

Institution.

The Hansachusetts Agricultural College is located in the beautiful town of Amboret, in the midst of unusually attractive surroundings. It is one of the oldest and forement agricultural colleges of the country, having been incorporated in 1864 and opening its doors to students in 1867.

It divides with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology the Federal Land Grant of 1862 for collegiate instruction in agriculture and the mechanic arts, and in for agriculture and related sciences what the Institute is for technological purposes.

A high standard of work and scholarship has been maintained at the College from the first. It should not be confused with some of the lower grade agricultural colleges which exist as departments of State universition or colleges of agriculture and mechanic arts. It is not a marmal training school, but a typical New England college in the highest sense, giving a broad general education.

Its grade is comparable with that of the better class of institutions in the state. About 90% of the students enter on certificates and examinations of schools recognised by the New England association of colleges. The entrance requirements are identical with those of other colleges in that association and are in full compliance with the standard of the Carnegie Foundation.

The College degrees of a.Sd., M.Sc., and Ph.D. represent as high grade of work and requirements as those of such institutions as amberet, Dartmouth, Williams, Wesleyan and similar colleges. So many of our graduates have gone abroad for further study, and these have sequitted themselves so well, that the college is favorably known and its B.Sc. degree is accopted at German universities in

lion of the preliminary work for degrees which is required of men from many other colleges of supposedly higher rank.

The broad relationships of agriculture has served to set and broaden the source of the institution until it has become in reality a <u>Gollege of Science</u>, giving special attention to those branches like chemistry, betary, enterployy, society, veterinary acisnos, occurrence, etc. which have a relation to agriculture. This has drawn to the college students from all of the eastern states and many foreign countries who are interested not only in agricultural phases of the work, but who intend to enter the professions, oducational work or business.

the college grounds comprise more than four hendred acros, lying about a mile from the village center. There are attractively laid out on a generous plan on the spacious compus.

There are about beenly buildings used for instruction, besides about as many more for the greenhoused, burns, residences, experiment station, etc. The present value of the plant is estimated at something over a million and a half deliars. The present income of the institution is about \$600,000 a year.

At the head of the sollege is a men who is one of the leading educators of this country, and who has honored by being selected a number of the Commission on Country Life by Free. Boonsvolt.

The faculty consists of thirty-two regular and associate profeasors, sighteen assistant professors, and about twenty instructors. There are in addition several lecturers on special subjects she are not in residence. In attendance, the Lamber of Students is regular increasing under the progressive policy of the Lastitution. The past year there were 677 students in the regular four year course. The entering class has practically trobled in the last ten years. In 1908 it membered sixty-tre, in 1911 it was one hundred sixty-cight, and indications point to a larger class this fall. The graduating class in 1908 was twenty-three, and this year was nivety-seven. In addition to the regular students there are many graduate students from this and other institutions, such as Marward, Nale, Dertmouth, Williams, etc.

Athletics have always played a part in the life of the students of the college, and it runks well with other institutions in New England in all lines of athletic activity, as may be seen from the appended schedules and secres of last season. At one time or another every New England college has appeared on our schedules.
