### Rush Committee


- 1) Contact at least thirty (30) possible pledges



The Scholarship Committee is one of the newest and fastest growing Committees in the Phi Gamma Colony. With the inception of the Committee, goals were set forth to meet the best possible academic achievement within our Colony. These goals consist of:

- 1) the promotion of Scholarship within the fraternity.
- 2) a written program for academic achievement.
- 3) the Provision of Scholarship awards for Outstanding Achievement.
- 4) the establishment of an Alpha Sigma Phi Library.

To facilitate these goals, Brothers banded together and formed a tutoring program to improve grades and academic awareness. Along with the tutoring program, a colony library was also established. The library contains an ample supply of books, tests, and term papers from virtually every major offered by our institution. These materials were donated by brothers, and are available at all times. The books are loaned for entire semesters, or on a daily basis. Presently, the library is a little premature, but is improving daily.

The most recent aspect of the Scholarship Program is the awards and recognition being provided for our outstanding academic achievers. Certificates and awards are presented to those brothers who earn the highest grades in our colony. In the future, the Committee plans to have a Scholarship Dinner, where the brothers are honored for their individual improvement. Those brothers who exceed the required 2.0 GPA will be served steak, while those who fail to meet the 2.0 GPA will be served beans and franks. Finally, the Scholarship Committee plans to raise the required GPA from 2.0 to 2.5 by the close of next semester. Those brothers who fail to meet the required GPA will have to show immediate academic improvement by the close of the following semester.

SERVICE CHAIRMAN'S REPORT


As the Service Chairman of the Phi Gamma Colony, I have two main goals that I intend to fulfill by the end of the Spring 84 semester. These goals are:

## FUND RAISING REPORT

This is a brief report of how Alpha Sigma Phi - Phi Gamma Colony at Stockton State College plans to meet the costs to run the fraternity as well as generate the funds needed to become a national chapter. The Fund Raising Chairman is newly appointed Christopher R. White, and serving under him on the committee are Daniel Reed and Arthur Cohen. Our goal is to accumulate at least fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500) by the end of the semester (May 8, 1984). The following are a variety of ideas (some already taking place) that will undoubtedly furnish the financial needs of the fraternity.

We are currently selling M&M candy throughout the campus and so far this has been a success. Each Brother has volunteered to sell as many boxes as possible and when the last "M" has been sold, we will have made over \$100.

Another fund raising activity currently taking place is the sale of raffle tickets by our colony. The main goal is to sell enough tickets in order to pay for our Chartering Banquet which is scheduled for April 14. However, each ticket that is sold after our quota has been met is genuine profit. We believe this will also improve our financial status. For anyone interested in participating in the raffle, please contact Eric Kaplan (President) for details.

scheduled for February 13 & 14 is a Valentine's Day Flower sale by our brothers. A table has been acquired in front of the school store for the sale of flowers to the public. Delivery service will also be used in our flower sale. Each sale will generate approximately 75¢ profit and this also will raise our budget.

Other fund raising ideas currently being looked into are acquiring a Pub in order for dancing and socializing on the weekends (similar to last semester). Selling "Hoagies" to hungry students on week nights is another possibility. We would buy in bulk, make the hoagies ourselves, and sell for a profit. A third idea is that of sponsoring a Billiards tournament in our student game room.

Pool is a popular sport on campus and a tournament could bring profit, recognition, as well as fun to our fraternity.

These are the things the fund raising committee is working on for this semester at Stockton State College. We feel that along with our monthly dues, these projects will enable our fraternity to build a strong budget, character, and the confidence needed in becoming a Chapter.
