
Tarkio College is a four year, co-educational, liberal arts college related to the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. It is located in Tarkio, in Northwest Missouri near the point where four states meet. Tarkio is approximately 80 miles southeast of Omaha and 120 miles north of Kansas City.

The College was organized in 1883 by a group of young pioneers-businessmen and farmers-who were graduates of a church-related, liberal arts college, and who wanted such a college for their children. First known as Tarkio Valley College and Normal Institute, the college operated one year as an independent institution. In 1884, the college became affiliated with the United Presbyterian Church, and through the years this relationship has remained strong and its effects have permeated the entire college community.

Tarkio has an enrollment of approximately 700 students representing 32 states and a dozen foreign countries. Students are exposed daily to a highly qualified, challenging faculty. Statistically, there is one faculty member for approximately each nineteen students.

The achievements of Tarkio graduates are indicative of the effectiveness of its academic program. Graduates include many outstanding business executives, educators, ministers, scientist authors, physicians, and surgeons.

The main campus of Tarkio College occupies 65 acres, and with the adjacent property being developed, extends over 390 acres. The facilities include twenty air-conditioned or partially air-conditioned buildings, fourteen of which have been completed since 1951. The contemporary buildings, centered around traditional Rankin Hall, are attractive, modern, and favorably located to facilitate movement of students between classes. The campus plan is pleasingly arranged so that unity and function are integrated with aesthetic considerations of space.

Delta Epsilon Phi was founded in 1962 by eleven men who felt that the friendships formed in college were important in knowing the true meaning of brotherhood. Now Delta has expanded widely and has its own floor and lounge in Koller Hall. The area also has a study room with an upperclassman present to help the men with their work. Delta Epsilon Phi is now striving toward National Affiliation with Delta Upsilon.

Forum Literary Society was founded upon the idea that a student can best contribute to his fellow, his college, and his culture by seeking the development of the whole man. Today Forum remains true to this idea and it serves a double purpose. First, the society is unique in maintaining a full literary program of scholarship and academics. Second, it is social, being an organization which contributes to the campus and community with its emphasis on fellowship, loyalty, and service. Forum Literary Society is now awaiting toward National Affiliation with Sigma Pi.

Phi Gamma Psi. In the Winter Trimester of 1963 fourteen men organized a Greek letter organization which they named Phi Gamma Psi. The goals of this society are dual in nature -- invention and movement. Phi Gamma Psi is also striving toward National Affiliation with Phi Mu Delta.

Psi Lambda Phi is the newest but the most rapidly growing men's society on the Tarkio College campus. Officially recognized in the Fall Trimester of 1965, Psi Lambda Phi has moved ahead with such a spirit of enthusiasm that it ranks well among the top societies on campus.

## History of Alpha Lambda Sigma

The earliest records available, which do date back as far as 1903, show the existence of a men's society called Athenian Literary Society. Notice their initials ALS. With this in mind, it is no wonder that a later offspring organization would use the same initials. In 1939, fifteen men, advised by the honorar Dr. Robert George, organized the Greek letter society Alpha Lamb Sigma.

Originally, Alpha Lambda Sigma was a literary, music, and hobby society with an aim directed toward culture, social, and aesthetic appreciation of the arts. Since it was somewhat of a musical group, a study was made of the various types of music, composers, and methods for writing music. Advancing in motive, Alpha soon extended its emphasis to include principles of conduct which develop leadership, courage, and manhood in addition to its birthright to instill appreciation of the arts.

By 1941, Alpha Lambda Sigma had established a deeply rooted place on the Tarkio College campus, but the later years of World War II cost Alpha dearly. With most of the active members enlisting or being drafted, the organization ceased to function until five veterans and twelve pledges reorganized the society in 1946. Then, by 1947, Alpha Lambda Sigma had reached its highest total membership on record. Forty-five college men proudly displayed Alpha's colors, black and gold.

1957 was the year in which Mr. J. "Horb" McCoy assumed Dr. George's position as fraternity sponsor. Other than this we have had no other records for 1948-1963 due to the 1965 Old Collins Hall fire. Mr. Ed Borowitz joined Mr. McCoy as a co-advisor

in 1965. However duties to the college forced him to retire his position, which was later filled by Mr. Dennis Tracy in 1967.

As Alpha was growing rapidly in every sense of the word, in 1964, Tarkio college initiated a trimester program which once again brought near disaster upon the fraternity. Only six members survived the change, and only two of the six, Dave Angelo and Robert Houser, were strong enough to hold the brotherhood together.

Now, once again, Alpha Lambda Sigma has climbed back into a position of power and prestige. With twenty-six active members six in London, we are a social-service fraternity stressing leadership, scholarship, brotherhood, and individuality.

In 1969, Alpha lost their most newly acquired advisor Mr. Tracy. He was replaced by Dr. Samuel Aven, who is presently our advisor. Dr. Aven's position is being the head of the Department of Education.





