From my individual knowledge of the situation I heartily recommend the application of the C. S. C. Fraternity at Massachusetts State Agricultural College to your favorable consideration. There is every reason why we ought to accept this organization as Nu Chapter of this Fraternity.

COLLEGE.

The Massachusetts State Agricultural College was first established as a department of Boston University, but in 1867 the Commonwealth of Massachusetts took it over as a separate institution and in keeping with the policy of this state raised it immediately to the highest college grade, so that today Massachusetts Agricultural College is one of the three Agricultural Colleges in the United States of real collegiate grade and has been such from its very inception. Shakespeare says "A rose by any other name would smell as sweet", and while this institution is not recognized as a University, the collegiate work that it does is of the same high order in its field as that of Harvard, Yale, Cornell, Princeton, Columbia, Johns Hopkins, Chicago, Stanford, and the State Universities. We have demanded that the Institution where Alpha Sigma Phi holds forth shall be of collegiate grade and we are not lowering our standard in the slightest in this institution.

FRATERNITY.

It will be recognized that this Fraternity has been organized since 1879 owns its own house, and an extra lot besides, and has one hundred ninety six alumni members, most of whom will be taken in as members in accordance with our regular rules in such cases, namely that they be elected by the active chapter by unanimous vote and then duly initiated. As the president of Purdue University is one of those the obvious advantage of taking in this organization can be seen at once.

CHAPTER.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE O.S.G. FRATERNITY.

The O.S.G. Fraternity was organized in 1879 and from the first has enjoyed uninterrupted prosperity. It was composed of a body of men to whom the then existing fraternities of the College did not appeal, and who banded themselves together for good fellowship and for the study of literature. At first its character was that of a non-secret organization, but as its members did not belong to any of the secret fraternities and as its meetings were not open to non-members, its character gradually changed. Never having been a purely literary society, the associations of its members and its relation to other student organizations, soon made it essentially a secret fraternity. This it has been for many years.

The personnel of the Fraternity has always represented the very best element of the College. No other society has exceeded it in general influence or prosperity, and it has been a leading factor in student life.

In membership the Fraternity has always ranked with the foremost college organizations. It has always exercised great care in selecting its men and has been singularly fortunate in this regard. At present there are twenty-seven undergraduate members. The constitutional limit is thirty-five. The fact that the Fraternity has been able to maintain itself without interruption for so many years, despite the active interest about college in national fraternities, speaks well for its stability and for its high standing with the student body.

As regards scholarship the standing of the Fraternity is attested by the fact that thirty-nine O.S.G. men have been elected to the honorary scientific fraternity Phi Kappa Phi, a considerably larger number than from any other society.

The Fraternity is well represented in the various branches of student activities as shown by the individual records of its members.

Among the graduate members of the Fraternity are many of the

strongest and most successful men who have gone out from the College. One of them is President of Purdue University, another assistant director of the experiment station system of this country, another general manager of the Atkinson, Topeka, and Santa Fe Railroad, another director of the Rhode Island Experiment Station, two others physicians of wide reputation as specialists; several are State entomologists, a large number are at the heads of departments of agriculture, horticulture, chemistry, entomology, etc., in such institutions as McGill, Cornell, Michigan Agricultural College, Massachusetts Agricultural College, and others; many have become successful business men.

A larger number have taken advanced work leading to higher degrees than from any other Fraternity in the College, and the Fraternity is more widely represented in institutions for education and research, State and Municipal departments, and other positions of responsibility.

An organization of alumni members has taken the place of a national council in giving stability to the Fraternity and guiding its development.

A corporation was formed in 1892 for the purpose of providing a home for the Fraternity. This object was finally attained and the House has been occupied for the past three years proving eminently successful both as an investment and as a means of working out the policies of the Fraternity. A lot near the campus has also been acquired upon which the Fraternity hopes to build at some future date.

At no time has the Fraternity been ungrateful of the manifold advantages presented by a national body. The broader relations which the College has assumed year by year have emphasized this, and have made it clear that such an affiliation is much to be desired. Graduates and undergraduates are united in this conviction, feeling,

that despite the present prosperous condition, such action is for the best interests of the Fraternity in the future.

In petitioning your Fraternity, we feel that we present for your adoption a strong and active organization, which for years has been second to none of the Fraternities represented at the College in standing and influence.

In view of the recognized position of the Fraternity, and the standing and future of the College, we feel confident that a chapter of your Fraternity would be prosperous from the start and one which would reflect credit upon the National Body.

Institution.

The Massachusetts Agricultural College is located in the beautiful town of Amherst, in the midst of unusually attractive surroundings. It is one of the oldest and foremost agricultural colleges of the country, having been incorporated in 1864 and opening its doors to students in 1867.

It divides with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology the Federal Land Grant of 1862 for collegiate instruction in agriculture and the mechanic arts, and is for agriculture and related sciences what the Institute is for technological purposes.

A high standard of work and scholarship has been maintained at the College from the first. It should not be confused with some of the lower grade agricultural colleges which exist as departments of State universities or colleges of agriculture and mechanic arts. It is not a manual training school, but a typical New England college in the highest sense, giving a broad general education.

Its grade is comparable with that of the better class of institutions in the state. About 90% of the students enter on certificates and examinations of schools recognized by the New England association of colleges. The entrance requirements are identical with those of other colleges in that association and are in full compliance with the standard of the Carnegie Foundation.

The College degrees of B.Sc., M.Sc., and Ph.D. represent as high grade of work and requirements as those of such institutions as Amherst, Dartmouth, Williams, Wesleyan and similar colleges. So many of our graduates have gone abroad for further study, and these have acquitted themselves so well, that the college is favorably known and its M.Sc. degree is accepted at German universities in

tion of the preliminary work for degrees which is required of men from many other colleges of supposedly higher rank.

The broad relationships of agriculture has served to set and broaden the course of the institution until it has become in reality a College of Science, giving special attention to those branches like chemistry, botany, entomology, zoology, veterinary science, economics, etc. which have a relation to agriculture. This has drawn to the college students from all of the eastern states and many foreign countries who are interested not only in agricultural phases of the work, but who intend to enter the professions, educational work or business.

The college grounds comprise more than four hundred acres, lying about a mile from the village center. There are attractively laid out on a generous plan on the spacious campus.

There are about twenty buildings used for instruction, besides about as many more for the greenhouses, barns, residences, experiment station, etc. The present value of the plant is estimated at something over a million and a half dollars. The present income of the institution is about \$400,000 a year.

At the head of the college is a man who is one of the leading educators of this country, and who has been honored by being selected a member of the Commission on Country Life by Pres. Roosevelt.

The faculty consists of thirty-two regular and associate professors, eighteen assistant professors, and about twenty instructors. There are in addition several lecturers on special subjects who are not in residence.

In attendance, the number of students is rapidly increasing under the progressive policy of the Institution. The past year there were 477 students in the regular four year course. The entering class has practically trebled in the last ten years. In 1902 it numbered sixty-two, in 1911 it was one hundred sixty-eight, and indications point to a larger class this fall. The graduating class in 1902 was twenty-three, and this year was ninety-seven. In addition to the regular students there are many graduate students from this and other institutions, such as Harvard, Yale, Dartmouth, Williams, etc.

Athletics have always played a part in the life of the students of the college, and it ranks well with other institutions in New England in all lines of athletic activity, as may be seen from the appended schedules and scores of last season. At one time or another every New England college has appeared on our schedules.

Fraternity life at the college has been prominent from the start. The D. C. K. and C. K. V. Fraternities were organized there within two years after the college was established. the former obtained a charter from the Kappa Sigma Fraternity some years ago, and the latter is continued under its original charter, although at the present time it has a petition before some national organization, I believe. Phi Kappa Sigma, a national fraternity, was established in 1875, and in the last few years the following national fraternities have established a chapter at the college; Theta Chi, Lambda Chi Alpha, and Sigma Phi Epsilon. There are two other locals which have been established recently, Beta Kappa Phi and Kappa Gamma Phi.

The C. F. C. Fraternity, to be described beyond, has been in operation uninterruptedly since 1875, and has always been prominent in college life.

A Fraternity Conference deals with matters of common interest to the several bodies.

The honorary fraternity Phi Kappa Phi granted a charter to the college in recognition of the grade in scholarship and attainment.

Among other organizations may be mentioned the Social Union and a strong branch of the Y. M. C. A.

The College Senate, composed of nine men from the two upper classes, has a function similar to that of like bodies in other institutions.

The regular student publications are the Signal, a weekly and the Index, an annual published by the Junior class.

The principal social events are the Sophomore-Senior Hop, the Junior Prom., and Informals, held about once every three weeks.
