


Alpha Sig . . . For Life!!!

1984 Convention reviews record-breaking year!

Over 120 Alpha Sig undergraduates and alumni convened the 1984 National Convention held at the University of Illinois, August 2-5. The undergraduate delegates met in lengthy sessions which resulted in a National Insurance Program, a new Headquarters Newsletter Service, and a 6% increase in undergraduate fees, among many other items of business. The delegates applauded as records in annual giving, pledge and initiation statistics, and endowment fundraising were announced. The theme of the Convention was "The Phoenix For Life!" and delegates joined in chants of "Alpha Sig For Life" all week long. The theme was chosen as a signal for every Alpha Sig, undergraduate and alumnus, to recommit himself to those vows taken years ago to be a loyal and active member of Alpha Sigma Phi "for life." The

Fraternity is in the midst of a renaissance, and every Alpha Sig is encouraged to join in as our brotherhood thunders on! "Alpha Sig For Life!!!"

The Convention got off to an impressive start with a 100 man Black Lantern Processional around the University of Illinois main campus area. Led by Eta Chapter Marshal **David Evans, Illinois '82**, brothers marched past the "old" Eta Chapter house (prior to 1926) and then past the "new" house (since 1926.) The march concluded with the formation of a giant Omega on the main quad of the university, and a formal memorial was read by Grand Treasurer, **Robert A. Sandercox, Bethany '51**, on behalf of all brothers who had entered the Omega Chapter during the recent biennium. Every brother carried a lighted black lantern and wore a black robe during the silent 30 minute march. The whole campus was quite taken and impressed with the proceedings.

Then it was down to work! The heart of the convention proceedings is the Committee System. The 1984 committees worked long and hard for three days on their assignments. Following is a review of each committee's report from the convention.

Alumni Relations and Housing, Andrew Bergdoll, Lehigh '82, Chairman. The creation of a National Insurance Program was the main result of

He served on the committee which wrote the first Pledge Manual, was a Grand Province Chief from 1959-66, served on the Grand Council from 1968-75, including one term each as Grand Treasurer and Grand Junior President, served as a Director of the A-S-P Corporation from 1975-80, and since 1979 has served as a Trustee of the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation. The Distinguished Service Award is given to one brother annually who has given exemplary service to the "Old Gal" above and beyond the call of duty.

this committee's work. Under the resolution passed by the Convention, **every** chapter of the Fraternity is required to hold high levels of liability insurance. The changing insurance climate and the increasingly litigious society that we live in today has forced this policy. The Convention directed the Grand Council to purchase a National Insurance Program in which every chapter would have an opportunity to participate and which would provide low costs due to group purchasing power. The Alumni Relations and Housing Committee also joined with the Committee on Publications, Public Relations, and Service to recommend that a new

Headquarters Newsletter Service be adopted, and that the required number of chapter newsletters per year be raised from two to three.

Credentials, Resolutions, and Law, Pat Studdard, Oregon State '83, Chairman. Besides overseeing the work of all committees to ensure that Fraternity law and policy were being followed, this committee drafted a number of resolutions of their own. Most important were resolutions honoring Delta Beta Xi Award winners who had entered Omega Chapter over the past biennium. These brothers include: **John R. Benson, American '54, C.Y. Coburn, Missouri '31, J. Edward Drew, California '16, C. Wallace Abel, Westminster '44, Norman L. Etheridge, Atlantic Christian '58, William C. Mullendore, Michigan '12, Douglas P. Hammial, Michigan '29, Elwood A. Smith, Jr., Penn '48, Albert G. Jahn, Penn State '30, James Eugene Moore, Stanford '17, Guy H. Parkhurst, Oklahoma '33, and William R. Ward, Tufts '36.**

Expansion, Jeff Mosely, Wake Forest '84, Chairman. The committee encouraged every chapter to become involved in the expansion and reactivation program of the Fraternity. It

underscored the programs available to chapters, including the Mother Chapter Program and Sister Chapter Incentive, which would result in the growth of Alpha Sigma Phi. The committee urged the creation of a National Headquarters staff position responsible for expansion as soon as funds are available.

Finance, Greg Anderson, Washington '82, Chairman. The Convention delegates nearly unanimously passed a committee recommended revision in the Fraternity By-Laws which increased Annual Chapter Dues from \$35.00 per man, per year, to \$40.00. This increase reflects a 6% increase in the overall undergraduate fee structure which also includes a \$110.00 Initiation Fee, and \$35.00 Pledge Fee. This committee's extensive work resulted in a balanced budget for fiscal year 1984-85.

Nominations, Richard R. Gibbs, Oklahoma '51, Chairman. Numerous candidates for the Grand Council were set before the Nominations Committee and Convention delegates. Elected to fill the vacancy created by the term ending of **Richard S. Sanders, Missouri Valley '62,** was **Ronald W. Dollens, Purdue '65.** The officers of the volunteer Grand Council elected at the Convention are: Grand Senior President, **Evin C. Varner, Presbyterian '58,** Grand Junior President, **Donald R. Morgan, Purdue '57,** Grand Secretary, **Edmund A. Hamburger, N.Y. Polytechnic '45,** Grand Treasurer, **Robert A. Sandercox, Bethany '51,** Grand Marshal, **James V. Fitzpatrick, Illinois Tech '47,** and Grand Councilors **Stan N. Miller, Purdue '64,** and **Ronald W. Dollens, Purdue '65.**

Pledge Education, Scott Fisher, Radford '82, Chairman. The 1984 Pledge Education Committee reaffirmed the strong stands that the 1980 and 1982 committees developed against hazing and all forms of improper pledge activities. The committee modified the various policies of the Fraternity to improve their effectiveness. The development of more resources on positive pledge education was also recommended.

Province Program, Robert Gruszczynski, Lawrence Tech '82, Chairman. The growth of the Fraternity in the Southeast required that an additional Province be created by splitting former Province VII. Brothers living in the Carolinas or Virginia interested in serving as Province Chief should contact National Headquarters. The committee also recommended that a special standing committee be created to design continued reforms in the Province System which would be sent to the next National Convention.



Publications, Public Relations, and Service, **Craig Abrams**, American '82, Chairman. The idea of adopting a "national charity" was studied by the committee, but dismissed as impractical at this time by most chapters due to the number of local charities already supported. These local charity efforts were applauded by the Convention, and the delegates urged that they be continued with increased vigor. Most important, was the committee's recommendation that a proposed Headquarters Newsletter Service be implemented and that chapters should now be required to produce three, rather than two, newsletters per year for alumni. The new Headquarters Newsletter Service provides a great service to chapters who, for years, had not been producing newsletters because of the great amount of time involved in producing a quality publication. The new service produces finished newsletters from rough copy that chapters submit. The service types, lays out, prints, stamps, and mails the newsletter.

The Convention hit a spiritual high on the second evening during the Ritual Exemplification. An anonymous candidate was selected to be officially brought into Alpha Sigma Phi by the Grand Council. Until that evening, no one knew that it was **Jonathan K. Burns**, youngest son of Executive Secretary Emeritus, **Ralph F. Burns**,

Ohio Wesleyan '32—least of all Ralph Burns himself. Burns's other son, **Bruce Burns**, Ohio State '63, had long been a brother in the fraternity he grew up with. However, Jonathan attended West Point where, of course, no fraternity has a chapter. Special provisions by the Grand Council arranged the initiation, and made the man whose family served his forty years as Executive Secretary right along with him, the father of **two** Alpha Sig brothers!

The highlight of the Convention was the Final Banquet on the last evening of the meeting. The featured speaker was **John A. Savage**, Toledo '51. Brother Savage, one of the top life insurance salesmen in the country and a noted motivational speaker, delivered a powerful message to the brotherhood. "A negative thought is a down payment on an obligation to fail," said Savage. "Never let a negative thought enter your mind!" Savage's philosophy includes daily exercise, daily prayer, and powerful positive thinking. He concluded, "Fall in love with your Fraternity. Alpha Sigma Phi has had a profound effect on my life and it will on yours." Outgoing Grand Senior President **Stan N. Miller**, **Purdue '64**, presented Savage with the Fraternity's Distinguished Merit Award in recognition of his numerous professional accomplishments.

Varner elected GSP

Far into the deep hours of the morning during the National Convention, a group of brothers are transfixed on the tales of a comfortable, balding gentleman. His eyes move from face to face, in an hypnotic pulse, as he talks of our fraternity's history, its future and its worth. The brothers don't move and are meshed in the depths of Alpha Sigma Phi, as portrayed by one special man.

If Executive Secretary Emeritus Ralph Burns is said to be the heart of Alpha Sigma Phi, then Evin Varner must be its soul.

For more than a decade, our newly elected Grand Senior President has vigorously pursued the betterment of our Society, and along the way, kindled a unique brand of fraternal activism, that ensures an almost endless vitality for Alpha Sigma Phi.

Evin C. Varner, Presbyterian '58, epitomizes our lifelong brotherhood. During the past ten years, the successful advertising and public relations executive, has traveled the country visiting more than 45 chapters and alumni associations, preaching the virtues of Alpha Sigma Phi to all who will listen, and working vigorously to preserve the Greek system. Nowhere does he leave disappointed.

"Alpha Sigma Phi takes 'fraternity' to its highest plane," Varner says. "It becomes more than a mere three or four year experience while in college. It is a bond, a common thread, that links our members." "Fraternity" is something that Varner has shared through experiences with brothers worldwide, and through the efforts of interfraternal organizations. But nowhere has he seen "fraternity" have a deeper meaning than with Alpha Sigma Phi. "I've seen the true meaning of our fraternity spark in the eyes of a newly initiated 17 year old, and in the not-forgotten secret grip of a 91 year old alumnus. Our fraternity is real. It's lifelong," he says. Lifelong brotherhood is the emphasis of Varner's term as Grand Senior President. And it is a concept with which he has lived with a hands-on attitude.

"It seems that Evin has always been active in the fraternity," says Immediate Past Grand Senior President Stan Miller. "His contributions have significant impact on this organization at undergraduate and alumni levels. I'm sure his tenure as GSP will prove no less vital."

Evin Varner began active involvement as an alumnus brother in Alpha Sigma Phi during 1974. He volunteered as Editor of *The Tomahawk*, a post he continues to hold, and devoted countless hours to Alpha Sigma Phi's fledgling expansion efforts seeing chapters immediately begin at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, and at North Carolina State University.

In 1976 he was inducted to Delta Beta Xi for his contributions to the Fraternity and in 1978 was elected to the Grand Council as Grand Marshal. As

Grand Marshal he undertook the massive task of updating Alpha Sigma Phi's Rituals, something left undone for over 30 years. Not only was he able to lead the task force to update our Rituals' language, but he also revived traditions dating back to the earliest days of Alpha Sigma Phi and created new ceremonies for various aspects of fraternal life.¹⁸

Varner's work with the expansion program took him "where ever I'm needed." He visited some 11 colonies, often teaching pledge classes or helping structure the chapter, and he visited the administrations of a half-dozen other universities seeking Alpha Sigma Phi's entry. He even accepted an adjunct professorship at one college in order to have direct contact with students who may wish to start a new chapter.

"Sharing our fraternity guarantees our existence," he says, "whether on campuses where we have chapters, or campuses where there is potential. We've been skillful in our selection of campuses where we want to be, and fortunate to attract the high caliber individuals necessary to make the sacrifice needed to establish new chapters."

As Editor of *The Tomahawk*, Varner is active in the College Fraternity Editor's Association—an organization of full-time and volunteer editors of fraternity and sorority publications across the nation. He served on the executive board of CFEA five years before being elected its president in 1981. Under his guidance, CFEA became the largest interfraternal organization in the United States with more than 100 members. He has chaired CFEA's annual program committee four times during the last ten years, and led six new editor's workshops at those conferences.

Due to restrictions not allowing board members to receive awards, *The Tomahawk* was ineligible for recognition until 1983. And during the past two years, *The Tomahawk* has won five honors for layout and editorial content—a record unparalleled by any other fraternal publication.

At the 1980 National Convention of Alpha Sigma Phi, Varner was elected to the post of Grand Secretary. He became Grand Junior President in 1982, and was elevated by Convention delegates this past summer to his current position.

Varner is a man of ceaseless energies and deceptive humility that belies his actual contributions to Alpha Sigma Phi. For most, it seems as if Alpha Sigma Phi is his full-time work. It's not. Alpha Sigma Phi is like a family.

"I'm happy to be able to devote so much time to Alpha Sigma Phi," he says. "I'm lucky to be able to give as much time to the fraternity as I do." But I never can give back as much as I believe that I have received from this brotherhood. That special kinship we share is reward and incentive enough to continue."

Varner's real occupation is as an advertising and public relations professional. Since his graduation from Presbyterian College, Varner has held numerous positions in newspapers, public relations and advertising. After a seven year stint as International Creative Director for Dentsu Advertising in Osaka, Japan, Varner returned to Charlotte, North Carolina where he was a founding partner and creative director of a major regional advertising agency. In 1980 he left Charlotte to take the top spot of a well-known Washington, D.C. agency, and since has returned to Charlotte where he acts as a communications consultant. A prolific writer, Varner's work has appeared in a number of magazines, including *The New Yorker* and *Esquire*, and has had creative work appear on the major television networks.

A number of civic and charitable organizations have benefited from Varner's talents including Big Brothers/Big Sisters and the Little Theater of Charlotte. But none as directly, or largely, as Alpha Sigma Phi.

"Alpha Sigma Phi is my first and foremost love," says Varner proudly. "Like many of our members, I believe the fraternity helped me get my start and taught me what I needed to succeed in life. What I do pales in comparison."

Varner's work during the last ten years has been more like a full-time vocation, rather than a passionate avocation. Long after his regular workday ends, Varner can be found pounding away at his typewriter churning out stories for *The Tomahawk*, or corresponding with alumni and chapters around the country. Or he's found going "just a little out of my way" (up to 800 miles) during business trips to spend an evening with a chapter. Or he's found until the wee hours of the morning with members of a colony painting rich portraits of our Society's heritage; and imposing views of its future.

"Alpha Sigma Phi moves us all to be better," he is fond of saying. "To Better The Man becomes more than idealistic phrase. It becomes our legacy." □




Fade in! A front page photo

This Annual Report reviews Alpha Sigma Phi's performance as Business and Brotherhood. It has been a great year for the "Old Gal." Our future is ever brighter!

seasoned volunteers visit each chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi. For two to four days, the chapter gets to review financial management, house management, member recruitment, pledge and member education, scholarship development, ritual presentation and officer training. Special workshops are prepared as necessary to benefit individual chapter needs. Additional staff is a necessity in this vital area.

The Executive Director of the Fraternity is **Robert M. Sheehan, Jr., Westminster '76**. Brother Sheehan and the National Headquarters Staff encourage you to visit, call, write and stay involved.

Annual Budget. Years of double-digit inflation throughout the 1970s played havoc with the Fraternity's budget. Only in recent years has the Fraternity been able to bring costs under control and begin to meet those costs with increases in income. Over the past two National Conventions, undergraduate delegates have voted themselves a 40% increase in their own yearly fees. (Alpha Sigma Phi fees still remain median among all national fraternities.) Happily, with these changes the Grand Council has been able to set a balanced budget for 1984-85! Unfortunately, there are thousands of dollars worth of programs that have been developed, but do not have adequate funding to implement. Alumni need to answer the undergraduate challenge by increasing their donations, just as undergraduates have increased their fees.


National Headquarters and Annual Budget








Annual Loyalty Fund Donors

1. To make every chapter stronger.
2. To reactivate chapters, and add new chapters at quality institutions.
3. To develop improved alumni communications and activities.

The Chapters

Manpower. "At least 85% of all the problems chapters have can be solved by increasing the number of members in a chapter or keeping that number at a high level," says **Executive Director**

Robert M. Sheehan, Jr. "The biggest request we receive from chapters is to help them with "rush," these are the reasons why we devote most of our attention and resources to improving chapter "manpower."

Alpha Sigma Phi posted strong overall results in membership increases in 1983-84. The number of men pledged was 908, up from 759 a year earlier, and the number of men initiated was 705, up from 672 the previous year. The 19.5% increase in men pledged was the highest increase posted by any national fraternity in the country!

Visitations by Headquarters Staff always include a review of the chapter's Rush Program as well as suggestions for improving the program. Virtually every national and regional meeting of the Fraternity includes a session on "membership recruitment." The National Headquarters provides

Angeles, U.C.L.A. is home of the old Alpha Zeta Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi, founded in 1926. This chapter's reactivation will mark the tenth reactivation of a chapter by the Fraternity in the past five years! This performance signals the Fraternity's commitment to Reactivation as a #1 priority.

Unfortunately, the Fraternity's annual budget does not have much room for financing Reactivations/Expansion (3% in 1984-85.) This is a major area that the Fraternity wants to spend more on as income from alumni donations and other sources increases.

The colonies at Stockton State and U.C.L.A. are scheduled for chartering during the fall term. Watch *The Tomahawk* for news and details.

Again, because of the financial picture, plans for Reactivation/Expansion in 1984-85 are limited. Groundwork is being laid at the University of Iowa, old home of Alpha Beta of Alpha Sigma Phi. As always, the Fraternity seeks alumni help in identifying quality institutions ripe for expansion or reactivation. Both colonies at Stockton State and U.C.L.A. are a result of direct alumni activity. You can help too!

"Tonight marks a beginning, a new era in our fraternal journey. The past two years are now irrelevant, except for the experiences we have shared as brothers. These experiences from which we have learned so much, will become the foundation on which we will build a strong National Alpha Sigma Phi."

"Ahead of us lies a virgin beach, a beach which has never been treaded upon. Our prints on this beach must be powerful enough to weather the years and remain traceable, for they must be traced by our future brothers. Therefore, we must leave a solid, indestructible path so that their journey is fixed."

"Our future will not come easy. It will take a strong brotherhood to create a path that will be easy for others to follow. This is our goal. We have come from nothing to become an Alpha Sig Brotherhood. We will now strengthen our brotherhood by planning our imprints collectively, so they will not be scattered and untraceable. Our collective imprints will remain on this beach forever; and others will follow them respectfully without mistake. This will ensure that our Alpha Sig intentions go on throughout ETERNITY!"

Alumni Communications/ Activities

The theme of the 1984 National Convention, "The Phoenix For Life," has set the stage for improved and revitalized alumni involvement in Alpha Sigma Phi.

New Headquarters Newsletter Service. The 1984 National Convention took two steps to improve communications between chapters and alumni. First, the Convention increased the number of required newsletters that a chapter must produce from two to three per year. Second, and most important, the delegates approved the establishment of a new National Headquarters Newsletter Service. The new service produces finished newsletters from rough copy that chapters submit. The service types, lays out, prints, stamps, and mails the newsletter. It also collects alumni news—the most important aspect of any chapter newsletter. Some chapters pay for the service out of their annual budget, others will be asking alumni to financially support the new and improved communication they will now have with their pledge brothers and other alumni. This dramatic increase in communication has been an expressed desire by many alumni for years. The Fraternity looks forward to great success with this new project.

Activities. How can I get involved? There are four big ways you can celebrate "The Phoenix For Life."



All it takes to schedule a few alumni outings or even to start an Alumni Council is the interest and attention of one person—it could be you! Are you interested? Great! National Headquarters can supply you with printouts, mailing labels, a manual to get you started, and even a mailing service.

As a Province or National Officer. The devotion that many Alpha Sig alumni have to the "Old Gal" at the national and province level is what keeps her great. Every province needs more alumni



Rituals/

Reasons For Being

Rituals. The Summer 1983 National Educational Conference saw the distribution of newly printed ritual books for the first time in thirty years. These newly printed editions underscore the Fraternity's dedication to keeping the importance of the ritual as a high priority. New "public" ceremonies were added to the rituals and chapters are at their option to perform them. There are ceremonies for graduating seniors, for brothers getting married, for births or adoptions, for special "milestones," and for memorializing brothers who enter Omega Chapter. Most important, of course, is how our rituals are exemplified by chapters and alumni according to Our Reasons For Being.

To foster education and encourage high scholarship. The Fraternity's volunteer Director of Scholarship is **Dr. Dennis R. Parks, Baldwin-Wallace '72**, who is Director of Capital University's Cleveland, Ohio Center. Dr. Parks has written a special scholarship guide which will be mailed personally to every new Alpha Sig pledge beginning with the spring 1985 term. Brother Parks is also developing more resource materials for chapter Scholarship Directors to use in helping members achieve their fullest scholarly potential.

Unfortunately, university secrecy policies regarding students' grades make it impossible to rate how well Alpha Sig chapters fare against other chapters on every campus. Some campuses still do provide that information and we know that a number of Alpha Sig chapters are #1 at those schools.

The Fraternity's volunteer Director of Career Development is **G. Alan Sternbergh, Westminster '48**, who also serves in that capacity for Westminster College. Brother Sternbergh provides resource materials to help undergraduate brothers decide upon a career and to successfully find the job they want.

To maintain charity. 1983-84 has been a phenomenal year for chapter service and philanthropy events. Upsilon Chapter at Penn State raised over \$58,000 at its IFC Danceathon to benefit the Four Diamonds Cancer Fund. Delta Theta Chapter at Radford University raised \$4,000 during its March of Dimes "Dime Roll," a 45 mile trek from Radford to Roanoke, Virginia. Thousands more dollars and hundreds of thousands of man hours were donated by Alpha Sig chapters to local and national philanthropies.


The Grand Council of Alpha Sigma Phi


