



## Leadership Conference '85 tops banner year

Over 150 Alpha Sig undergraduate leaders and alumni volunteers participated in the Fraternity's largest ever National Leadership Conference this August held at the Pennsylvania State University from August 8-11.

The conference theme was "Quest For Excellence" and it was kicked off with a presentation by that same title by **Executive Director, Robert M. Sheehan, Jr., Westminster '76**. During the presentation every delegate was given his prime assignment throughout the meeting: to develop his three top goals for his chapter including measurable objectives and specific steps to reach the goal. Attendees were taught how to set goals and objectives, and worked all week on their individual "Action Plans."

Twenty-one alumni volunteers served as faculty during the conference. These brothers led roundrobin workshops and facilitated the small group work sessions designed to promote one-to-one work between alumni and the undergraduate leaders. Workshops given included: Advanced Leadership, Membership Recruitment, Budgeting and Collecting, Solving Apathy, Committee Structures, Alumni Relations, Chapter Retreats, Scholarship, Pledge Education, Chapter Newsletters, Time Management, Service Projects, Alcohol Abuse Prevention, Computers and the Fraternity, Rituals, and IFC Relations.

Special guest speaker Dean Edward King, Director of Residence Life at Bradley University, joined the conference on the first evening, Thursday, August 8th, for his presentation "Fraternity Ritual and Excellence." Dean King's motivational message inspired all who attended to think more carefully about our life's purpose and how well we live up to the standards in our ritual. "A fraternity ritual is meant to be read frequently, and the principles applied to our everyday lives," said King. "All too often we hide our ritual manuals away right after initiation and forget the lofty ideals we were founded upon." King's presentation was rated "superior" by conference evaluations.

Following Dean King's presentation all brothers put on black robes and were given black lanterns for the opening Black Lantern Processional. The march passed various campus landmarks and was concluded at Old Main. There **Grand Marshal Ron Dollens, Purdue '64**, read a dedication to all brothers who had passed into Omega Chapter during the past year.


# Leadership Conference '85

Friday night, after a full day of workshops, the brotherhood gathered in Schwab Auditorium to witness the initiation of Rich Fiorentino, Penn State '85. Brother Fiorentino pledged at Upsilon Chapter in the 1960s, but was called to Vietnam before he could initiate. Because he had remained so active over the years as an alumnus even though he was not a brother, he was the immediate nominee by Upsilon Chapter as the initiate for the conference. Many brothers pointed to the initiation as the highlight of the meeting. "It was a truly moving and inspirational time for me," said Fiorentino, "especially considering that I am older now. The words have real meaning for me." Fiorentino is now Convention Sales Manager for the greater Pittsburgh Convention and Visitors Bureau.

The Saturday evening Final Banquet was held at the Nittany Lion Inn following another day of workshops and an afternoon of free time. The Featured Speaker at the banquet was John F. Johnson, Tufts '60, President of Lamale Associates, one of the nation's leading senior level executive search firms. Brother Johnson gave tips to the audience on what search firms look for in an outstanding applicant, and explained how to become more marketable!

Later in the banquet, Awards Chairman Dr. Robert Gill, Radford '83, presented the Award for Service to Delta Theta Chapter, Radford and Delta Epsilon Chapter, Rio Grande during the banquet, with honorable mentions to Beta

**Epsilon Chapter, Lehigh and Mu Chapter, Washington.** The Tomahawk Award went to Psi Chapter, Oregon State, and The Old Gal Gazette Award was given to Mu Chapter, Washington. The Chapter Newsletter Award was made to Nu Chapter, California-Berkeley, while Alpha Xi Chapter, Illinois Tech, and Psi Chapter, Oregon State both received Honorable Mentions.

The Scholar of the Year Award went to Matthew Kamula, Miami '82, a Pre-Law and Marine Affairs major who also serves as HSP of his chapter. The Friends of Rho Scholarship Award for outstanding academic performance in the Arts was received by Robert Wade, Bowling Green '83 and Friends of Alpha Gamma, Scholarship Award for academic achievement in the Sciences went to Paul Steger, Illinois Tech '85. Scholarship grants were presented to Eugene Hyde, Oregon State '83, and David Kolodge, Lawrence Tech '84.

Grand Senior President Don Morgan, Purdue '57, then made the special presentation of a Grand Senior President's Citation Award to Robert Kutz, California '67. Brother Kutz currently serves Province I as Grand Province Chief and is also Grand Historian. Brother Morgan lauded Brother Kutz's superior efforts in both of his official capacities and in his unofficial capacity of self-appointed expansion disciple for the west coast! Already Kutz's dedication has

paid off with work at Nu Chapter, California-Berkeley and Alpha Zeta Chapter, U.C.L.A.

According to Executive Director Sheehan the overall conference evaluations were outstanding! What one undergraduate wrote seemed to sum up the conference for everyone. "This has been one of the personal highlights of my life. Thank you for such an inspirational learning experience. Alpha Sigma Phi is the greatest."

# Campaign nears \$1 million

Third Founding Endowment Campaign Chairman, **Stan N. Miller, Purdue '63**, announced on November 1 that the campaign had reached the \$975,000 mark towards the goal of \$1 million by December 6th. "With just over 30 days left until our deadline we are very close and should have no problem exceeding the \$1 million goal!" said Miller. "The brotherhood has really gotten behind the 'Old Gal.'"

While a lot of the campaign announcements have focused on the dollar totals and the \$1 million goal, Miller stressed what The Third Founding Endowment will really mean to every chapter and every member. "The prime objective of Alpha Sigma Phi is 'To Better The Man.' We want to develop strong young leaders of impeccable character through the Alpha Sigma Phi experience. This means that every chapter needs to be strong, and that the young men in the chapters have the **guidance** they need to run a quality operation," Miller pointed out.

The Third Founding Endowment will fund expanded leadership training and character development programs that will give that needed **guidance** to our young Alpha Sigs. The key programs that will be supported include:

**The National Leadership Conference.** As the cover story of this issue of *The Tomahawk* points out, this conference brings together the top leaders from every chapter for intensive training and workshops with key alumni volunteers and National Headquarters staff. The conferences stress goal setting, motivation, and ritual. Every year chapter leaders attribute many of their successes to the training they received at the conference.


**Chapter Leadership Consultants.** Every year chapter presidents rank the visitation of their Chapter Leadership Consultant as the most helpful program the National Headquarters provides. A Chapter Leadership Consultant is a recent Alpha Sig graduate who is intensively trained at the National

Headquarters and works full time for a year or two visiting chapters, evaluating, teaching, and motivating them. Only the top graduating leaders are chosen for these positions. The Third Founding Endowment will fund additional consultant positions so that chapter visits can be longer, more frequent, and at the optimum time of the year.

**Regional Province Leadership Weekends.** Annually every one of Alpha Sigma Phi's ten regional provinces holds a leadership weekend or "conclave" at one of the chapters in the province. These mini-leadership conferences reach even more members from each chapter due to the proximity of chapters in the region and provide the same type of leadership training and character development programs as the national conferences. The Third Founding Endowment will fund improvements in these weekends, such as expanding the faculty, supporting the travel and expenses of attendees, and enriching the program with outside professional speakers.

These are but a few of the innovative, effective programs that are really what the \$1 million Third Founding Endowment Campaign is all about. "Simply stated," concludes Miller, "those dollars translate into better men, better citizens, better fathers, better business leaders, and better national and world leaders." □





## Gary A. "Andy" Anderson

**Gary A. Anderson, Westminster '71**, Executive Director of Alpha Sigma Phi from 1976-78 passed into Omega Chapter on October 19, 1985 at the age of 31 after a two and a half year battle with cancer. Brother Anderson is survived by his wife, Debbie, and two sons, Nicholas, 4, and Todd, 2.

Andy, as he was known in school and during his years on the National Headquarters Staff, graduated from Westminster College (PA) in 1974 and was hired by then **Executive Secretary Ralph F. Burns, Ohio Wesleyan '32**, as a Chapter Consultant for the "Old Gal." In 1976 when Burns retired from his position after 40 years of service Andy was tapped by the Grand Council to fill these awesome shoes.

He responded to the challenge enthusiastically. He chose a leadership style and direction for the Fraternity that complimented his great predecessor's, yet readied Alpha Sigma Phi for the 1980s. Many of the directions we now follow are a result of Gary Anderson's initiatives. He, along with then Director of Publications **Evin C. Varner, Presbyterian '58**, rewrote from scratch our membership manual "To Better The Man" and inspired the contemporary design of the Phoenix, which graces so many of our publications. He dreamed of expanded leadership and character building programs. He always believed that Alpha Sigma Phi brothers would come through with funding for those programs, as we have with The Third Founding Endowment. A new and aggressive expansion program was begun under his leadership. The result is a total of 16 chapters that have been started or reactivated since 1977.

There is no way that any article can do

justice to the legacy of love Andy has left with us. One can truly say that he inspired every life he touched. One example of the depth with which he touched lives was evidenced at Andy's funeral.

Over the past two years the Anderson family lived outside of Phoenix, AZ where they attended the Mormon Church and Andy taught third grade at a local public school. **Alfred B. Wise, Baldwin-Wallace '43**, attended the funeral at the Mormon Church and tells us of the incredible outpouring of sympathy there. Many students and parents from Andy's two classes attended, and those parents have started an educational fund for Andy's two sons. "I couldn't believe such a wave of caring for a public school teacher," says Wise, "until I spoke with an official from the school. He told me that the impact that Gary had on those children was unprecedented in his years of experience in education. He said that the children were touched in such a special way that they were compelled to do something extraordinary for Gary." Such was the way that Andy touched so many of us.

Those who have ever had the opportunity to know or meet Andy will miss his enthusiasm for life, his wonderfully positive attitude, his smile, his laugh, and it must be said, his never ending supply of dumb jokes. Even during his final weeks his love for life kept him fighting hard and his positive attitude never let him give up. He continued to inspire those around him with his great attitude in the face of such a great life threatening challenge. He never let his health problems stand in the way of his enjoyment or enthusiasm of life.

Alpha Sigma Phi and her brothers will deeply miss Andy, though we know he will always be with us. Phi, Brother. □



## FRATERNITY INCOME

### 1. Undergraduate Dues & Fees. 61%

All undergraduate pledge fees, initiation fees, and annual chapter dues make up 61% of the Fraternity's income. The undergraduate delegates to the National Conventions have increased the amount of their own fees at every biennial meeting for the past ten years. These increases, which are generally made to keep pace with inflation, along with the steady increase in the number of men joining Alpha Sigma Phi in recent years have continued to provide the "Old Gal" with the majority of our income. The National Headquarters provides programs to help every chapter grow and further improve their membership recruitment. Increased growth is expected for 1985-86.

### 2. Annual Loyalty Fund. 24%

Today's Alpha Sig success story can be credited to our loyal alumni who, in recent years, have dramatically increased their giving to the Annual Loyalty Fund. Alumni have realized that a top quality fraternity needs quality financing to remain successful and improve even more. A full report on the Annual Loyalty Fund appears on page 10. ### 3. Third Founding Endowment & Investments. 12%

The hallmark of Alpha Sigma Phi's continued success in the 1980s and beyond is the completion of our Third Founding Endowment Campaign. For the first time in our history, we will have an endowment that brothers can build on for years to come. As of November 1 over \$975,000 has been pledged towards our goal of raising \$1 million by December 6th. Surely by the time *The Tomahawk* hits the mail we will have exceeded our goal! Have you been a part of this historic effort? If not and you would like to be, see page 3!

The money raised for the Third Founding Endowment is being invested, and the annual income is used to expand the Fraternity's leadership development, educational, and character development programs. These innovative programs make every chapter stronger and give every undergraduate Alpha Sig a more enriched fraternity experience.

Once again Alpha Sig alumni are leading the way for the "Old Gal" with their generous donations to The Third Founding Campaign. While most pledges to the campaign are to be paid off over a five year period, many brothers are paying their entire pledges early. Consequently, nearly \$400,000 has already

been received and is "working" for us now!

The future for the Endowment is bright. The Third Founding Campaign has raised the awareness of many brothers that we need a significant Endowment to maintain our premier fraternity status. ## FRATERNITY EXPENSES

### 1. Chapter Development. 30%

The primary objective of the Fraternity is to help make every chapter stronger and guarantee every young Alpha Sig a quality experience which makes him a "better man." Because of this, the majority of our resources are directed solely towards this aim.

Chapter development programs include: Sending young, highly skilled and trained National Headquarters Chapter Leadership Consultants to visit, evaluate, motivate, and educate every chapter extensively at least once a year. Sponsoring the National Leadership Conference (see page 1) for an intensive four days of leadership training for the officers of every chapter. Providing officer manuals and leadership guides to the chapters. Mailing an individual "Scholarship Guide" to every new Alpha Sig pledge, along with his copy of our pledge manual "To Better The Man." Sponsoring regional leadership training weekends in our ten provinces for all members. Providing a "no cost" chapter alumni newsletter service that types, lays out, prints, and mails newsletters from the National Headquarters for every chapter. In addition, the full time professional brothers on the National Headquarters staff are available every day, whether they are on the road or at the National Headquarters to help chapters solve any emergency problems they may need to call about.

These innovative programs provide chapter leaders and alumni volunteers with the guidance they need to make their chapter stronger. As the Fraternity's income increases this area is the **top priority** to receive more funding. In fact, in 1985-86 funding for Chapter Development programs will be increased by 20%. Chapters annually rate the Chapter Leadership Consultant visitation program as the most helpful of the programs offered. Therefore, two additional Chapter Leadership Consultants have been hired for 1985-86 which will provide more extensive help to all chapters. The province leadership weekends will be expanded, and one day of additional workshops will be added for future National Leadership Conferences.

### 2. Administrative Services. 29%

Administrative services are the necessary, yet unglamorous, expenses any organization has. The 10,000 computer membership record changes we have each year, plus numerous computer services related work takes one person's full time attention. Then there are always bookkeeping, billings, following up accounts receivable, and other financial work our Comptroller handles. Numerous items related to basic operations such as taxes,

insurance, utilities, postage, telephone, auditing, building maintenance, and office supplies also fall into this category. Finally, our all important office management and secretarial support make up the balance of these expenses.

Our lean, hardworking office staff does an excellent job providing all of Alpha Sigma Phi with quality administrative services. Most of these costs are "fixed" and will not increase much while we expand other programs. For example, increasing Chapter Development program funding by 20% in 1985-86, will increase our Administrative Services only marginally. This means that as income continues to increase through donations and chapter growth, the new income can be used directly to help chapters and fund other important programs, rather than simply increase overhead.

### 3. The Tomahawk. 16%

Published first in 1847, *The Tomahawk* is the oldest Greek publication still in existence today. It continues to be sent out quarterly in tabloid form to every brother, and has received top awards for editorial excellence from the College Fraternity Editors Association in every one of the past three years. No other fraternity publication has received more awards.

Costs, particularly for postage, continue to increase far ahead of inflation. For instance, if a bill currently in Congress passes it would increase our postage bill by 150%, and total production costs by 30%.

### 4. Alumni Development. 14%

In recent years Alumni Development resources have been concentrated on mobilizing alumni volunteer and communication programs on behalf of the Third Founding Endowment Campaign. With that project nearly completed, these resources will be redirected in ensuing years. New alumni program plans for the future include: establishing more metropolitan alumni councils, supporting local alumni corporation work, developing programs for young alumni, and encouraging more alumni activities at local chapters.


### 5. Expansion. 2%
