Risk Management Corner

Q: I have heard that chapters who now have certain FIPG/risk management violations receive higher liability insurance premiums than before. Is this true?

A: Yes, the system for calculating insurance allocations has been altered to more fairly assess chapters premiums than has been done in the past.

One factor taken into consideration for the new calculations is a chapter's ability to abide by the guidelines as outlined in Alpha Sigma Phi's Risk Management Policies. For example, a chapter having a

reputation for holding safe and lawful social events, rush events, pledging events, etc.. will likely be granted a less expensive premium than a chapter who has failed to abide by the fraternity's risk management guidelines. In fact, a chapter violating any part of the policy can expect at least a 15% increase in their premium this year.

This concept is very similar to automobile insurance. If you get into an accident and are cited for reckless driving, for instance, your auto insurance premium increases. Likewise, if you have a history of a consistently good driving record, some insurance companies may reward you by reducing your premiums.

So, what does all of this really mean? Simply, it means that your chapter can prevent losing money unnecessarily by following Alpha Sigma Phi's Risk Management Policies for your chapter's activities. And besides, these guidelines were adopted to reduce needless risks and increase safety for all brothers and their guests anyway.

As a side note, the final invoice for your chapter's insurance premiums will be mailed to your chapter within the next few weeks.



Idea: Adopt-An-Alum Program

Idea seen in action at: Lambda Chi Alpha Fraternity

Officer/Committee Chairman/Brother responsible for implementing idea: This idea can be the responsibility of the Pledge Educator, and the Alumni Director.

How to implement the idea at your chapter: One of the most common reasons for poor alumni attendance at chapter events is the alumni lose any and all connection with the undergraduate chapter. One way to keep the Brother connected with the chapter after he has graduated is the Adopt-An-Alum program.

The program consists of each pledge being assigned an Alumnus of the chapter to keep in contact with. This can be done through letters, phone calls, and personal visits. The undergraduate brother then continues to be the connection between the chapter and his assigned alum until he himself reaches graduation. The idea is based on a pen pal system that does not end with pledging or even graduation.

Benefits to your chapter: The desired results of this program is to create relationships within the chapter that are not limited to only those brothers that were undergraduates at the same time. The Adopt-An-Alum program will also keep your alumni interested and involved years after they have graduated.
