## The Educational Conference History or Historic?

Brotherhood of enduring strength. Prior to the informal social hour which concluded each day's activities, Father Richard B. Byrne, Stanford '60, Chaplain for the Fraternity, ended the first evening's sessions with an unusual presentation intended to cause the participants to come to grips with "Values of the Fraternity in the '70s." A variety of non-fraternity situations were given and the Brothers voted to decide the values which were held by the different characters in each.

Grand Junior President George B. Trubow, Michigan '53, was in charge of the morning's activities during the second day of the Conference. "Chapter Motivation" was the topic and the approach was again novel and designed to induce involvement of the undergraduate representatives. After George's description of the principles governing "management by objective," with which his association with the Federal Government has made him conversant, the assembly was divided into small workshop groups. Through first-hand experience, under the guidance of Grand Councilors Louis DeLuca, Wagner '58, Richard Dexter, Oregon State '60, George E. Lord, Ohio Wesleyan '61, and Trubow, the groups learned methods for goal identification through

**FACT:** The Educational Conference of Alpha Sigma Phi at Purdue University is now *history*. **QUESTION:** Will it prove to be *historic* for the Fraternity? A philosopher well might tell us that it matters not how great or how small an event may seem to be. Whether it consists of brushing one's teeth to start a day or signing a momentous document, whether it leaves behind ethereal electro-chemical traces or written evidence, every event represents change. "In some way, each event becomes a part of cosmic history," our philosophical friend could argue. "But," a historian might counter, "only those happenings which produce important changes are worthwhile. Only notable changes are celebrated as

to experiment again with consensus achievement techniques in the leadership context. After they had returned to the full session and reported the results of the workshop groupings, the topic turned to ways in which the Chapter can utilize some of the theories of individual motivation to advantage. Using his own experience with the telephone company in Oregon, Brother Dexter clarified the fallacy in many typical Chapter approaches to "getting the members involved."

At the session following the third day's lunch, Grand Councilor DeLuca drew upon his own experience as a college administrator to treat the often neglected area of chapter activity, alumni relations. Once again, role-playing was used to make some of the possible reactions of alumni returning to the Chapter house vivid and plausible. The "wrap-up" session of the afternoon was spent in a review of the techniques which the attending Brothers had acquired and in an evaluation of the Conference itself. The emphasis was on the future and what each Brother would do with the experiences which he had gained when he returned to his own Chapter.

As has become typical of both Conferences and Conferences, our last

Having served as director for the 1971 Conference and having had the privilege of acting in the same capacity for the 1973 Conference, I would like to examine the latter in this kind of history-versus-historic perspective. My bias in doing so is obvious: I believe that our "Old Gal," now well into her second century of life, needs a generous infusion of the historic. The fact that we have been on the American campus scene for nearly 128 years proves to the history buff that our heritage includes much that is notable. However, for our fraternal life to continue to be celebrated on into the future, the present must include events promising to become historic. How much of this kind of promise did the 1973 Conference show?

There were fine men representing the chapters at both the 1971 and 1973 Conferences. They are men whom those of us who are alumni can be proud to call our Brothers. But, this observer saw differences between the two groups. This year's group seemed to be less questioning about the basic values of fraternity. Whereas the cry of the 1971 group seemed to be, "It hasn't worked, let's throw a lot of it away," the 1973 Conference seemed to be saying, "Maybe there's more here than we have thought, let's see how it can be made to work." Let me hasten to point out that I do not see this shift as an escapist return to the past via the nostalgia that so many popularizers are heralding. The speed of the change curve prevents those who are caught up in it from returning to any past campus and social era. Except in the most artificial ways, we cannot readopt boola boola, swing, hard rock, or any other fad or fashion. The now-

produced, they were not. It is here that I see some of the seeds of the historic.

Nor were the undergraduate representatives the only Brothers on hand at Purdue. The members of the Grand Council are always present for Educational Conferences. This time, however, theirs was the central role. It was a role played from the heart and the enthusiasm and sincerity with which it was played projected well to the newer Brothers. The undergraduates saw men, successful in a wide array of fields, taking out time to prepare for and to conduct the Conference sessions because of genuine love for Alpha Sigma Phi. They rubbed shoulders with other alumni, not Grand Councilors, who were making the same sacrifices for the same reason. The providing of core leadership by the Grand Council and other alumni is another source of potential for the historic.

The facts of what happened are always difficult to handle when those facts include such a plethora of events. But, all of the events clearly related to Conference theme, "Practical Solutions to Practical Problems." Grand Senior President Robert E. Miller, Connecticut '49, opened the gathering by stressing this as he outlined the events which, during the next several days, would bring a group of unacquainted Brothers together into a tightly knit group working for our Fraternity. Dr. Robert B. Eckles, for many years adviser to the host Chapter at Purdue, used his own skills as a professional historian as he spoke about, "History, Traditions, and Our Response to Change." Drawing upon his own undergraduate days at Harvard's Beta Chapter, he stressed that, while Chapter customs have changed, the basic thread of Brotherhood has drawn together the individuals who have joined each Chapter into a nationwide

which he had gained when he returned to his own Chapter. As has become typical of both Conventions and Conferences, our last evening together was spent in an exemplification of our ritual of initiation.

And, as we left the Mystic Circle that evening, the obvious sense of devotion, present in each Brother and ready to be carried back to each of the Chapters represented, strengthened my own conviction that seeds for the historic would scatter when the delegates left after the next morning's business session.

"Chapter Finance" occupied the earlier portion of the afternoon of the second day. Alumni Brother Buford H. Byers, Purdue '49, who has specialized in chapter economics during his long-term advisement of the Purdue Chapter, gave a detailed treatment of means by which budget and fiscal matters can be handled soundly by Chapters. Grand Councilor Lord, utilizing some role-playing techniques, reinforced by small group experiences by the attending Brothers, dealt with the practical means by which rush and bidding can be accomplished.

Devoted to exploring "Individual Leadership Development," Grand Councilor Dexter's third day opening session provided perspectives about the various possible styles through which leaders function. Having discovered the advantages of what has been termed the "group-centered" leader over those of the "laissezfaire" and "authoritarian" extreme manifestations, the Brothers returned to workshop sessions

A song title, "Saturday Afternoon Came All Too Soon," might well grow out of the Conference's conclusion. The friendships which had developed among Brothers who, when they had arrived four days earlier had been bonded by a common pin and oath, made goodbyes emotional and difficult. Vows to meet again and to keep in communication mingled with expressions of gratitude to our host, Alpha Pi Chapter, Purdue University. Grand Councilor Robert Allen's son, Eric, along with Alumni Brother Byers served as my assistant directors to coordinate the efforts of the Purdue members as they successfully sought to make our stay comfortable and pleasant. The words of gratitude were heartfelt and deserved. (Continued on Page 2)

The basic reason for the trial change is budget. In the mail this 26,000 tabloid issue will cost about \$2700.00. In magazine form, the Grand Council has been spending about \$4500.00 for each issue. In order to stay within a budget that has remained fairly constant over the past twelve years, the average number of pages have been decreased. If the members of the Fraternity approve of the tabloid approach we will be able to print the equivalent of 24 or more pages and still remain within budget requirements. It is planned that

the summer issue of the Tomahawk will retain the magazine format and be directed to rush. Alpha Sigma Phi would be following a trend started by others. Sigma Nu, Phi Kappa Tau, Chi Psi, Chi Phi, Sigma Phi Epsilon and Acacia no longer print a magazine. They rely entirely on the tabloid approach to keep their alumni and chapter members informed. Sigma Nu was the first, starting approximately four years ago.
