

### **New Charters at** Plattsburgh, and **Illinois State**

Two new chapters have been added to Alpha Sigma Phi's roster: Delta Xi at Plattsburgh and Delta Omicron at Illinois State. Although each chapter has its own story, both were started by men who had affiliations with other chapters before, then transferred.

Delta Xi Chapter which makes its home at the State University of New York at Plattsburgh was started by Eric Kirleis, Plattsburgh '88 who pledged the Beta Epsilon Chapter at Lehigh in Spring 1985 then transferred to Plattsburgh. After seeing the existing Greek system and talking with his new friends they decided to start what on April 26, 1986 became Phi Epsilon Colony.

Starting what ended up a two year journey required a strong determination and brotherhood by the 23 Founding Fathers. Having initial difficulty with recognition from the Greek Council only made the group more determined to excel. Excel they did; they became the fastest growing fraternity on campus, concentrating on service and scholarship which helped them receive many accolades from the faculty and administration.

March 26, 1988 marked the end of the first leg of the journey. Charles Vohs, Penn State '75, Grand Counciler presented Eric Kirleis (who was initiated at the National Leadership Conference at Bethany College) and Adam Campbell, HSP '88, the charter designating them as Delta Xi Chapter. The Baby Blanket and Alpha Badge were passed from Walt Kramer, HSP, Lock Haven '87 to Brother Campbell to signify the brotherly love passed on to the newest member of the Alpha Sig brotherhood.

Illinois State University in Normal, Illinois is the home of Delta Omicron Chapter which was started by John Kim, Illinois '86 and Grand Province Chief Robert Cabello, Eastern Michigan '70, who serves the university as Assistant Vice President for Student Affairs. After the two brothers met they immediately started forming plans to get Alpha Sigma Phi on campus. After an informational meeting a core group of 12 was formed, adding another 12 men with the assistance of brothers from

Petitioning the Grand Council as the Evin C. Varner Society, the group was colonized as Phi Eta Colony on April 4, 1987. They also at that time finalized plans to lease a house in which 16 members could live. This was a big step for the colony, but very rewarding as they have common meeting space and continue to lease the house for the 1988–89 school year.

Eta Chapter at the University of Illinois.

Brothers from Illinois, Illinois Institute of Technology and Iowa State helped initiate the new brothers into the Mystic Circle at the University Student Center. Brother Robert Denny, American '49 was also present as he, Kim and Cabello became affiliates of Delta Omicron.

The chartering banquet which took place
April 9, 1988 was a spectacular event. The
newly initiated brothers and their dates were
very excited as the goal they had been working
toward was to be fulfilled shortly. Grand Senior
President, Robert A. Sandercox, Bethany '51
gave the chapter four points to consider:
Commitment, Cooperation, Caring and
Community. "My brothers," Sandercox said,
"forever we have made a commitment to one
another and our great Fraternity. Don't take this
commitment lightly."

Every chartering member was brought to the head table as Brother Sandercox and Executive Director, Robert M. Sheehan, Jr., Westminster 76 presented the charter to officially recognize them as Delta Omicron Chapter. Brother Kim also received from the chapter a replica of the charter, a hardbound copy of the chartering petition and an engraved pen set. Brother Cabello received an engraved silver serving tray as a token of the affection held for him by the chapter.

Both charterings were highly emotional times for these young men who have dedicated so much time and energy into making Alpha Sigma Phi a reality on their campus. Their dedication and enthusiasm toward the "Old Gal" should stand to remind us what a great brotherhood we are a part of!



# Omega claims Wadsworth




