

Alpha Sigma Phi's six million dollar man

Howard L. Kleinoeder, Washington '35, was very well liked by all of the brothers that he came in contact with—young and old. When Brother Kleinoeder, "Ki" to his friends, passed on to Omega Chapter on June 2, 1990, he left what is believed to be the largest gift ever made to any national fraternity. The gift now totals nearly \$6.3 million with the estate not yet closed.

The Man

Brother Kleinoeder was born on October 7, 1916 in Seattle, WA. He attended Franklin High School in Seattle. Friends have commented that his was a real Horatio Alger story. Upon entering the University of Washington, Ki took up residence as a pledge of Alpha Sigma Phi and went on to become house manager of the Mu Chapter house. Throughout his professional career and into his retirement to a horse farm in Florida, Brother Kleinoeder carried memories of his collegiate days and a yearning to contribute something to the Fraternity that meant so much to him.

A successful businessman, Ki eventually became a multi-millionaire and president of American International Marine Agency, a marine insurance business. Brother Kleinoeder personified that it is never too late to begin giving back to Alpha Sigma Phi. The first gift he made to the Annual Loyalty Fund was in honor of his 50 year anniversary as an initiate of Alpha Sigma Phi. In the years following, Brother Kleinoeder supported the Educational Foundation by increasing his annual gift and ultimately becoming a member of the Grand Senior Presidents Club which recognizes donors who give \$1,000 or more annually.

Brother **Jack Merrill, Washington '39**, long time Chapter Advisor stated that he had known Ki since 1938 when Jack was a pledge. He recalls that back then, students were either "smooth or sandy" ("cool" in more contemporary student lingo). Jack recalls that Brother Kleinoeder was known as "Sandy" because of this, not because of the color of his hair. Merrill went on to say that Ki "was not a good housekeeper as an undergraduate and failing to find a pledge to sweep his room, Ki would actually stand on a chair to avoid getting dust or sand into his pants' cuffs." That probably reinforced the "Sandy" nickname.

Brother Kleinoeder's first association with Alpha Sigma Phi probably came long before his enrollment as an undergraduate. According to Brother Merrill, "Ki grew up in the backyard of **William B. Hutchinson, Washington '29**. That's because Ki idolized the youngest brother, **Fred C. Hutchinson, Washington '39**." (NOTE: Brother William Hutchinson is Director of the Pacific Northwest Research Foundation in Seattle. Brother Fred Hutchinson distinguished himself as a professional baseball player, culminating with a career as manager of the Cincinnati Reds.)

Merrill continued, "I know Ki was from a poor

family. He worked hard, was a good student and spent his summers working his way through college on the Alaska Steamship Company Lines."

"Ki was a life-long bachelor, though he always had plenty of dates," stated Brother Merrill. He continued, "He took good care of his sister and her children, provided them with a quality education and cars upon graduation."

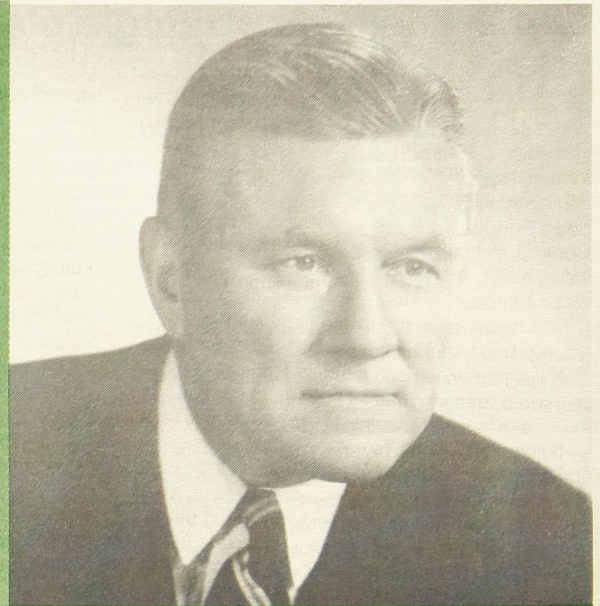
"Ki never missed a (Mu Chapter) Founders' Day. He always flew in from New York or Florida. You expected him to be there," noted Merrill.

Brother Merrill stated in closing, "He took American International Group Insurance worldwide. But how he got into raising Arabian horses, I'll never know."

The Gift

In 1989, Howard Kleinoeder joined Alpha Sigma Phi's Manigault Society, a distinguished recognition club honoring those brothers who have elected to make a planned gift to the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation either through a bequest, trust, life insurance policy, or some other means. Brother Kleinoeder was quite modest in indicating that the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation was named in his will but instead of indicating the approximate value of the intended bequest noted, "It depends on the price of one stock." Neither the magnitude of the gift nor the size of Brother Kleinoeder's estate was known to the Foundation until after his death.

The Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation was one of three major beneficiaries of the Kleinoeder estate, the other two being the University of



Washington and the STARR Foundation of New York City.

The gift, as all bequests, was immediately added to Alpha Sigma Phi's evergrowing endowment of more than \$7 million. The Trustees of the Educational Foundation oversee the investment of the endowment and ensure that it remains protected but still continues to grow. At the present time, the Trustees have agreed to annually allocate up to 5% of the endowment for educational uses such as scholarships, leadership training and character development programs. It is expected that the endowment will earn more than a 5% return and all proceeds above that will be returned to the endowment so that it may continue to grow and keep ahead of inflation.

The Future

When the bequest was received, Alpha Sigma Phi had many programs waiting that could not be funded. Now, some of those programs have become a reality. "However it is only the beginning," notes Educational Foundation President **John R. Chaney, Indiana '67**, "this is a great start to providing quality funding for the premier programs that will impact the lives of the leaders we serve."

As a response to Brother Kleinoeder's generous gift, Alpha Sigma Phi has developed a long range strategic plan. The opportunity to implement new and revitalized programs is here and now. Areas that are being addressed immediately include leadership and academic scholarships, service and philanthropy, expansion of undergraduate membership, regional province leadership programs, national alumni programs, undergraduate housing, and the sesquicentennial anniversary which is approaching in 1995. In the planning of the programs, there evolved even a greater need than Brother Kleinoeder's gift could accomplish. New programs are already being developed that will stretch Alpha Sigma Phi's financial limits to the very end and over \$10 million in *additional* need is already outlined to push "The Fraternity To Better The Man" to even greater heights.

"The Kleinoeder gift should inspire other brothers of Alpha Sigma Phi to help expand the resources so the Fraternity and Educational Foundation can serve their members more fully

and comprehensively," stated Chaney. He went on to say, "The size of the Kleinoeder bequest, and the support that those endowed funds will generate, will benefit the brothers of Alpha Sigma Phi for many years to come. However, we must continue to build for the future. We must never let it be said that Alpha Sigma Phi is standing still."

Trustee **Miller, Connecticut '49**, also added, "This bequest is a major factor of our current success and is part of a guarantee to future generations that our Society will be there for them."

Sixth annual alumni conference touted as "best"

The first National Leadership Conference & Convention to be held at a hotel in many years was a huge success for both the undergraduates and the alumni brothers who were in attendance.

"Having the opportunity to see the Grand Council throughout the conference, both during sessions and after hours, was the highlight for me," said undergraduate brother **Robert A. Skarperud, Washington '90**.

More than 75 alumni traveled from all corners of the country to attend three days of leadership training, educational seminars, panel discussions and goal setting sessions. "From the responses of the men in attendance this was by far the best Volunteer Alumni Conference ever," stated **Stuart A. Spisak, Westminster '78**, director for the conference.

"The highlight of the conference was the Cardinal and Stone Chat monitored by Grand Senior President **Charles J. Vohs, Penn State '75**, and Executive Vice President **John R. Chaney, Indiana '67**," says alumnus **Richard Kahler, Radford '82**. "By having my questions answered by the leadership of Alpha Sigma Phi in a timely manner, I was able to find out exactly what is

happening with the 'Old Gal.'"

Friday featured a lunch which was followed by the Cardinal and Stone Chat. Then two of eight breakout sessions geared to alumni in attendance took place. **Armando J. Rodriguez, Miami '82**, gave his first of two sessions on Positive Alumni/Undergraduate Relations while **Dr. Dennis R. Parks, Baldwin-Wallace '72**, offered his thoughts on Long-Range Planning.

The group photograph was taken in a scenic park setting across from the hotel. Over 150 men appeared in the picture. Again, the interaction between undergraduates and alumni was evident as the brothers joked and challenged the photographer to get all to sit still long enough to take the shots.

An "Alumni Appreciation" Dinner was a time for special recognition and celebration of alumni volunteers. Great food, brotherhood and inspiring messages by Brother Spisak set the tone for the rest of the weekend. A special charge was enacted by Brother Vohs to the volunteers in the province system as they were recognized by

National Leadership Conference & Convention: "Building Better Brothers" hits the mark!

These are just a few of the comments offered by brothers who attended this year's National Leadership Conference & Convention, "Building Better Brothers," at The Adam's Mark Hotel in Charlotte, North Carolina. This year's conference started off rapidly with personal greetings from the Governor of North Carolina, the Honorable James G. Martin. Governor Martin, a past National President of Beta Theta Pi Fraternity, has an Alpha Sig son currently enrolled at Wake Forest University.

After Governor Martin received a standing ovation all the brothers in attendance got to know each other better during a "rappin'" ice-breaker facilitated by Grand Councilors **Dr. Larry G. Spees, Ohio Wesleyan '57**, **Kevin J. Garvey, Westminster '75**, and **Stuart A. Spisak, Westminster '78**. The ice-breaker was followed by a touch of Southern culture and cooking—a pig pickin' for dinner. After the pig was devoured, the Formal Opening provided an opportunity for Executive Vice President **John R. Chaney, Indiana '67**, to introduce the Grand Council, and for Grand Senior President **Charles J. Vohs, Penn State '75**, to deliver his State of the Fraternity address to the delegation. **Thomas J. Wajnert, I.I.T. '61**, President and CEO of AT&T Capital Corporation, presented the keynote speech, "Building Better Brothers," where he discussed the importance of good leadership with the attentive audience, to close the Formal Opening.

The evening was not over yet, though. Brothers from the University of Rio Grande performed the Memorial Service for Brother **John C. Beam, Rio Grande '91**, who had passed away earlier this year in an automobile accident. Chapter Leadership Consultant **Mark R. Winston, Oregon State '88**, concluded the days events by overseeing one of the most impressive and honorable Black Lantern Processionals ever. The processionals, led by Grand Marshal Dr. Larry G. Spees, ended with the formation of an Omega in Marshall Park, across the street from The Adam's Mark Hotel.

The next couple days were filled mostly with convention committee sessions and interactive sessions that focused on rush, hazing, social programming, alumni relations, motivation, diversity, finance, committee organization, etiquette, fraternity headquarters services, public relations, leadership, confrontation skills, and ritual. Major session topics included scholarship, human dignity, personal relationships, pledge education, and risk management.

Also, delegates participated in one of four Convention committees: finance, chapter standards and ethics, nominations (for Grand Council), and credentials, resolutions, and law. Each of the committee chairmen, all undergraduates, presented their committee's report and recommendations to the Convention delegates for discussion. The Convention showed that Alpha Sigma Phi is truly run by its undergraduate members.

Friday brought the beginning of the sixth Annual Volunteer Alumni Conference. Alumni attending from all parts of the nation had ample time to mingle and develop relationships with other alumni and undergraduate brothers, and participate in sessions on effective advising, fundraising, long-range planning, financial management, volunteer recruitment, improving chapter scholarship, and developing positive relations with undergraduates.

everyone and challenged to bring the province system to a higher level.

The evening concluded with a presentation by David M. Lascu, Program Coordinator, Student Activities Office, University of Michigan-Dearborn, Dearborn, MI on the topic of "Human Dignity." The session was also attended by the undergraduate brothers.

Saturday morning had the alumni and undergraduate brothers sharing thoughts on the all important topic of "Understanding Risk Management" presented by Mark L. Usry, J.D., Assistant Professor of Business Law at James Madison University.

Following Mark Usry's session alumni worked together in small "networking" groups, sharing ideas, information and experiences in the areas of Alumni Rush, Financial Management, Improving Chapter Scholarship and Positive Alumni/Undergraduate Relations. Alpha Sig alumni **Stan G. Thurston, Iowa State '66**, **Rodriguez, and Mark A. Williams, Rio Grande '79**, led these dynamic sessions which will help to further positive programming at Alpha Sigma Phi chapters across the nation.

Saturday evening's Awards Banquet found two of our principal volunteer alumni receiving top awards for the effort they give to the "Old Gal." First, **Robert W. Kutz, California '67**, received the Grand Senior President's Citation for Outstanding Service to Alpha Sigma Phi. Brother Kutz serves as the Grand Historian and is active in many areas of the Fraternity. Next was the Evin C. Varner Distinguished Service Award presented to **Robert A. Sandercox, Bethany '51**, for his

distinguished service to the Fraternity for many years. Brother Sandercox is a Trustee of the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation and a past Grand Senior President of the Grand Council (1986-1988).

The Ritual Exemplification on Sunday gave the brothers the opportunity to re-experience the vows and obligation of brotherhood.

The conference concluded with the send-off and charge by the newly-installed Grand Senior President **Dr. Dennis R. Parks, Baldwin-Wallace '72**. He informed all the brothers of his visions for Alpha Sigma Phi and the direction it was headed. The grand finale was the showing of the videotape from the conference. There was not a dry eye in the room when the tape was shown for the first time. A large round of applause honored Brother **Ralph F. In all, the Sixth Annual Volunteer Alumni Conference provided the brotherhood and instruction everyone in attendance had anticipated. "The interaction and involvement of all in attendance was the best it has ever been," stated **Kevin Garvey, Westminster '75**. Proceedings of the 1992 National Convention

- Affirmed and continued the present fraternity policies with respect to purchase, possession or provision of alcohol.
- Returned *The Tomahawk* to a lifetime membership entitlement.
- Approved the formation of three additional chapter committees—Brotherhood Development, Parents' Liaison, and Risk Management Officer.
- Adopted the concept of a national philanthropy
- Passed a resolution recommending the elimination of residual "Little Sister" groups at the earliest possible time.
- Reaffirmed the 2.0 minimum GPA Scholastic Performance Resolution of 1988.
- Directed that an updated reporting process be developed.
- Elected the Grand Council and Grand Council officers for the 1992-94 biennium.
- Adopted 22 resolutions on behalf of various supporters of the Fraternity.
- Adopted a resolution directing that a Director of Expansion be funded through a reallocation of assets.

Sandercox honored with Distinguished Service Award

"...For exemplary service above and beyond the call of duty the Fraternity hereby expresses its heart felt gratitude." As a token of Alpha Sigma Phi's appreciation, Brother **Robert A. Sandercox, Bethany '51**, was awarded the Distinguished Service Award at the 1992 National Leadership Conference & Convention.

Brother Sandercox is known by many as "the gentle giant." He cares so much about the brothers that are around him and he is a giant volunteer who thoroughly believes in the value of Alpha Sigma Phi.

Through his volunteerism, he has served as Grand Chapter Advisor and Alumni Property Association Officer for Beta Gamma Chapter at Bethany College and received the Delta Beta Xi Award for Service to Alpha Sigma Phi in 1960. He has also served as Grand Province Chief, Grand Councilor, Grand Treasurer, Grand Junior President, and Grand Senior President of Alpha Sigma Phi.

During his tenure as Grand Senior President, Brother Sandercox addressed the assembled undergraduates at the national convention and told them about interfraternalism, "We are a minority of Americans that has provided a majority of the nation's leaders. Our influence at every level of life exceeds our numbers. Be proud you're a Greek and join arms with your

interfraternal brothers."

Each year the Grand Council has the opportunity to recognize the outstanding volunteer brother with The Distinguish Service Award. Only one may be awarded annually and this brother must have previously received the Delta Beta Xi Award for service to the Fraternity.

Brother Sandercox continues to serve the brotherhood as a Trustee of the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation (since 1981) and when otherwise called upon. During the same speech to the conference he noted the educational Foundation's tremendous endowment growth which was up to \$678,000 and he challenged all brothers to bring the endowment up to \$15 million noting, "It's not impossible!"

Brother Sandercox lives in Bethany, West Virginia, with his wife Nancy. Somehow during all of these fraternity activities he has been able to work at Bethany College as a Vice President and become one of the most popular staff members at the college. In 1989, the college awarded him an honorary doctorate degree.

If you want a better feel for Bob Sandercox's dedication to this brotherhood one only has to review his closing comments to the 1988 National Leadership Conference and Convention: "Our record is enviable; our future is limited only by our vision of excellence. I urge you to expand that

vision and commit yourself to excellence. Let truth, wisdom, and brotherly love guide you. The result will be well known."

The Distinguished Service Award is an expression of appreciation to Brother Sandercox "for the exemplary service above and beyond the call of duty."

Kaufmann 37th Distinguished Merit Award recipient

John T. Kauffman, Purdue '43, Emmaus, Pennsylvania, was the 37th recipient of the Distinguished Merit Award presented at the Awards Banquet held at The Adam's Mark Hotel Saturday evening, August 8.

Brother Kauffman is Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Pennsylvania Power and Light Company in Allentown, Pennsylvania. In this role, he had the principal responsibility for the largest construction project in the company's history—the start-up and completion of the Susquehanna nuclear power plant project. He has had a 42 year career in the electric public utility industry.

The award was established in 1950 to honor and recognize those members who have prominence and distinction in their professions, while still actively engaged in their craft. Kauffman joins other Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity members, such as, Reinhold Niebuhr, author of the Serenity Prayer; Vincent L. Price, art historian, art collector and dramatic artist; Robert L. Howsam, President of the Cincinnati Reds; Bradford G. Corbett, Chairman of the Board, Robintech, Inc. and former owner of the Texas Rangers; and Ross O. Swimmer, Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation.

Brother Kauffman was the featured speaker at the banquet. Following his address, Grand Senior President, **Dr. Dennis R. Parks, Baldwin**

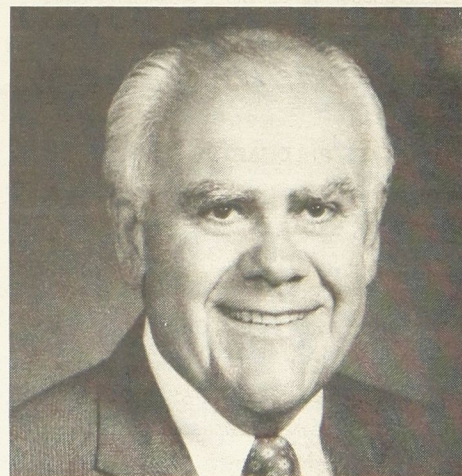
Wallace '72, and Executive Vice President, **John R. Chaney, Indiana '67**, made the presentation in front of more than 200 undergraduate and alumni leaders and members, plus friends and guests, including Brother Kauffman's wife, the former Julia A. Crouch, of Columbia City, IN.

Brother Kauffman joined Alpha Sigma Phi at Purdue University in 1943. He received a Bachelor of Science degree in Mechanical Engineering from the West Lafayette, Indiana school and a Bachelor of Science degree in Marine Engineering from the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy.

During his poignant remarks, Brother Kauffman stated that "leadership is a concept that is at the very heart of our Alpha Sigma Phi tradition." He explained that "you cannot be a leader unless you take personal responsibility for your actions. But even more, you cannot be a leader if you do not take personal responsibility for changing the world around you."

Brother Kauffman went on to say, "Through your association with this great Fraternity, you have been given an opportunity that many others do not have. In return for that opportunity, you must make a commitment to return something to your communities, both during your college years and beyond." He concluded his remarks with a

challenge that "you must believe that your actions do make a difference, not only to you personally, but to society as a whole."

The Annual Report

Fraternity, Inc.

Alpha Sigma Phi's 146th consecutive year was an overwhelming success! The fraternity's leadership focused on full implementation of the bold strategic plan developed to lead the "Old Gal" into the 21st century. Coupled with this dynamic plan, was the addition of comprehensive programs and services for our undergraduate and alumni members. The Grand Council and the National Headquarters professional staff are proud to present this year's annual report on the Fraternity's operation.

Strategic Planning. The seven national advisory committees that were created to focus on the most important challenges facing Alpha Sigma Phi during the upcoming years are in full operation. These seven committees are comprised of volunteer brothers, alumni and undergraduate alike, along with Grand Council and professional staff representation to ensure full concurrence and implementation of recommended programs and actions. The major accomplishments of these committees in the past year included:

Alumni programs. The committee created the "senior to alumnus" program, including materials to help with initial life-after-college planning and career skills recognition plus the presentation of certificates for graduating seniors. They also wrote the job description and facilitated the hiring of a Director of Alumni Services professional staff member in order to increase participation of our 32,000 living graduate members.

Expansion. A comprehensive decision matrix to facilitate our expansion program was developed. Coupled with this was an indepth review of expansion opportunities and the creation of a plan whereby Alpha Sigma Phi could return to campuses where we formerly had chapters and also to new locations.

Provinces and Volunteers. The committee and professional staff planned and conducted an intensive orientation and training session for all Grand Province Chiefs. A complete review of all undergraduate chapters was made to ascertain which required volunteers—from Grand Chapter Advisor, to alumni corporation or association officers, to faculty advisors to parents' clubs in order to improve their individual operations.

Scholarship. The committee continued to aggressively work on and draft a complete scholarship program. They lobbied and successfully achieved additional funds for undergraduate aca-



demical and leadership scholarships for undergraduate students. After their screening and recommendations, a record dollar amount of scholarships was awarded during the past year!

Service. After polling more than two dozen potential national service agencies and philanthropies, the committee scheduled an interview of the four finalists among the charities who responded to our call. The charity selected will have the support of national undergraduate chapters and members as well as alumni groups and individual members. The final decision will be made by the undergraduates in the coming year.

Sesquicentennial Celebration. Initial plans were discussed for our 150th anniversary celebration by this committee. The various events and locations for future conventions, leadership conferences, alumni group meetings will be guided by the decisions made by this group of volunteers. The 150 year history of the Fraternity is being written at this time for release in 1995.

Undergraduate Housing. A survey of housing desire and requirements were made of all chapters. Other national fraternity programs and manuals were also reviewed and a draft housing manual was initiated. A plan whereby current chapter leadership consultants would provide an initial assessment of chapter housing as a prelude to full implementation of a program under the direction of a professional staff person was set.

Expansion/Chapters/Membership. At year's end, we had chartered at the University of Delaware, accomplishing at least two firsts for the Fraternity. One, because it was our first chapter in the state, and two, because of the protracted time it took for the university process to officially recognize the group, they went directly from an interest group to a chapter without ever being a colony! Also, our colony at The University of Findlay

received their charter. Due to the intense focus of the undergraduates, alumni and administration, this group was conceived, colonized and chartered and moved into a house in less than 14 months. Colonies at Central Michigan University, University of South Carolina-Coastal Carolina College and State University of New York-Binghamton remain and are aggressively working towards their charter. A group working toward official recognition as a colony and re-activation of an older chapter is at Ohio Wesleyan University (Epsilon). Numerous other groups are being formed.

Chapters at Tufts (Beta Iota) and Tulane (Gamma Omicron) were closed during the year. The charter of the Tufts chapter was voluntarily returned by the undergraduate members who were unwilling to adhere to our requirements and unable to fulfill the financial obligations of the fraternity. The Tulane chapter was closed by Grand Council action, the chapter repeatedly having failed to reach minimum membership requirements. The SUNY-Buffalo Colony effort to re-activate our Gamma Epsilon Chapter was similarly closed by Grand Council action for failure to meet minimum membership requirements for chartering.

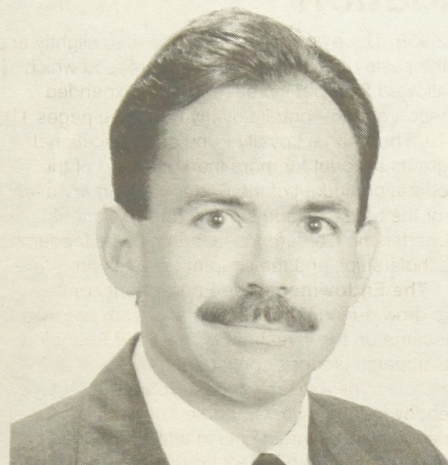
The number of men initiated into the Mystic Circle decreased minimally during 1991-92, a year when other men's general fraternities were reporting losses up to 18 percent. Pledgings were up two percent over the same period last year, giving hope for a successful 1992-93 academic year.

Chapter Services Program. The chapter services program continued to be preeminent in the interfraternal community as we have one full-time travelling chapter leadership consultant for every 17 of our chapters. The Chapter Services pro-

gram consists of three travelling consultants, a full-time director and administrative support. All chapters, colonies and interest groups received tailored educational and leadership consultant programs and services. Each group received at least two full visits from the staff, with most receiving many more visits by not only consultants, but from other professional staff members and key alumni volunteers. Their goal is to make the Alpha Sigma Phi undergraduate experience the most meaningful leadership and living experience possible for our young members!

National Leadership Conference & Convention. Rivalling our chapter services program as the Fraternity's most important educational tool is our National Leadership Conference. Held this year in Charlotte, North Carolina, this is clearly the premier leadership event held by any of the sixty-one members of the National Interfraternity Conference! Leadership education for members of our undergraduate officers and alumni volunteers is the goal of this five day experience. A full, in-depth report on the National Leadership Conference is contained on pages 3-4 of this issue. A report of the concurrent National Convention may also be found in this issue on pages 3-4. Our sixth annual three day Volunteer Alumni Conference was also held in Charlotte. Chapter leaders and alumni attending these conferences continually rate them as one of the best personal development experiences in their lives. Many rate the educational worth and depth of these premier events ahead of the curricular challenges offered on their campus. These same leaders report that the conferences assist them to develop as leaders and implement personal and chapter plans and goals. Our goal, "To Better The Man," is advanced by every person attending our annual leadership conferences!

Finances. For the third consecutive year, the Fraternity's operating statement showed a modest gain. This year, \$1,344 was reported as sur-

plus in the end of year audit. Financial challenges seem always to be with the Fraternity as we strive to provide a high level of quality educational programs to chapters and members, all the while dealing with inflationary pressures. Undergraduate dues and fees make up only 49.7 percent of the total income, a percentage that has continued to drop for the past few years as the number of undergraduates has remained relatively constant, their dues or fees have not been increased, and the amount of alumni donations from the Annual Loyalty Fund and from the Educational Foundation Trustees in the form of educational grants has increased dramatically in relative proportion to the overall budget. Until significant additional undergraduate driven income is added, the Fraternity will continue to increasingly rely on these last two alumni sources in order to increase services or expand programs!

National Headquarters. After 41 years, the National Headquarters offices have moved from 24 West William Street in Delaware, OH. We now are occupying an "interim leased facility" at 12 Lexington Boulevard, west of downtown Delaware. Our business mailing address remains at P.O. Box 838, Delaware, OH 43015. Our telephone number remains at (614) 363-1911 and our facsimile number remains at (614) 369-1845. The former National Headquarters was sold.

Risk Management. By far, the two greatest challenges facing Alpha Sigma Phi and the entire Greek system today are alcohol abuse and hazing. In spite of aggressive actions, we occasionally find instances of substance abuse in our chapters. These instances blaspheme our purposes

and tarnish our reputation. Clearly we attempt to tackle these head-on through educational publications, officers' manuals, miscellaneous doctrinal materials, official position and policy statements and professional staff and volunteer visits to the undergraduate chapter locations. Our strong stance on substance abuse is well known to our undergraduates!

Education of new members and refresher training is a continual challenge. A tremendous amount of chapter leadership time and that of the chapter leadership consultants is spent in educating members on a variety of risk management topics. Educating undergraduate members is not enough. We must also get the word out to our alumni that times have changed. Many of the rules concerning the use of alcohol and human dignity have changed since they were undergraduates. Fortunately, the past year saw a dramatic down-turn in reported alcohol abuse and hazing violations by our undergraduate chapters. The message that we continually send to them that alcohol abuse and hazing have no part to play in a proper undergraduate experience seems to be working. But we must not let our guard down for one moment in this most important area!

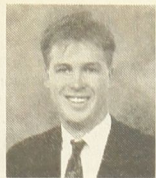
Alpha Sigma Phi continues to be a leader in risk management. As a charter member of the Fraternity Insurance Purchasing Group (FIPG), we have attempted to ensure that our chapters can enjoy their undergraduate experience "on a level playing field" with other Greek chapters on their campus by abiding by identical risk management rules. Clearly, FIPG has made our chapters a much safer environment!

For the first time, Alpha Sigma Phi required all chapters to participate in a nationally sponsored liability insurance program. The program, which is with Lloyd's of London, brings us the opportunity to hold down premium dollar expenses for our undergraduate members, while being actively involved with loss control.

Alumni Volunteerism. Alpha Sigma Phi has been blessed with hundreds of alumni brothers who volunteer their time to serve our Fraternity. From the Grand Council, Grand Province Chiefs and committee members at the national level, to Grand Chapter Advisors, local alumni corporation/association officers, faculty advisors, mentors, counsellors and financial supporters at the

local level, the "Old Gal's" volunteers are clearly the backbone of our success. Our entire brotherhood is indebted to the good work of those who volunteered their resources of time and money so that the challenges were accomplished!

The Year Ahead. The strategic plan will be reviewed and implemented. Major additions to this plan in the upcoming year will include:

- Circulation of a "time and talent" survey to our alumni membership.
- Increased regional alumni events and individual contact with our alumni members.
- Publication of an alumni event planning guide.
- Hiring of a professional staff member to direct an extensive national expansion program.
- Acquisition and development of five additional colonies.
- Increased orientation and training of province volunteers and undergraduate leaders.
- Increased support for province programming.
- Publication of a "volunteer needs" brochure.
- A significant increase in scholarship funding.
- Publication of a comprehensive scholarship manual.
- Selection of a national service project or philanthropy to be supported by undergraduate and alumni members.
- Identification of events and outline of plans for our 150th Anniversary Celebration.
- Publication of a housing resource manual.
- Revision and publication of our much heralded membership manual, *To Better The Man*.

These additional programs and resources for the upcoming year will be a welcome signal for all Alpha Sigs as we continue to maintain our superior chapter leadership consultant ratio, free chapter newsletters for chapters, and the publication of four issues of *The Tomahawk*. The Grand Council continues to be committed to allowing volunteers to serve at all echelons and welcomes

The Educational Foundation

The Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation continues to increase in importance as the Fraternity dramatically expands educational programming and related services for undergraduate chapters and brothers. Educational grants are made to the Fraternity annually, in support of educational program requests. Funding for these come from two primary sources: alumni gifts to the Annual Loyalty Fund and earned investment income from the Educational Foundation endowment. Gifts to the Annual Loyalty Fund during 1991-92 rose 7% from the previous year to \$180,359, an increase of \$12,437. This year, the number of donors increased by six percent to

2,958. The average gift size also rose slightly and the costs of raising the funds decreased which allowed for a net increase! For an expanded report on the Annual Loyalty Fund see pages 11-19. The Annual Loyalty Fund and educational grants account for more than one-third of the operating budget of the Fraternity. Primary uses for the funds include support for the National Leadership Conference, academic and leadership scholarships and the chapter services program.

The Endowment. The Endowment continued to grow during the year, primarily from earned income on the investment. The Third Founding Campaign pledges continued to trickle in and increase the available funds. Substantial future endowment growth will come from future gifts, bequests or planned gifts in addition to fund appreciation. To date, 83 brothers have notified the Educational Foundation they have made provisions for the Endowment in their will, trusts or insurance policies. These brothers are recognized annually in *The Tomahawk* as members of "The Manigault Society." The current list of brothers appears on pages 12-13 along with information on how to join the society. While the Educational Foundation participates in corporate matching gift programs, it does not normally benefit from corporate grant support. Mostly Alpha Sigs and members of the Alpha Sigma Phi family support the "Old Gal."

The Educational Foundation Trustees continually review the investments made by the three investment managers selected in 1991. It is the desire of the Trustees to pay out as educational grants and operating expenses an amount that does not exceed a five percent return on the investments. Additional earned income should allow the endowment corpus to grow. The objec-

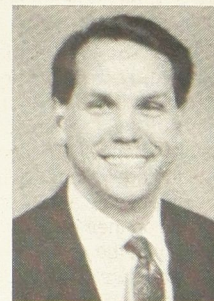

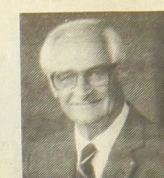

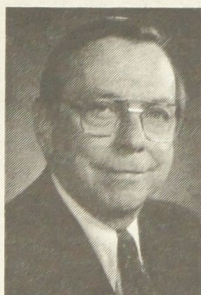

allow the endowment corpus to grow. The objective of the Trustees is to continue to exercise fiduciary responsibility and prudently to produce sufficient dollars for annual grants to support Fraternity programs and allow the endowment's market value to grow for future Alpha Sig generations. As a general rule, the endowment is not available to support operational and non-educational budgetary items of the Fraternity.

Alumni Programs. During the past year, Alpha Sig alumni have benefitted by a dramatic increase in alumni programming. Numerous regional events have been hosted in an effort to educate the alumni on the Fraternity of 1992 and the various programs of the Fraternity which are supported by the Educational Foundation dollars.

Vice President for Development, **Steven V. Zizzo, Illinois '84**, is a full-time Educational Foundation employee responsible for developing communications with the alumni in an effort to increase support for the Educational Foundation. A significant portion of his duties includes alumni development and planned giving opportunities. Brother Zizzo is also the editor of the *Foundation For Excellence* newsletter which is distributed three times annually to brothers who support the Educational foundation to keep them apprised of the impact their gifts have on Alpha Sigma Phi.

Director of Alumni Services, **Theodore R. Kocher, Findlay '92**, has recently been added to the staff. Brother Kocher has responsibilities for the Annual Loyalty Fund and the coordination of numerous alumni functions and events throughout the country. Brother Kocher will also be establishing regional alumni groups and be working with undergraduate chapters and colonies in establishing volunteer support.

As the Fraternity continues to develop new requirements for educational services and programs to assist chapters to improve their educational programming for undergraduate brothers, the need for increasing the output of the Annual Loyalty Fund and the Endowment grows. Both Brothers Zizzo and Kocher will work closely with alumni to show how the Educational Foundation can assist each chapter to improve and to help each undergraduate brother have a more meaningful, rewarding and positive undergraduate experience.

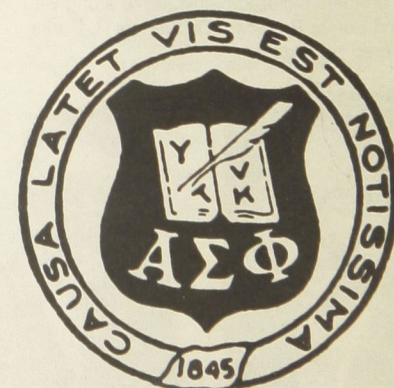
Chapter Endowment Funds. The Educational Foundation established a new program in 1988-89 allowing alumni to create special endowment funds for individual chapters. The first of these funds was created by **Robert W. Kutz, California '67**, for the benefit of Nu Chapter, California-Berkeley and Psi Chapter, Oregon State. In 1990 Brother Kutz added a Chapter Endowment Fund for the benefit of Alpha Nu Chapter, Westminster College, in honor of past Executive Directors **Gary A. Anderson, Westminster '71, Omega '86; Kevin J. Garvey, Westminster '75; and Robert M. Sheehan, Jr., Westminster '76.**

During 1990-91, Brother Kutz created a chapter endowment to the benefit of Alpha Zeta Chapter,

UCLA. During the past year, three additional chapter endowment funds were established. Past Grand Senior President **Stan N. Miller, Purdue '64**, created two chapter endowment funds benefitting Alpha Pi Chapter, Purdue and Gamma Chi Chapter, Indiana. Also, Brother **A.W. Lubbers, Lehigh '31**, created a chapter endowment to benefit the Beta Epsilon Chapter at Lehigh. Each of the three chapter endowments for this year was begun with funding in the amount of \$50,000!

Under the provisions of the chapter endowment fund program, an alumnus must make a minimum gift of \$500 to establish the fund. After that, any alumnus or friend may add to the chapter endowment with additional contributions of at least \$500. The Educational Foundation Trustees are responsible for investing the funds, and the annual investment income may be used by the chapter to support its own educational programming—including scholarships, attendance at leadership conferences, or bringing in speakers for the chapter's benefit. It has been indicated that additional chapter endowment funds are being created for the benefit of Mu Chapter, University of Washington, and possibly more to be announced in the near future.

Look for alumni events to increase significantly. Cities already on our tentative plan for the year include: Atlanta, Boston, Chicago, Cleveland, Cincinnati, Dallas, Dayton, Detroit, Denver, Honolulu, Houston, Indianapolis, Los Angeles, New Brunswick, New Orleans, Omaha, Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, San Diego, San Francisco, Seattle, St. Louis, Toledo, and Washington, DC. Also, events in the following states are a near certainty: Arizona, Arkansas, Connecticut, Florida, Illinois, New Jersey, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina and Wisconsin. Hope to see you this year or in some way to have each of you participate! □

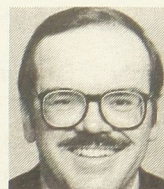

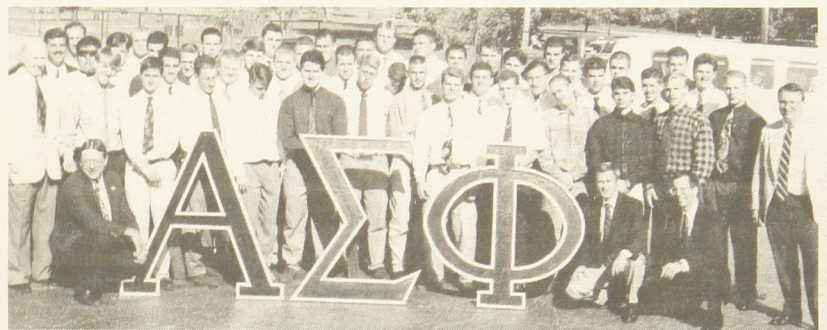
