined with other national fraternities who have identical rules. Today over 80% of all fraternity chapters in America are to be operating under these same rules. Interfraternity cooperation is key to our success. Second, we have stepped up our educational programming efforts at leadership conferences and during

chapter visits to drive the message home that Alcohol Abuse and Hazing have no part to play in a proper Alpha Sig experience. Finally, we have again joined with our interfraternity brethren to implement a pro-active public relations campaign, targeted at college and university faculty and administrators, promoting the positive aspects of the Greek system and asking them to join with us in partnership to rid our chapters of abuses. While these challenges are great, we are confident of our plans and comforted in the knowledge that our hard work will result in a much improved quality of fraternity experience for our young brothers.

The Future: Alumni Volunteerism. Alpha Sigma Phi has been blessed with hundreds of alumni brothers who volunteer their time to serve our Fraternity, from Grand Council members at the national level to local alumni corporation/association officers and advisors. Alumni volunteerism has been the backbone of our success, and will be the key to our future. Our entire brotherhood is indebted to the good work of our volunteers over this past year, and we look forward to handling future challenges together with renewed vigor.

The Foundation . . .

The importance of the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation continues to increase as the Fraternity expands its programming and educational services for chapters and undergraduate brothers. The Educational Foundation makes grants to the Fraternity annually, in support of these educational programs, from two principal sources: alumni gifts to the Annual Loyalty Fund and investment income from the Educational Foundation Endowment. Gifts to the Annual Loyalty Fund during the 1989-90 fiscal year rose to \$166,780 from \$134,745 from the previous year. This was a record year for numbers of donors (up 31 percent) and total gifts received (up 24 percent)! The Annual Loyalty Fund accounts for nearly one-third of the income received to operate the general fraternity.

The Endowment. The Endowment continues to grow slowly as payments on pledges to the Third Founding Campaign are nearly completed.

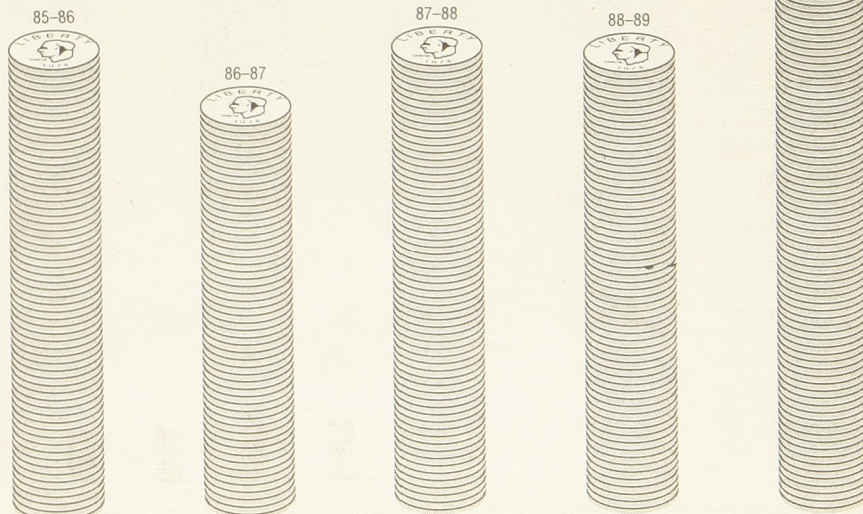
A total of \$16,732 was given to the Endowment during 1989-90. This includes a \$5,000 bequest from the estate of Past Grand Senior President, **Raymond E. Glos, Illinois '22, Omega '88.**

Further growth in the Endowment will have to come from special endowment gifts, bequests or other planned gifts, and investment growth. More than fifty brothers have notified the Educational Foundation that they have made provisions for the Endowment in their wills, trust, or insurance

policies. These brothers are recognized annually in **The Tomahawk** as members of "The Manigault Society." The current list of brothers appears on page 13 along with information on how to join the society. The Huntington National Bank, Columbus, OH, serves as investment counsel to the Educational Foundation Trustees regarding the Endowment. During 1989-90 the market value of the endowment grew by 2.3%. This slight increase was possible only on the strength of the year's Endowment gifts. An adverse market and rising interest rates negated the possibility of large investment dividends. The objective of the Trustees is to continue to invest the Endowment responsibly and prudently to produce dollars for annual grants to support fraternity programs and allow the Endowment's market value to grow for future Alpha Sig operations.

Vice President for Development, Steven V. Zizzo, Illinois '84, is an Educational Foundation employee responsible for developing communications with alumni in an effort to increase support for the Educational Foundation. Foundation President **John R. Chaney, Indiana '67**, has assigned Brother Zizzo the challenging responsibility of coordinating all alumni development activities and spearheading fundraising activities.

As the Fraternity continues to develop new services to help chapters improve their educational programming for undergraduate brothers, the need

for increasing the output of the Annual Loyalty Fund and the Endowment grows. Brother Zizzo will work with alumni to show how the Educational Foundation can help each chapter improve and help each undergraduate brother have a more rewarding fraternity experience.

Chapter endowment funds. The Educational Foundation established a new program in 1988-89 allowing alumni to create special endowment funds for individual chapters. The first of these funds was created by **Robert W. Kutz, California '67**, for the benefit of **Nu Chapter**, California-Berkeley, and **Psi Chapter**, Oregon State. Under the provisions of this program an alumnus must make a minimum gift of \$500 to establish the fund for a chapter. After that, any alumnus or friend may add to the chapter endowment with additional contributions of at least \$500. The Educational Foundation Trustees are responsible for investing the funds, and the annual investment income may be used by the chapter to support its own educational programming—including scholarships, attendance at leadership conferences, or bringing in speakers for the chapter's benefit. □

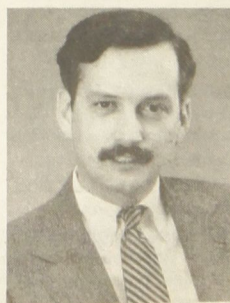

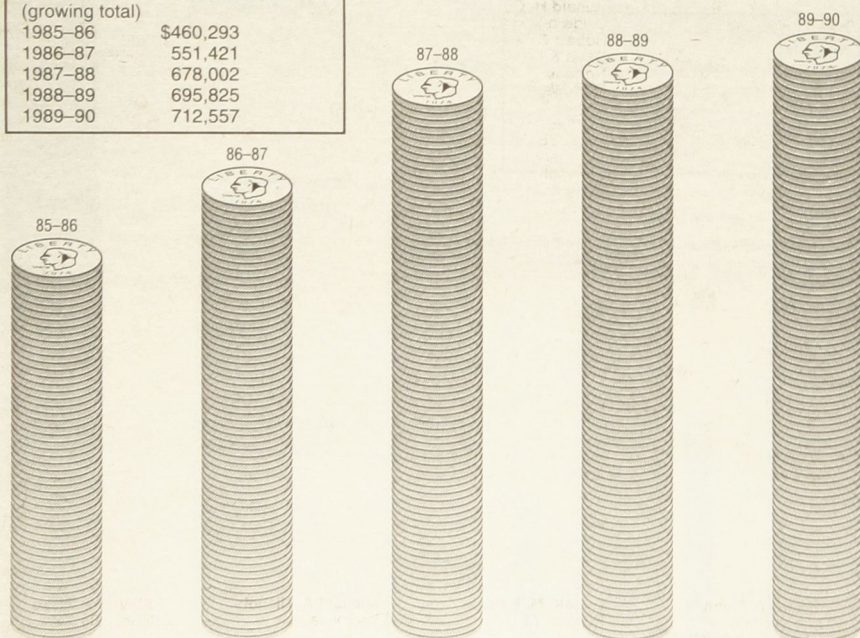

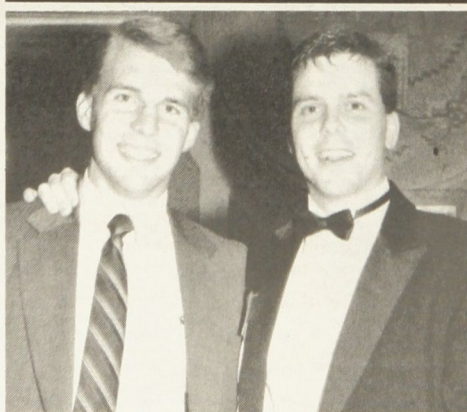

Fraternity's Standards Unanimously Affirmed

Throughout this issue of *The Tomahawk* are the five position statements that the Grand Council and the 1990 Convention delegates endorsed.

These position statements reinforce our Basic Reasons for Being and our adopted Code of Conduct. These also give all Alpha Sigs a clear and concise guide in our quest "To Better The Man."

Times certainly have changed! Just a few years ago, fraternity chapters engaged in activities that are now strictly forbidden. Some of those activities included hazing, pre-initiation and extra-ritualistic ceremonies, "open" parties and kegs. We now have a strict policy on hazing and even a comprehensive listing of forbidden pledge activities that are now considered hazing (including those things we call "fun and games," "mind games," and "pledge olympics," just to name a few).

Can you imagine attending a major event at your chapter such as Homecoming and being told by the undergraduates that your keg or massive beer case purchase is not welcome? That's the case today in Alpha Sigma Phi chapters. Common sources of alcohol cannot enter our facilities nor can chapters use fraternity funds for such purchases. Because of state law, university regulations, our Fraternity Risk Management Policies and our partnership with some 38 other national Greek letter organizations (not to mention—common sense) we are now actively engaged in ensuring that we offer a positive undergraduate experience.

Brothers, some of these changes are slow and difficult for us all. The changes will certainly make our chapters safer and our undergraduate experience more positive. I would ask that you keep these changes in mind as you visit your chapter.



POSITION STATEMENT ON HUMAN DIGNITY

WHEREAS, Alpha Sigma Phi is the fraternity "TO BETTER THE MAN" and all of her functions and actions should exhibit this as listed in our *Code of Conduct*, and

WHEREAS, every human being deserves to be treated with dignity and not harassed, tormented, abused or violated by another human being, and

WHEREAS, our fraternity's *Code of Conduct* states that each member "will respect the dignity of all persons, and therefore, I will not physically, psychologically or sexually abuse any human being," and

WHEREAS, we instill the principles of diligence, honor, integrity, virtue, duty and respect for human dignity.

THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED, that all chapters, colonies and alumni organizations follow the *Code of Conduct* and educate our membership on the value of each person.

BE IT RESOLVED, that there is no place in our fraternity for those who think anyone should be treated as a sub-human or a lower class citizen.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Grand Council of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity that it is the position of our fraternity that everyone should be treated with dignity and respected for their individual rights and principles.

THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED, that the spirit of brotherhood knows no color, creed, religion, or national origin; we are working actively to promote cultural, religious and racial diversity in our memberships and will oppose acts of racism and religious discrimination.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Grand Council of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity that it is the continuing position of our fraternity that membership privileges should be granted to any qualified candidate without consideration of ethnic or religious background.

POSITION STATEMENT ON SUBSTANCE ABUSE

WHEREAS, Alpha Sigma Phi is the fraternity "TO BETTER THE MAN" and all of her functions and actions should exhibit this as listed in our *Code of Conduct*, and

WHEREAS, our Constitution and By-Laws, Article XVII, section 1 and section 3, prohibits illegal alcohol and substance use and prohibits inappropriate conduct of members of our fraternity, and

WHEREAS, the illegal use of substances or abuse of legal substances is in direct opposition to the purpose of our organization "TO BETTER THE MAN." It does not foster brotherhood, demonstrate leadership or help to build a better community.

THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that all members of our fraternity be educated on the perils of substance use and abuse. That peer pressure is used in a positive manner of responsibility and influence.

BE IT RESOLVED, that all chapters, colonies and alumni organizations promote and participate in peer intervention strategies for brothers and/or pledges with symptoms of substance addiction as well as responsible use of legal substances.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Grand Council of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity that it is the position of our fraternity that no illegal substances shall be used in the structure of our fraternity nor shall the abuse of legal substances be encouraged or tolerated at fraternity events.

WHEREAS, we are a brotherhood of gentlemen who extend brotherly love and concern to all brothers and friends of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity, and

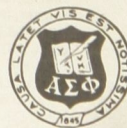

BE IT RESOLVED, that all chapters, colonies and alumni organizations educate our membership about how AIDS is transmitted and what precautions can and should be taken to lessen the risk of being infected.

BE IT RESOLVED, that any brother/pledge who contracts the AIDS virus is entitled to all of the rights and privileges that our fraternity can extend to him; and shall not be condemned for any activity which may have led to this situation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Grand Council of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity that it is the position of our fraternity that any brother or pledge who contracts the AIDS virus is indeed no less a brother.

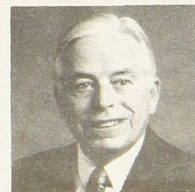

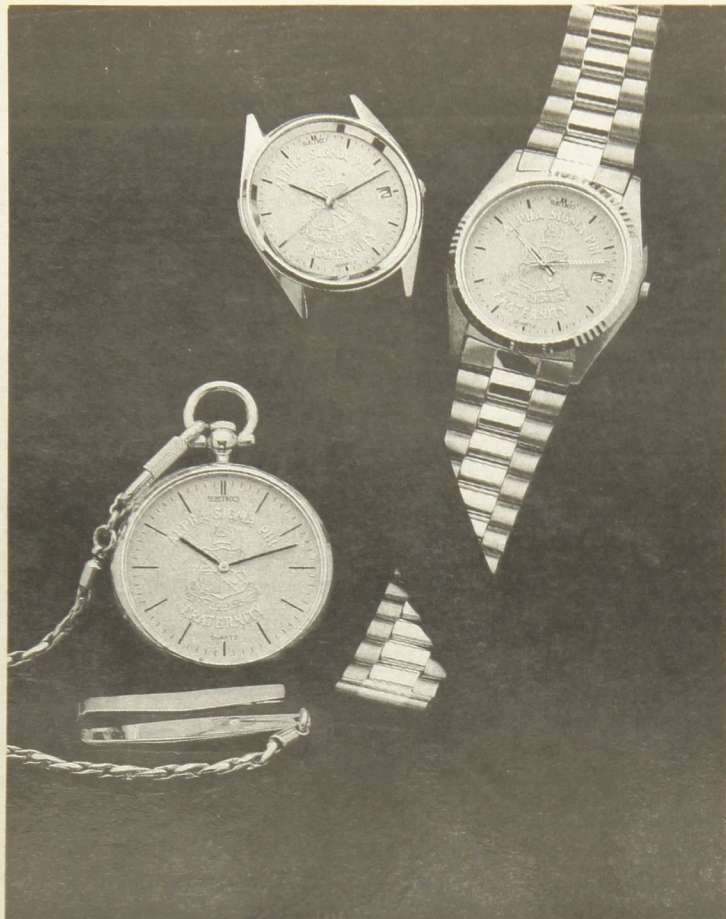
