WEST VIRGINIA "WALKOUT POLICY"

WHEREAS, the West Virginia University Intrafraternity and Panhellenic Councils recognize and are concerned with damages to (or theft from) a WVU Greek property caused by "walkouts" (chapter and/or associate members) from other universities; and

WHEREAS, we are not only concerned with WVU Greek properties involved, but we are also concerned with the health and safety of our members; and

WHEREAS, we are also concerned with the legal liabilities involved:

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the West Virginia Interfraternity and Panhellenic Council that the following policies be adopted, and that all National Interfraternity Conference fraternities and National Panhellenic Conference sororities at West Virginia University adhere to the same:

- □ Immediate contact to Greek Advisor of visiting fraternity/sorority to inform him/her of allegations
- □ Immediate contact to fraternity/sorority executive director of visiting fraternity/sorority chapter to inform him/her of allegations
- □ Restitution by hosting fraternity/sorority (working with local judicial board) if damages are sustained
- □ Restitution by visiting fraternity/sorority (working in conjunction with Greek Advisor of visiting fraternity/sorority) if damages are sustained

Copies of this policy will be circulated among all WVU chapters, fraternity/sorority headquarters of all WVU chapters, and Greek Advisors whose chapters traditionally "walkout" to WVU.

Everyone had an excellent time as alumni, parents, friends and Tri-Delta Sorority took part in all kinds of activities. We'd like to give a special thanks to the alumni, as well as chairmen Chris "Bake" McBride, Jim "Helmet" Marino, Tom "Rock" Piombino and Todd "Kong" Blodgett for making it such a huge success (by the way, we won 1st place for the window competition). Awards were given out by the Alumni Board. The Albert "Ducky" Jahn Scholarship Award was given to: 1st place - Kurt Johnson and David Pardini, and runners-up, Steve Dotter, Jeff Cardoni, and Nick Walter. The Leon Fencil Service Award, which was awarded to the undergrad brother who does the most for the house outside of the academic realm was awarded to Chuck Resnick.

On October 29, we hosted the Greek Dean's List reception for those in the Greek community with at least a 3.5 GPA. Along the same lines, we have been honored by the Interfraternity Council by receiving an application for the IFC's "Award for Excellence" which is designed to "recognize all chapters which contribute to the positive ideals of being a Greek letter organization. It includes high scholarship, campus involvement and community service." We are one of fourteen chapters (out of 56) at PSU to receive this application which is a great honor in seeing how Alpha Sigma Phi stands in the eyes of the IFC and the University.

November 1 begins BYOB at PSU systemwide which just recently passed. Once again Upsilon has been a pioneer at the University, this time in helping pass this legislation. Alpha Sig President, Kurt Johnson was one of six presidents to draw up the Risk Management Policy for the campus.

The house is in the process of being redone. The capital improvements are mostly being done in the living room with new French doors, carpets, new lighting fixtures and a new fireplace. We are looking forward to showing off the results. As a side note, the pledges will be bolting soon, so don't be surprised to see them at your campus anytime soon. We'll be "bringing out the dead" at our Halloween Date Function on October 25.

We are also continuing our preparation for the largest student-run philanthropy in the nation - DANCE MARATHON. For those who are not familiar with "Thon," it is a 48 hour Dance Marathon from which the proceeds support children with cancer at Hershey Medical Center. Last year we finished on top for the eighth consecutive year with a whopping \$147,931. Combined with the Alpha Sigma Alpha Sorority, we are approaching the \$1 Million mark as a team!

We make various comments about each particular rushee which helps facilitate the complexities of knowing and meeting new rushees.

So far this semester we have been very successful in intramurals. Out of a total of thirty teams (fraternity and off-campus students), Beta Epsilon reached the finals in softball and pulled out an outstanding victory to end up the best softball team at Lehigh. Alpha Sigma Phi is noted to be one of the most successful and competitive teams in all sports at Lehigh.
