




1991 NATIONAL LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE A HUGE SUCCESS!

"A NEW DECADE: Changes * Challenges * Choices" was an appropriate theme given to this year's National Leadership Conference, which was held at historic Pennsylvania State University. This year's event proved to be a premier conference for members of America's Premier Fraternity!

Events throughout the conference focused on the changes that are happening in society, and thus our fraternity, today, the challenges that we face as a result of these changes, and the choices that we must make to meet these challenges and conquer the changes!

- * More committed to individual needs than to community needs.
- * Have neither liberal nor conservative political leanings.
- * Typically, a member of the Class of 1995 will not be politically active.
- * Will be more consumer-oriented than previous classes. (Consumer activism is replacing the political activism of previous generations.)
- * Their most important reasons cited for attending college include:
 - 1) Detailed grasp of a specific field
 - 2) Training and skills for an occupation
 - 3) Learning to get along with other people
 - 4) Formulating values, goals, and a philosophy of life
 - 5) Well-rounded, general education
- * 40% will come from families whose parents have earned a baccalaureate degree or higher.
- * Believe the grades they earn will underrate the quality of course work that they produce.
