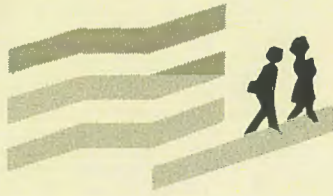


Dear Mr. Boundy:
