Educational Foundation Appoints New Trustees

Two brothers have accepted the invitation to join the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation Board of Trustees.

Horace R. Kornegay, Wake Forest '42, was originally initiated into Alpha Kappa Pi at Wake Forest, prior to its merging with Alpha Sigma Phi in 1946. He remains actively interested in his chapter, having assisted them in keeping their chapter space in the residence hall. A 1949 graduate of Wake Forest School of Law, he currently serves on the Board of Visitors. He was elected U.S. Congressman for the 6th District, North Carolina, and served in the 87th-90th Congresses. He served as V.P., Counsel for The Tobacco Institute in Washington, D.C. 1969-70; subsequently serving as the President/Executive Director 1970-81 and Chairman 1981-86.

Richard E. Middlekauff, Oregon State '61, served his chapter as Rush Chairman and President. Upon graduation he worked for the Ford Motor Company and earned his MBA at Long Beach State University in California. He established a Ford dealership in Dallas, which he moved to Plano, TX, where it currently is rated 251 of 6000 for dealerships.

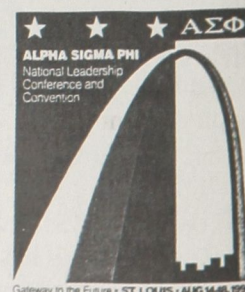
Fast, Free Scholarship Info

Do you need cash to help pay for school? Do you want to find sources for cash free? If so, read on.

A software program called fastWeb (<http://web.studentservices.com/fastweb>) sifts through more than 200,000 scholarships, grants, and loans for undergraduate and graduate students to find listings that fit a student's profile. Student Aid Research Through Technology, a financial-aid consulting firm, and Student Services, Inc., a research firm, compile the data base. To create the profile, a student completes a questionnaire that asks about major subject, grade-point average, special interests and ethnic origin. Within 15 minutes the program sends by e-mail a customized list of financial aid sources, along with addresses, deadlines and form letters for requesting details. As new financial aid listings are added to the data base, any that fit the profile are automatically posted to the student's mailbox.

California Dreamin'...

The University of Southern California is taking applications for the position of Greek House Advisor (GHA) for the 1996-97 academic year. The GHA position is open to men and women who have been admitted at the graduate level at USC. GHAs are assigned to live in one of the fraternities or sororities at USC and help with chapter management, programming, and leadership development. 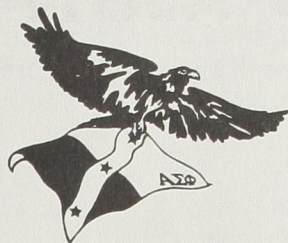
Beta Delta Chapter


