EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT/PRESIDENT ANNOUNCED

Grand Senior President Edmund A. Hamburger, Polytechnic '45 and Educational Foundation Trustees Chairman Dr. Robert E. Miller, Connecticut '49 have announced that John R. Chaney, Indiana '67, has been appointed as Executive Vice President of Alpha Sigma Phi and President of the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation. Brother Chaney will join the staff on June 16, 1990, and he will be working in transition with Executive Director Robert M. Sheehan, Jr., Westminster '76, through August.

Brother Chaney is one of the founding members of Gamma Chi Chapter at Indiana. He was the first chapter pledge educator after the 1968 chartering, and was the chapter delegate to the 1968 National Convention. He has attended two National Leadership Conferences, and has been serving the fraternity as Co-Grand Province Chief for Province VIII.

He has served the U.S. Army since 1970--most recently as an Intelligence Officer--where he has had an extremely varied and challenging career. He has been consistently rewarded with demanding leadership and management positions, and at each level he was promoted to the next rank as soon as was legally possible. Because of his impeccable character, reputation and loyalty, he has held the highest U.S. governmental security clearance, top secret with special compartmental information access, for his entire career. He has been awarded the Meritorious Service Medal, four awards of the Commendation Medal, the Achievement Medal, six awards of the Good Conduct Medal and numerous ribbons, decorations and citations.

Brother Chaney has been active in his Masonic Lodge and has coached soccer, football, and baseball—as well as teaching Sunday school. He will be moving to the Delaware, Ohio area soon from Jonesboro, GA with his wife, Ann, daughter Zola, and son John.

John Chaney's commitment to Alpha Sigma Phi has remained constant since his initial involvement. His enthusiasm, dedication and brotherhood are a fine example for all Alpha Sigs to strive for throughout their lives. He will be leading Alpha Sigma Phi into the 1990 with great dedication.
