



## AΣΦ Follows "Roadmap To Success"

August 2-6, marked the date for the National Leadership Conference, **Roadmap To Success: Preparing for the 90's**. Held at Indiana University in Bloomington, brothers from across the nation came together to chart the course for the Alpha Sigma Phi of the 90's.

These young men as well as alumni volunteers pursued a vigorous schedule of workshops, ritual events and camaraderie. Their week started Wednesday with a welcome and orientation. After an ice breaker and barbecue at the Gamma Chi House, the host chapter, the brotherhood prepared for the keynote address and Black Lantern Processional. One participant said, "This was the ultimate high of the conference."

The next several days contained hours of tackling important issues in the fraternity world, such as alcohol abuse, risk management, and hazing. Important topics for the future of our fraternity were also discussed, including leadership, membership recruitment, membership education, scholarship, motivation and alumni relations. Being on the "cutting edge" of issues like these keeps Alpha Sigma Phi America's Premier Fraternity!

Other workshops were offered in the areas of creativity, service, public relations, personal development, making a positive impression, life after college, AIDS, living on your own, etc. These were developed to help chapters improve in their operations while also helping the individual members reach their potential in life.

The goal of each conference is to bring the best possible speakers, information and techniques to help our undergraduate leaders and alumni volunteers make a significant difference in their chapters and on their campuses. Often, the speakers we have are later recruited to speak on

campuses under the sponsorship of our chapters there. This has helped greatly with the image and participation of Alpha Sig chapters across the nation.

Friday night saw the initiation of a very special man and long time supporter of Alpha Sigma Phi, **Robert M. Sheehan, Sr.** Brother Sheehan is the father of Brothers **Patrick Sheehan, Westminster '77**, and our Executive Director, **Robert M. Sheehan, Jr., Westminster '76**. The initiation was a complete surprise to our Executive Director as he saw his father and brother walk through the door for the ritual exemplification. The ritual team was hand picked and directed by **Steven V. Zizzo, Illinois '84**, Director of Development. It was performed with great precision and emotion. Congratulations to our newest Brother Sheehan!

The Final Banquet was held on Saturday evening in the Alumni Hall of the Indiana Union following a reception in the University Club. The featured speaker for the banquet was Executive Vice President of Lambda Chi Alpha International Fraternity, George W. Spasyk. Interfraternity Brother Spasyk spoke on the underlying theme of the conference which was interfraternityism and working together to strengthen America's fraternity system. It is only by joining forces that fraternities will be able to override all of the negative publicity and challenging of our reason for being.

Awards for achievement in the fraternity were also presented during the banquet. Included was the Frank F. Hargear Memorial Award recognizing the top undergraduate brother, given to **John Lyon, Radford '87**. Chapter awards included: Service to **Delta Theta Chapter, Radford** University with **Beta Delta Chapter, Marshall**

University receiving honorable mention; Philanthropy to **Upsilon Chapter, Pennsylvania State University** with **Delta Theta Chapter, Radford** University receiving honorable mention; **Tomahawk to Alpha Mu Chapter, Baldwin-Wallace College**; "Old Gal Gazette" to **Delta Lambda Chapter, Stockton State College**; Chapter Newsletter to **Upsilon Chapter, Pennsylvania State University**; Alumni Newsletter to **Beta Omicron Alumni Association, Tri-State University**. The Gary A. Anderson Memorial Award for outstanding pledge education program was presented to **Gamma Zeta Chapter, Bowling Green State University** with **Phi Chapter, Iowa State University** receiving honorable mention.

Participation awards were given to those chapters who participated in Alpha Sigma Phi's Standards of Excellence Program. Each chapter completed a self-evaluation and set goals for the

## Volunteer Conference Held

For the third consecutive year the Alumni Conference for volunteers of our fraternity gathered in conjunction with our National Leadership Conference. They met August 4-6 to learn more about their roles as advisors, corporation/association officers and volunteers.

The weekend started with a welcoming luncheon and moved right into a risk management session. The beginning of this session announced a new risk management policy for Alpha Sigma Phi as the Grand Council had just voted to join the Fraternity Insurance Purchasing Group (FIPG). Next was a session with the Associate Dean of Students at Indiana University, Dr. Richard McKaig, to discuss their role as volunteers. Dr. McKaig has been very involved with the Greek system at IU and has been an important volunteer in his fraternity, Delta Chi.

Starting Saturday morning, the alumni had a very specialized program to follow. Thomas Devine, a Sigma Alpha Epsilon Brother, presented a program offered by the National Interfraternity Conference for house corporation officers' training. He co-authored, conceptualized and developed the program which is taught in various cities around the country for fraternity

and sorority alumni. The program proved very beneficial and inspirational to many of the volunteers in attendance.

Executive Director **Robert M. Sheehan, Jr.** then spent Sunday morning in an alumni roundtable format where participants' questions could be answered in regard to the fraternity, its services and policies.



Also for each chapter to return to the National meeting next year with at least one more representative than attended this year.

**Province IV:** In addition to the Province Leadership Conference to visit each school in the province.

**Province V:** For each chapter to review the "little sister" program they have keeping in mind that these groups may cause us to lose our single sex status.

**Province VI:** To develop a strong National Fraternity image of excellence. To visit as many chapters in our province as possible and to also visit the Headquarters in Delaware, Ohio. For every province to hold a retreat for the presidents and advisors for each chapter, to have the stronger chapters help the weaker ones and to develop a Province calendar.

**Province VII:** To have 100% participation at each Province Leadership Weekend. Adjust and adapt to the new pre-initiation and alcohol policy. To increase the cumulative GPA of each chapter by .3.

**Province VIII:** To establish or improve the scholarship program and to exceed the all-male and/or all-campus average. Also to pledge an efficient number of men and increase that by 3, increasing the strength of each chapter as well as the National Fraternity.

**Province IX:** To improve, revise and implement programs in the areas of pledge education, social responsibility, philanthropy, dry rush, etc.

**Province X:** To provide better communication of problems that chapters have to other chapters so that they may be able to avoid the same situations.

All of these challenges, if followed, will make Alpha Sigma Phi one of America's strongest fraternities. □



# Risk Management Policies Set

In response to concerns regarding Alcohol Abuse and Hazing, including health and legal liability issues, at its August 3, 1989 meeting the Grand Council passed the following Risk Management Policy which sets new rules regarding the use of alcohol and re-states the Fraternity's strong stand against Hazing.

"The founding principles of Alpha Sigma Phi, beautifully explained in our Ritual, guide us to achievement of our ultimate human potential. This purpose is expressed simply in our open motto "To Better The Man." Unfortunately, chapters may stray from these guiding principles from time to time. It is the responsibility of the Grand Council to uphold the standards of Alpha Sigma Phi. The following policies regarding Hazing and Alcohol have been developed to provide chapters with specific guidance regarding their activities. Members of Alpha Sigma Phi—including, but not limited to, chapter officers, volunteer alumni advisors, and Fraternity Headquarters Staff—are expected to report violations of these policies immediately to the Grand Council through the National Headquarters. Violations of these policies cannot be tolerated, and the Grand Council will take action on each violation discovered."

## Policy on Hazing

*Alpha Sigma Phi was founded upon sacred principles which include the Law of Brotherly Love. The Pledge Education Program a chapter develops should emphasize the development of brotherhood among all members, pledges and brothers alike. Pledge Education is also a time for learning about the Fraternity—its history, traditions, organizations and operation. Chapters that teach all these things to a pledge will be preparing him well for his responsibilities as a brother, and will secure the strength of the chapter into the future.*

*Unfortunately, sometimes a chapter will stray from the true purposes of pledge education and sanction activities which run counter to these purposes. It has therefore become necessary to develop a policy concerning these counter-productive activities, to insure that they are short-lived. The purpose of this policy is to provide for the health and safety of all Alpha Sigma Phi brothers and pledges, to encourage a strong sense of brotherhood within each chapter and colony, and to earn the respect of the campus and community by engaging in activities beneficial to those groups.*

*Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity forbids its chapters and colonies to sponsor any pre-initiation activity that may be "dangerous" or "potentially dangerous" to the physical and mental health of any person, to the level of brotherhood within each of its chapters and colonies, and to the level of respect on campus and in the community of which all Alpha Sigma Phi brothers and pledges are worthy. "Sponsorship" is defined as "peer-group supported," as well as a sanctioned activity.*

# because ALL Fraternities oppose hazing!

Hazing has no place in the fraternity experience.

It is a dangerous form of intimidation that makes a mockery of the whole concept of fraternal love. It does not strengthen bonds of friendship. It does not demonstrate leadership. It does not prove an individual's superior qualifications in any way.

We, the men's general fraternities united in the National Interfraternity Conference, are dedicated and determined to deal with hazing.

We stand united in our affirmation of basic standards of human behavior.

We instill the principles of diligence, honor, integrity, virtue, duty and respect for human dignity.

### Consider these facts:

- *Hazing is a criminal act in more than 30 states yet during the past decade more than 40 students have died in hazing-related tragedies.*
- *College students continue to be crippled and injured every year by ill-conceived and illegal hazing in a variety of student organizations.*
- *Although hazing has been actively discouraged by national fraternities for decades, highly-publicized, isolated incidents consistently diminish or destroy the value of worthwhile, positive and beneficial fraternity activities across the nation.*

### This is what we're doing about it:

- *Hazing—which fraternities define as any action or situation intended to produce mental or physical harassment, embarrassment or ridicule—is ABSOLUTELY FORBIDDEN.*
- *Fraternities which recognize that the best candidates for membership will neither support nor submit to hazing, have long attracted the best members and will continue to do so.*
- *We are developing new and innovative ways to provide positive membership education to our members—not just education for new members, but ongoing personal development programs for members throughout their college career.*
- *Our educational programs, by which we encourage sound moral precepts and the highest standards of constructive social responsibility, are designed to inspire respect for individuals and their personal worth as human beings; they emphasize the negative and degrading impact of hazing on the perpetrators and the group.*

Violation of our standards leads to swift and certain sanctions: ranging from directives to probation to suspension or expulsion—even to revocation of charter and dissolution of chapter. We're serious about hazing and we think you ought to know it.

There is no place in today's fraternities for those who think anyone should demonstrate his worthiness by suffering insult or injury. That's an attitude that now threatens the entire fraternity system. ## Alcohol Policy

Activities engaged in by Alpha Sigma Phi chapters and chapter members should always comply with all state, local, and university rules and regulations, including those regarding alcohol and illegal drug usage. The following policy should be followed by every chapter and chapter member regarding the legal use of alcohol:

1. Alcoholic beverages shall not be purchased through the chapter treasury nor shall the purchase of same for members or guests be undertaken or coordinated by any member in the name of or on behalf of the chapter.

2. If a chapter allows members and guests to "bring their own" alcohol to chapter functions, then:

A. The Chapter is responsible for assuring that the alcohol is consumed legally and responsibly.

B. Alternative beverages (non-alcoholic) shall be provided. These should be set in plain sight, labeled as non-alcoholic.

C. Food of substantial quality shall be made available, free of charge for everyone. (High protein foods, i.e., cheese, meats, unsalted nuts are strongly encouraged.)

D. Rides or escorts shall be provided for those unable to drive or walk themselves home.

3. Alpha Sigma Phi chapters shall not sponsor "open parties" in any form. All parties shall be limited to chapter members and invitees. Capacity of any event should comply with the Fire Safety Codes set by the proper authority.

4. There shall always be two sober party monitors at every event who will be trained to deal with any situations as they arise.

5. Chapters shall not co-sponsor an event with an alcohol distributor, charitable organization or tavern (tavern defined as an establishment generating more than half of annual gross sales from alcohol) where alcohol is given away, sold or otherwise provided to those present.

6. All rush and pledging activities associated with any chapter shall be non-alcoholic. Dry functions.

7. Chapter members shall not permit, tolerate, encourage or participate in "drinking games."

8. Anyone arriving at an Alpha Sigma Phi event already intoxicated shall not be admitted to the function.

9. Chapters shall not co-sponsor or co-finance a function where alcohol is purchased by any of the host chapters, groups or organizations.


## Executive Vice President Search Announced

The search is on for a new chief executive staff officer for Alpha Sigma Phi. Grand Senior President **Edmund A. Hamburger, Polytechnic '45**, and Educational Foundation Chairman, **Dr. Robert E. Miller, Connecticut '49**, have announced that **Robert M. Sheehan, Jr., Westminster '76** will leave his post as Executive Director of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity, Inc. and the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation effective September 1, 1990. The brother selected as a replacement will carry the newly-created title of Executive Vice President of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity and President of the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation.

"In assessing the chief executive's leadership responsibilities we have realized that our expectations are now far greater than they were years ago when we developed the Executive Director title," says Grand Senior President Edmund A. Hamburger, Polytechnic '45. "Therefore we have decided upon a title change which reflects that level of leadership responsibility. We need a brother who will provide the day to day leadership required to direct an important American educational institution."

Grand Senior President Hamburger will chair a search committee to implement the selection of the Executive Vice President/President position. The committee is committed to recruiting and selecting the best possible brother for the job. Salary will be competitive, and commensurate with experience. Ideally the successful candidate will be available to start in mid-June, 1990, allowing for a brief transitional time with Executive Director Sheehan. Responsibilities of the position include:

- To serve as Chief Executive Officer of the Fraternity and Educational Foundation
- To provide the leadership required for the strategic planning and implementation of the programs and services of the National Headquarters
- To direct the National Headquarters staff in conducting the business of Alpha Sigma Phi, including providing services to chapters and to alumni, publishing *The Tomahawk*, directing the fund-raising activities of the Educational Foundation, coordinating national meetings, and developing student educational programming
- To develop and manage the budgeting and

financial operations of the Fraternity and Educational Foundation, including a combined annual budget of over \$500,000, and combined endowment of over \$1,000,000

- To work in partnership with university administrators and interfraternity leaders in developing a positive environment for the fraternity experience on college campuses
- To recommend policy directions and alternatives to the Grand Council and Educational Foundation Trustees, and to make regular progress reports to them

This position provides a great opportunity to make a significant difference in others' lives," says Executive Director Sheehan. "Most alumni say that their fraternity experience is where they learned their most important lessons during college. We teach leadership. We teach how to get along with others. We develop values and character in young men which they hold onto all their lives."


The 1988-89 school year witnessed Alpha Sigma Phi's 143rd year of continuing excellence. The August 1988 National Leadership Conference & Convention at Ohio State was our largest ever, and sparked chapter leaders to carry on successful projects at their local campuses all year long. The Grand Council and National Headquarters Staff is proud to present this year's Annual Report on Alpha Sigma Phi's operation.

**Chapters/Membership.** Two new colonies, now working hard towards attaining chapter status, were added during 1988-89 at SUNY-Buffalo, former site of **Gamma Epsilon Chapter**, and at SUNY-Binghampton. Early in the school year **Beta Iota Chapter**, Tufts University, was re-chartered. The Fraternity is proud to add these new groups to our rolls. Of particular delight is revitalizing chapters which, for one reason or another, have been closed in the past such as Buffalo and Tufts. Late in the school year groups of students at Concord College, former host to **Gamma Phi Chapter**, and at the University of Delaware contacted the National Headquarters with an interest in forming chapters there. We expect each group to be formally colonized during 1989-90 and to begin their work towards chartering. While the number of men initiated into Alpha Sigma Phi declined during 1988-89 from the previous year, this was mostly due to the chartering of three new chapters in 1987-88, which produced a significant one year jump. The number of men pledged to the Fraternity was about the same in 1988-89 as the prior year. Sustained increases in membership have created a 17% increase in the average size of chapters over the past five years. The 1989-90 school year will find Alpha Sigma Phi with our largest undergraduate membership in at least the past twenty-five years.


**National Leadership Conference.** The National Leadership Conference continues to be one of the Fraternity's most important educational programs. The 1988 conference and the 1989 conference held at Indiana University this past August were exceptional successes. A full report on the 1989 conference is included in this issue on pages 1-3. Chapter leaders attending these annual conferences rate them as one of the best personal development experiences they have had in their lives. Just as importantly, these leaders report that the conference helps them develop and implement the goals for their chapter each year. During each of the past three years an



Alumni Volunteer Conference (see page 2) has been held in conjunction with the undergraduate conference. The alumni program helps local advisors and alumni association volunteers learn how to provide more effective guidance to their undergraduate brothers, and how to better operate their alumni organization.

**Finances.** Income and expense allocations for 1988-89 are broken down into percentages, by program category, on page 10. Conservative budgeting and year-end cost-cutting measures instituted by the Grand Council helped maintain a balanced budget, and created a small surplus of \$5,200. Financial challenges seem always to be with the Fraternity as we strive to provide a high level of quality educational programs to chapters and students, all the while dealing with inflationary pressures.


**Alcohol Abuse and Hazing.** Of all the challenges that face Alpha Sigma Phi and the Greek System today, by far the two greatest are the instances of Alcohol Abuse and Hazing found at any time in any

chapter of any fraternity and sorority. These instances of abuse blaspheme our purposes and tarnish our good name. If we do not work hard to meet these challenges, as Alpha Sigs and Greeks together, our system of brotherhood will decay. Alpha Sigma Phi is taking an aggressive approach. First, we have adopted new risk management rules regarding these abuses (see pages 4-5) and have informed chapters that sanctions will be taken for violations. By adopting these policies we have joined with other national fraternities who have identical rules. Today over 75% of all fraternity chapters in America are to be operating under these same rules. Interfraternity cooperation is key to our success. Second, we have stepped up our educational programming efforts at leadership conferences and during chapter visits to drive the message home that Alcohol Abuse and Hazing have no part to play in a proper Alpha Sig experience. Finally, we have again joined with our interfraternity brethren to implement a pro-active public relations campaign, targeted at college and university faculty and administrators, promoting the positive aspects of the Greek System and asking them to join with us in partnership to rid our chapters of abuses.


## Educational Foundation Report

*The importance of the Alpha Sigma Phi Educational Foundation continues to increase as the Fraternity expands its programming and educational services for chapters and undergraduate brothers. The Educational Foundation makes grants to the Fraternity annually, in support of these educational programs, from two principle sources: alumni gifts to the Annual Loyalty Fund and investment income from the Educational Foundation Endowment. Gifts to the Annual Loyalty Fund during 1988-89 declined slightly to \$134,745 from \$136,561 the year before. For a further report on the Annual Loyalty Fund see pages 14-22.*

**The Endowment.** Alumni gifts to the Endowment totaled nearly \$20,000 during 1988-89, as brothers continued paying on their pledges to The Third Founding Endowment Campaign. Most of these pledges have been paid off at this point in time, therefore further growth in the Endowment will have to come from special endowment gifts, bequests or other planned gifts, and investment growth. Over fifty brothers have notified the Educational Foundation that they have made provisions for the Endowment in their wills, trusts, or insurance policies. These brothers are recognized annually in The Tomahawk as members of "The Manigault Society." The current list of brothers appears on page 9 along with information on how to join the society. The Huntington National Bank, Columbus, OH, serves as investment counsel to the Educational Foundation Trustees regarding the Endowment. During 1988-89 the market value of the Endowment grew by 5.4%, and produced dividends of 9.7% on the strength of its investments. The objective of the Trustees is to continue to invest the Endowment responsibly and prudently to produce dollars for annual grants to support fraternity programs and allow the Endowment's market value to grow for future generations.

**Director of Development.** Steven V. Zizzo, Illinois '84, has been hired by the Educational Foundation to serve in the capacity of Director of Development. Steve previously had served the Fraternity as a Chapter Leadership Consultant since January 1988. He will be responsible for developing communications with alumni in an effort to increase support for the Educational Foundation. As the Fraternity continues to develop new services to help chapters improve their educational programming for undergraduate brothers, the need for increasing the output of the Annual Loyalty Fund and the Endowment grows. Brother Zizzo will work with alumni to show how the Educational Foundation can help each chapter improve and help each undergraduate brother have a more rewarding fraternity experience.

## Educational Foundation Trustees

**Chapter Endowment Funds.** The Educational Foundation established a new program during 1988-89 allowing alumni to create special endowment funds for individual chapters. The first of these funds has been created by Robert W. Kutz, California '67, for the benefit of Nu Chapter, California-Berkeley, and Psi Chapter, Oregon State. Under the provisions of the new program an alumnus must make a minimum gift of \$500 to establish the fund for a chapter. After that, any alumnus or friend may add to the endowment with additional contributions of at least \$500. The Educational Foundation Trustees are responsible for investing the funds, and the annual investment income may be used by the chapter to support its own educational programming—including scholarships, attendance at leadership conferences, or bringing in speakers for the chapter's benefit.

The Educational Foundation seeks to support Alpha Sigma Phi's educational mission "To Better The Man." Brothers in our Fraternity undergo dynamic personal development experiences during their years as students. Academic learning is augmented by the Alpha Sig experience which builds character and develops leadership skills.
