

ΑΣΦ: The College of Character

Over 200 undergraduate leaders, alumni volunteers, and conference faculty leaders met at Bethany College, WV on August 12-16 for Alpha Sigma Phi's largest National Leadership Conference ever. The opening ceremonies included an awe-inspiring Black Lantern Processional over one-quarter mile long with each robed brother carrying his own black lantern.

"Mr. Alpha Sigma Phi" **Ralph F. Burns, Ohio Wesleyan '32**, Executive Secretary Emeritus, delivered the keynote address to the assembled brotherhood on the conference theme: "Alpha Sigma Phi—College of Character." "Alpha Sigma Phi is a college of character at each of your campuses," said Burns. "Your learning experiences through your Fraternity involvement will be as important to you in life as your classroom learning. The University will teach you economics, physics, literature, and other academic subjects. In the Fraternity you learn leadership, brotherhood, character."

And so the 1987 "College of Character" National Leadership Conference was off to a great start. The following four days would see over 35 educational sessions offered by alumni volunteer faculty and by nationally recognized outside speakers. Various programs were offered for nearly fifteen hours each day. And of course, great friendships were made by brothers from different chapters coast to coast.

Major educational sessions led by nationally recognized speakers were held on **Alcohol**

Abuse Prevention (see page 3), **Legal Liability, Leadership Development, Human Dignity & Sexual Responsibility, Scholarship, Ritual Exemplification, Men's Health Issues & AIDS** (see page 2), and **Membership Recruitment**. Smaller workshops were presented over the four days on topics including Financial Management, Career Development, Time Management, Curing Apathy, Service Projects, Creativity, Stress Management, Positive Thinking, and more.

Friday evening was the highlight of the conference for **Eric Kirleis**. Brother Kirleis pledged into Alpha Sigma Phi at Beta Epsilon Chapter, Lehigh University in the spring of 1985 and transferred to Plattsburgh State University in New York the next fall. Since that time, he has spearheaded the formation of Phi Epsilon Colony at Plattsburgh. In recognition of his outstanding leadership, the still "pledge" Kirleis was initiated into the Mystic Circle by a team of National Leadership Conference attendees, while the rest of the conference delegation looked on. Ceremonies were held in the campus's Waites Theatre, one of the only facilities there large enough to hold such an event.

Four busloads of brothers left Bethany Saturday evening for the conference's final Banquet held in nearby Pittsburgh, PA at the

Pittsburgh Hilton. After enjoying a reception with area alumni and a fine dinner, the festivities began.

Grand Senior President **Robert A. Sandercox, Bethany '51** started the program with what seemed to be an impromptu interview with Executive Secretary Emeritus, **Ralph F. Burns, Ohio Wesleyan '32**. Brother Sandercox wanted Brother Burns to tell the brotherhood about *his first* national meeting, exactly fifty years ago. Brother Burns reminisced for a bit about the 1937 meeting and concluded by explaining that at the close of that convention in Chicago, he boarded a train for Cleveland and was married the next day!

In fact, he and his wife Ann were to celebrate their fiftieth Wedding Anniversary in just a few



weeks. Unbeknownst to Brother Burns, plans had been made to fly Ann into Pittsburgh for the Banquet for a surprise anniversary celebration. Unfortunately, her flight was cancelled, and no alternative transportation was available. However, the Hilton arranged a special telephone hook-up which allowed Ann to hear Ralph's reminiscences. It also allowed the well practiced conference chorus to sing an acappella version of "The Alpha Sig Sweetheart Song" to Ann, after which there were few dry eyes in the house. A special anniversary cake was unveiled, and Brother Sandercox proclaimed that the Burnses would receive a "honeymoon" weekend from the Fraternity at the Hilton anytime in the future they choose.

The featured speaker at the Banquet was **John J. MacDonald, Lehigh '49**, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of International Nutrition & Genetics Corporation, and former President of General Motors Insurance Company. Following Brother MacDonald's inspirational speech (see page 3), the Fraternity's annual awards were presented. **Chapter Awards** were given for: **Service** to Beta Delta, Marshall University and Delta Theta, Radford University; **Philanthropy** to Upsilon Chapter, Pennsylvania State University; **The Tomahawk** to Gamma Rho, Lycoming College;

Newsletter to Delta Iota, Longwood; and the new **Gary A. Anderson Award** for pledge education program excellence went to Iota, Cornell University. **Grant-In-Aid** scholarships went to **Robert Kirby, Illinois, '85** and **Robert E. Gaus, Slippery Rock '85**. The **Friends of Rho** scholarship for achievement in the arts went to **John V. Kim, Illinois, '86** and the **Friends of Alpha Gamma** scholarship for achievement in the sciences went to **John E. Bostic, Rio Grande '86**. The **Scholar of the Year Award** went to **David Ka Leedy, Indiana '86**. The **Frank F. Hargear Award** for the outstanding undergraduate of the year went to **Steven V. Zizzo, Illinois '84**. Two special **Grand Senior President's Citations** for outstanding alumni volunteer service went to **Robert G. Cabello, Eastern Michigan '70** and **John H. Luckenbill, Stockton State '84**.

Focus on AIDS

"Educating the public is the first step in addressing the AIDS crisis," Brother **C. Everett Koop, Dartmouth '34**, U.S. Surgeon General, has said in many public forums. This is why it is difficult, these days, to read a magazine or newspaper which does not contain an AIDS related story in which Brother Koop may be quoted.

AIDS education is important for Alpha Sigma Phi members. "There exists a great lack of information, and a lot of misinformation, in many Alpha Sig chapters today concerning sexually transmitted diseases and other men's health issues," says Director of Chapter Services **Randall S. Lewis, Oregon State '81**. "This is surprising when you consider all the information available today on these issues. But a lot of guys are embarrassed that they don't know, and so don't ask."

A major educational session on "Men's Sexual Health Issues" was presented to all attendees at the 1987 National Leadership Conference by **Christine Lyman, Health**

Educator at the University of Pennsylvania. Ms. Lyman is a member of the American College Health Association AIDS Task Force. "Her session was one of the highest rated of the conference," says Lewis. "You always wonder how a room of 160 college men will respond to a topic like this. But, you could hear a pin drop in that room, they were so attentive." One undergraduate evaluation commented: "Thank you for having the insight and courage to choose a topic that is so critically important to us students of the '80s."



MacDonald on "Business Ethics"

As a student, **John J. MacDonald, Lehigh '49** was a role model for his fellow Alpha Sig brothers. He graduated first in his class at Lehigh in 1951, and was a member of six national scholastic honor societies including Phi Beta Kappa.

Throughout his professional career, Brother MacDonald has continued to serve as a role model for all Alpha Sigs. For thirty-five years he worked as an executive with General Motors, including ten years as President of General Motors Insurance Company. Now retired from General Motors, Brother MacDonald has started a new company, International Nutrition & Genetics Corporation. He has been actively involved as a volunteer with many service and educational organizations.

Brother MacDonald's professional experience and high personal ideals made him the perfect speaker on "Business Ethics." His advice: "Know yourself. Think about and determine your own values. Secondly, don't confuse corporate loyalty with conformity. Blind conformity should never be rationalized as loyalty. Finally, understand that the corporate world is merely a specialized part of the bigger picture of life. It is not a separate world in which different values apply."




It makes sense.

The chapters of Alpha Sigma Phi which, year in and year out, are the most stable and successful are the chapters which have a strong, consistent group of local volunteer alumni advising them.

"We all know that a chapter must operate as a business as well as a brotherhood," says Executive Director **Robert M. Sheehan, Jr., Westminster '76,** "How many businesses do you know of which could survive with a 100% turnover in corporate officers, and a 100% turnover in all workers every four years? Probably few to none. Yet that is the challenge each of our chapters face. And the *only way* they can operate successfully is by having volunteer alumni advisors on the spot to provide continuity. They help with officer training and transitions, pledge education, and are available for guidance. They do not *run* the chapter. They *do* provide a consistent, informed resource to help the undergraduates meet the challenges of achieving excellence in chapter operations."

Despite the long known importance of these volunteer alumni advisors, Alpha Sigma Phi has not had any sort of large scale support programs for volunteer alumni. Until now. "The Strategic Planning Task Force we convened earlier in the year (see page 10) identified 'volunteer alumni support programs'



as Alpha Sigma Phi's top need," says Grand Senior President, **Robert A. Sandercox, Bethany '51,** "So, we put together a workshop for these advisors which ran over the weekend concurrently with the National Leadership program, from Friday lunch to Sunday lunch, and included sessions covering Legal Liability, Fund-Raising, Standards of Chapter Excellence, Ideal Alumni Corporation Operations, Ritual, Recruiting Volunteers and Roundtable discussions.

The new workshop was a grand success. "Just having everyone together to share ideas is so helpful—and very motivational," said one alumnus. "We are all ready to start the school year with renewed enthusiasm." Funding for future workshops has yet to be determined, and will likely depend upon alumni contributions to the Educational Foundation's Annual Loyalty Fund.

As an All-American collegiate linebacker, Mike Green's tryout for the Philadelphia Eagles was very promising. "But alcohol robbed me of that opportunity," Green tells student groups all across America these days. "It cost me my marriage and my health. I am an alcoholic. This is the impassioned message that Mike Green, now President of Collegiate Consultants on Drugs & Alcohol, delivered to brothers at the 1987 National Leadership Conference. He is a member of Theta Chi Fraternity, and has been where many students are today. This is why his message is so compelling. Today he is a nationally recognized speaker, and is a return presenter from the 1986 conference. His message has been so well received that five different chapters have paid to bring him in to speak to their entire membership. Alcohol abuse is a major problem for all of society today. If Mike Green's message is heard well, Alpha Sigma Phi may be helping to solve the problem.

Warren L. Hanna: Attorney, Author, Historian


Warren L. Hanna, Minnesota '18, entered the Omega Chapter on September 28, 1987 at the age of 89. He was a life-long member of the San Francisco Bay Area Alumni Council, and often boasted that he had not missed a Founder's Day Banquet since the 1930s. In 1983, Alpha Sigma Phi recognized Brother Hanna for his many professional accomplishments with our highest honor, The Distinguished Merit Award.

A graduate of the University of North Dakota, Brother Hanna went on to law school and completed a master in business administration degree at the University of Minnesota where he joined Rho Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi. His roommate was a young medical student, Owen Wangensteen, Minnesota '17, who went on to chair the department of surgery at Minnesota and was internationally renowned as a surgeon. "We two roommates have done pretty well for ourselves," said Hanna upon receiving the Distinguished Merit Award. Wangensteen had received the same award in 1962.

Brother Hanna founded the law firm now known as Hanna, Brophy, MacLean, McAleer, and Jensen, which specializes in insurance law and today represents many of America's top corporations. It is the leading law firm of its kind in the State of California, with nine locations and 70 attorneys. Until his retirement in 1983, he was considered the top attorney in California on Workmen's Compensation and Insurance law. For thirty years he edited the three annual publications reviewing Attorney General's Opinions, Compensation Cases, and Compensation Laws used by attorneys and judges across the state. He remains a respected legal authority as he lives on through these and other important legal references he has written.

His insatiable curiosity, combined with his writing talent, led to publication of other books outside of the legal field. Travelers to Glacier National Park will find that the most popular books in the park store are authored by Warren L. Hanna. His love affair with the park began during his college years when he served as a travel guide there. His continued interest helped him produce books entitled *Montana's Many Splendored Glacierland*, *The Grizzlies of Glacier*, and *The Life and Times of James Willard Schultz*.

An avid historian, Brother Hanna amassed one of the largest collections of original material on Sir Francis Drake. His book, *Lost Harbor: The Controversy Over Drake's California Anchorage*, received national acclaim in

the historical community. He later donated his personal Drake collection to the Bancroft Library.

Brother Hanna gave back to the organizations which helped him form his roots, and sustain him through his lifetime. He has been a generous supporter of the University of North Dakota Foundation, and served as the Foundation's President in 1979. In 1984, he accepted the challenge to help create The Third Founding Endowment for the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation. He donated \$50,000 to the campaign, and a plaque memorializing his gift is on display at the National Headquarters.

The program from his memorial service provides a fitting conclusion: "Warren L. Hanna was unique. He left a legacy of love and compassion to all who had the opportunity to be touched by his life. He will be missed."



Omega Claims two Undergraduates in 1987

The 1986-87 academic year saw the loss of the lives of two undergraduate brothers. Mark A. Woodrum, Marshall '84 died November 25, 1986 and Jeffrey B. Hunter, Marietta '85 died July 18, 1987, both in automobile accidents.

Brother Woodrum was on his way home for Thanksgiving when his vehicle was struck on Interstate 64. He was marshal of the chapter at the time. Brother Hunter apparently fell asleep at the wheel, also on Interstate 64, and although he was wearing his seatbelt, was pronounced dead at the scene. He was defensive back for the Marietta football team and appeared in several theater productions at the college.

These undergraduate brothers who entered the Omega Chapter were honored at the National Leadership Conference by the Memorial Service Ritual. Dave Dapko, Penn State '85, Rob Kirby, Illinois '85, Brian Lillie, UCLA '86 and Steve Zizzo, Illinois '84 performed this fitting tribute with over 160 brothers in attendance.

Following the service brothers marched from the hall silently for the Black Lantern Processional which ended in the formation of the Omega to honor Brothers Woodrum and Hunter.




Alpha Sigma Phi continued to build upon our 141 year-old success story during 1986-87. The fraternity movement continues to grow stronger across the country, and Alpha Sigma Phi continues to be a leader in that growth. A new chapter and a new colony were added to our rolls during the year. Five colonies—as many as we have had at one time in our history—are now working towards full chapter status. Perhaps the highlight of the year was the 1987 National Leadership Conference. The record-setting attendance and quality level of programs, speakers, and undergraduate leaders created a wave of enthusiasm we hope will carry on throughout the academic year. The new Alumni Workshop for alumni volunteer advisors, which along with the leadership conference is reported on elsewhere in this issue (see pages 1-3), was a tremendous hit and hopefully can be continued in the future.

A "Special Report" (see page 10) on Alpha Sigma Phi's future is included with this year's Annual Report. As is the case so often, our greatest challenges are financially related. Please read on for more details about Alpha Sig Chapters, Expansion, Finance, Educational Foundation, and National Headquarters Operations. And thank you for your interest and support. Alpha Sig alumni make Alpha Sigma Phi America's premier fraternity.

Chapters. The number of chartered chapters remained at 52 during 1986-87 as we welcomed Delta Mu Chapter, William Paterson College, into the Mystic Circle on December 13, but had to announce the closing of Delta Kappa Chapter, Francis Marion College, due to low membership. There was a slight decline in the number of men pledged and initiated into the Fraternity of 7% and 5% respectively. Of course this is compared to last year's

record increases. Expectations for 1987-88 project increases in both categories of ten percent. The average size of our chapters remained at 43 for the year. This is unchanged from 1985-86, but is a 15% increase over the past five years. Please see the accompanying chart for specific membership statistics for each chapter.

While numbers are important to track for a statistical measure of our chapters' health, no statistic we know of can actually measure the health of the **brotherhood** in each chapter. Of course, each chapter is unique, but our observations from chapter visits tell us that the quality of our membership continues to improve. Most chapters boast many campus leaders, and are assets to the campuses and communities in which they are located. Visit a chapter near you soon to see for yourself!

Expansion. Phi Eta Colony, Illinois State University, was welcomed into Alpha Sigma Phi on April 4 and is quickly working towards chapter status. Phi Zeta Colony, Lock Haven University, has received approval for chartering by the Grand Council and will be welcomed into the Mystic Circle on November 21 with 45 new members. Phi Epsilon Colony, Plattsburgh State University, has planned to petition for an early spring chartering. Reactivations are underway at the University of Iowa, Alpha Beta Colony, and Tufts University, Beta Iota Colony. Both groups are working hard to increase membership, and petition for a charter.

Alpha Sigma Phi continues to be interested in quality growth, adding strong chapters at our country's top colleges and universities. Our five colonies are the most we have had at one time in our history. No concrete plans for expansion

in 1987-88 now exist. But, the current colonies will become new strong chapters soon and we will be ripe for more growth.

Finance. Following two years of small surplus budget results, 1986-87 showed a deficit of \$13,000. However, a balanced budget has been set for 1987-88. Financial challenges continue to stand in the way of plans for new alumni and undergraduate services (see "Special Report," page 10). An expanded role for the Alpha Sigma Phi






Annual Loyalty Fund Net Proceeds

Fraternity Finances 1986-87



Educational Foundation over the past few years through growth in alumni donations has greatly helped our financial picture. Hopefully, this growth will continue. Undergraduate fees have been increased, by undergraduate delegates themselves, at each of the biennial national conventions over the past ten years. But, these fee increases barely meet basic annual budget cost increases. Chapters have also been burdened during the past two years with the skyrocketing costs of liability insurance which annually costs each undergraduate member over fifty dollars.

Educational Foundation. Payments on pledges made to the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation's successful Third Founding Endowment Campaign are still coming in as the Endowment now has reached nearly \$600,000. Investment income from the Endowment now supports many important Alpha Sig educational programs. Many brothers plan to help the Endowment grow even more by making the Educational Foundation a beneficiary in their wills, life insurance policies, and trusts.

Generous gifts to the Educational Foundation's Annual Loyalty Fund produced a six percent increase for 1986-87. A full report and listing of donors appears on pages 11-24 of this issue of The Tomahawk. Gifts to The Annual Loyalty Fund directly support the National Leadership Conference, Alumni Workshop, Chapter Leadership Consultant program, and other educational programs. A top goal this year is to increase the number of brothers in the Grand

Senior President's Club making annual gifts of \$1,000 or more.

National Headquarters Operations. For nearly 40 years, the Fraternity-owned offices at 24 West William Street in Delaware, Ohio have served as the National Headquarters for Alpha Sigma Phi. While the address has not changed, the operations have. A major improvement in efficiency was made during 1986-87 with the addition of a new computer system. The new personal computer network system allows the headquarters staff to track our nearly 50,000 members through thousands of address changes per year. The system now meets all the Fraternity's computing needs in-house. Formerly an outside computer service bureau provided for most of those needs. Lost track of a classmate? Write or call the National Headquarters for help.

We are fortunate to have a professional, dedicated executive and administrative staff taking care of the daily operations at the headquarters. An exceptional addition was made to the staff this summer as **Randall S. Lewis, Oregon State '81**, was named Director of Chapter Services. Formerly he had served two years on the staff as Chapter Leadership Consultant and Associate Director of Chapter Development. Brother Lewis is responsible for all undergraduate services and educational programs. The addition of this position will allow Executive Director Sheehan to focus more time on the expanding role of the Educational Foundation.

The Annual Report

The Future of "The College of Character"

Executive Secretary Emeritus **Ralph F. Burns, Ohio Wesleyan '32**, painted a mental image of Alpha Sigma Phi as a "College of Character" during his keynote address at the 1987 National Leadership Conference. "Your learning experiences through your Fraternity involvement will be as important to you in life as your classroom learning," Brother Burns told the delegates. "The university will teach you economics, physics, literature, and other academic subjects. In the Fraternity you learn leadership, brotherhood, character."

Building character in young men has been the central purpose of Alpha Sigma Phi since our 1845 founding. Alpha Sigma Phi's purposes and ideals have *never* changed, and are simply expressed in our motto "To Better The Man." However, today's world is *constantly* changing and Alpha Sigma Phi is challenged to carry out our goals with innovative programs matching today's student needs.

As reported in the spring 1987 issue of *The Tomahawk*, a Strategic Planning Task Force of twenty-two volunteer alumni and undergraduate leaders was convened by The Grand Council last January to help determine student needs and recommend new program ideas. The top two objectives set by the Task Force were:

1. To develop and implement programs to recruit, train, motivate, and provide support to alumni volunteers; particularly at the local chapter level.
2. To expand the leadership training and character development educational opportunities for undergraduate members.

The Grand Council and National Headquarters Staff have further developed these objectives utilizing recommended new program ideas from the Task Force. These ideas have been segregated into Volunteer Development Programs and Undergraduate Educational Programs.

Volunteer Development Programs

Guidance for undergraduate chapter officers and members from volunteer alumni advisors is critical to a chapter's long term success. Proper guidance can insure healthy officer transitions, help create a positive chapter character development atmosphere, and improve overall operational stability. Quality volunteer alumni advisors are the key to the long term excellence of a chapter. New programs planned for the future include:

1. **Alumni Advisors Conference.** Local alumni corporation board members, Grand Chapter Advisors, Faculty Advisors, and other alumni volunteers would increase their effectiveness with opportunities for training and sharing ideas at this new annual conference. Costs would include

travel, meals, lodging, program materials and development. **Annual Cost: \$25,000.**

2. **National Director of Alumni Programs.** The alumni advisor network of Alpha Sigma Phi extends to 57 different campuses and includes over 500 volunteer brothers. Yet, the National Headquarters is not staffed to direct programs for the recruitment, training, motivation, and support of these volunteers. Adding this staff position on would increase each volunteer's effectiveness. Cost would include travel, salary, benefits, and program expenses. **Annual Cost: \$35,000.**

Undergraduate Educational Programs

Structured educational programs for undergraduate members and leaders at national and regional conferences, and during on-site visits by the Fraternity's National Headquarters Staff provide students with direct training in character development and leadership skills. Annual graduations and the constant turnover of chapter officers require ongoing educational programs to maintain quality chapter operations. New programs planned for the future include:

1. **National Leadership Conference.** Since 1963 the Fraternity has been sponsoring national conferences to train undergraduate leaders. These four-day conferences are now held annually at a college campus setting. Alumni volunteers and paid professional speakers serve as faculty on topics such as Management By Objectives, Motivation Skills, Time Management, Alcohol Abuse Prevention, Scholarship, Membership Recruitment, Financial Management, Ritual Exemplification, and more. Attendees highly rank the value of the conference. Currently, however, funds have only been available to support the travel and attendance of one leader per chapter. Additional funds are needed to further enhance the programs and send more leaders per chapter. **Annual Cost: \$25,000.**
2. **Chapter Leadership Consultants.** Every year the top graduating leaders from Alpha Sigma Phi chapters are recruited to serve one or two year terms in these National Headquarters staff positions making on-site visits to chapters all across the country. These "role models" spend 90% of their time traveling to chapters and colonies all across the country for three to five day periods to do officer training, goal setting, and run workshops on topics ranging from Alumni Affairs to Community Relations, depending on the chapter's needs. Every year chapter leaders rank this program the

Fraternity's most effective. Unfortunately, funding for only two of these positions exists and visits are often not able to be made at the most appropriate time, for a long enough time, or frequently enough. The addition of two more staff positions would greatly improve effectiveness. Costs would include travel, salary, benefits, and program development. **Annual Cost: \$50,000.**

The Future

"These new programs are our visions for the future," says Grand Senior President **Robert A. Sandercox, Bethany '51**. "I am particularly enthusiastic about our plans for the alumni volunteer support programs. We have so many alumni brothers giving time to our chapters and asking for guidance to do their jobs better. It's time we provided more support for these volunteers."

How soon will these plans be implemented? Where will the funding come from to meet these goals? Good questions. The plans will be implemented just as soon as they are funded. Undergraduate members continue to vote themselves regular fee increases at biennial national conventions just to maintain pace with current expenses. Just as today's major college or university cannot rely on student tuition alone, the Alpha Sigma Phi "College of Character" also requires alumni giving to meet its goals.

Quality programs require quality funding. The Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation can provide that quality funding with **tax-deductible** gifts from alumni brothers. "Thousands of alumni brothers generously support the Educational Foundation every year with their gifts to the Annual Loyalty Fund or the Endowment," says **Dr. Robert E. Miller, Connecticut '49**, Chairman of the Educational Foundation Board of Trustees. "We intend to encourage increased generosity from the brotherhood in order that these exciting new programs may be funded. We need every brother to do his best for the "Old Gal."

The Alpha Sigma Phi "College of Character" continues to provide quality educational experiences for thousands of young brothers every year. As these young men participate in our "laboratory of life" they develop leadership skills through practical experiences of responsibility in chapter leadership and membership positions. This results in many alumni feeling that they have learned more from their Fraternity experience than the classroom. As the funding needs and future goals of Alpha Sigma Phi are met, the value of that experience will continue to grow. □

Annual Loyalty Fund Gifts Support Leadership and Character Development

Tax-deductible alumni gifts to the Annual Loyalty Fund of the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation support many of the programs critical to the continued success of Alpha Sigma Phi. These include publication of *The Tomahawk*, the new annual Alumni Workshop, chapter visitations by Chapter Leadership Consultants, the National Leadership Conference, regional Province Leadership Conferences, and a variety of educational manuals and materials.

"Our goal is to provide every Alpha Sig with the best, most educational, fraternity experience possible and to remain as one of America's premier national fraternities" says Executive Director, **Robert M. Sheehen, Jr., Westminster '76**. "To meet this goal we need inspired leadership, which the Grand Council provides. We need innovative educational programs, which the staff works hard to develop. And, we need the funding to implement the programs."

Alpha Sigma Phi alumni continue to respond to the financial challenge of operating a major American higher education institution. The 1986-87 Annual Loyalty Fund broke another record for giving as proceeds increased by 6% to \$96,165. This is the fifth year in a row that net proceeds from the Annual Loyalty Fund have increased.

The 1987-88 Annual Loyalty Fund goals have been set high. Basic cost increases along with the plans for continuing the new Alumni Workshop and expanding other programs (see page 10) call for a 20% increase in donation proceeds. The key to meeting the goal will be the Annual Loyalty Fund's Leadership Clubs, which include gifts made at these levels:
