GENTLEMEN:-

I hereby heartily endorse this application for a Charter from this Fraternity. Knowing personally as I do so many men in our and every Chapter of this Fraternity I felt that it were a useless formality to appoint anyone else than myself as the Committee on Investigation of the personnel of these applicants, and that a report from me would be much more valuable to you than the words of a brother who was a stranger to most of you and entirely so to them.

I knew personally every man whose name is appended to this Petition and can answer him for character, scholarship, social qualities, habits, and those qualities that we highly demand in our men, and finding, wherever they may be, several of these men are classmates with me in Harvard University, and not one of them was admitted to the circle without a unanimous voice to that effect from me and all, and in this choice my own voice was given equal weight. As a result we came in with the very strongest of mutual ties and without cliques, divisions, or personal ambitions, other than a keen rivalry of each man to do his best for the Chapter to be as a whole, and the Fraternity as well.

In looking over this petition you will note that I see of the five departments of Harvard are represented, the Law and Graduate Schools and the College. The other two, the Divinity and the Graduate School of Applied Sciences are both fruitful fields for further expansion but their men are not closely associated with us as yet. This is a matter that will adjust itself in time as it has done in all the other large schools where A.S.P. is represented. The Harvard Medical and Harvard Dental as well as the Harvard Agricultural Schools are all too far away to ever be sources from which to draw membership.

I sincerely hope you will approve this petition immediately, for several of these men upon this petition will be with the Chapter over five years as Active Members, the balance of their school work is unfinished even in the College and three years following in the law school. This insures careful supervision on the part of the very greatly interested Chapter Members. If no delay is occasioned in granting this application I feel certain that we have a brilliant opportunity to close this year with a membership of from 30 and upwards and thus force a success that will enable us to get a house next year and take a prominent position in the Fraternity. It also means three other new Chapters from this membership, at the Universities of Nebraska, Minnesota and Washington.

We, the undersigned, students in good standing in Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts, having herewith attached our individual and class records do hereby petition Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity to grant to us and our successors a Charter for a Chapter of said Fraternity at this institution, and to assign to us the Chapter letter, Beta, which this Chapter formerly had at this place, in accordance with the Constitution, By-Laws, and Lawful Rules and Regulations of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity. We also particularly ask that the Charter issued by Alpha Chapter to Beta Chapter in 1880 be confirmed to us and we be given the benefit of the traditions, history, and institutions of the old Chapter in the Fraternity.

Should this Charter be granted we agree to support the Constitution and By-Laws, Rules and Regulations, Customs, Laws, and Traditions of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity, to perform the rituals, to support equally the Fraternity quarterly in the manner provided in the laws of the Fraternity, and to perform our part in the government and support of the Fraternity as such, and, under its Constitution and By-Laws govern ourselves as a Chapter in harmony and goodfellowship, and that we and our successors shall work for the best interests and advancement of the Fraternity wherever and whenever we may, it being understood that nothing in this pledge shall in any way conflict with our religious or political scruples, or our duties and obligations to our colleges, our family, our selves, our country or our God.
