GRAND WEEKEND

Columbus, Ohio was the location for a tremendous number of Alpha Sigma Phi events held during the weekend of January 25-27, 1991.

Some 26 different chapters were represented on Friday afternoon and evening, as forty-five members of the Grand Council Ad Hoc Committees joined the Grand Council and staff for a reception, bus trip to Delaware, tour of the National Headquarters, and dinner at a nearby restaurant. After returning to the Embassy Suites Hotel, the members met in their assigned committees and worked late into the night on vital matters affecting the quality of programs in Alpha Sigma Phi's future. The seven committees are: Scholarship, National Service, Alumni Services, Undergraduate Membership, Undergraduate Housing, the Province System and 150th Anniversary Celebration. Each of the committees was chaired by an alumnus brother who had three other alumni, two undergraduates, a Grand Council member, and a staff member on his committee. The committees returned to their labors early Saturday morning and worked throughout the day on their various dreams, visions and proposals for future Grand Council consideration and action. Action items and various initiatives will be worked on by the Ad Hoc Committees and the Grand Council over the next several months.

Finally, the Grand Council committees and the Grand Council met in official sessions. In addition to the elected Grand Council members, undergraduate representative to the Grand Council Undergraduate Operations Committee, Shaun Sizemore, Marshall '87 and undergraduate representative to the Grand Council Finance Committee, J. Scott Price, Washington '88 were in attendance.

CONSULTANTS NAMED FOR 1991-92

Three new Alpha Sigma Phi Chapter Leadership Consultants have been hired for school year 1991-92. Following a highly competitive search and interview process, Brothers Ryan Dunham, Bowling Green '88, Ed Lenane, SUNY-Plattsburgh '88, and Tom Stroffolino, William Paterson '89 will join the professional staff in the next year. Brothers Stroffolino and Dunham will travel, along with Senior Chapter Leadership Consultant Owen McCulloch, during the fall. The logo/theme should clearly show that it is for the 150th Anniversary of Alpha Sigma Phi, be suitable for stationery, button, sticker, or silk screen application to tee-shirt or sweatshirt. It may incorporate historic or current heraldic devices or designs of the fraternity, or rely on novel devices, or adaptations.

The theme should be suitable for use as a theme of the 1995 National Leadership Conference, and again clearly show that it is for the 150th Anniversary of Alpha Sigma Phi. For example: "1845-1995, 150 years of Alpha Sigma Phi partnership with higher education."

The contest winner will receive credit for creation, a Cross Ballpoint Pen with $A\Sigma\Phi$'s Coat of Arms, and payment of the winner's registration fee for the 1995 National Leadership Conference.

The deadline for contest submissions is June 1, 1991. In the event there are no suitable entries, no award will be made; and in the case of very similar submissions the entry received first would be the deciding factor.

LAWRENCE TECH CHARTER RETURNED

At the January 27th meeting of the Grand Council, the Gamma Psi Alumni Council representing the Lawrence Technological University chapter, surrendered the charter because of low membership.
