Dear Sir and Brother:-

As instructed by you, I have investigated the standing, socially and Fraternally, of the Atherton Club of the University of California, and have made inquiries concerning the quality of its membership. I met the members of the Club last Sunday, and am well impressed with their general appearance. I dined with them at their clubhouse and found them to be an enthusiastic lot of clean young fellows. I have made inquiries outside of the club and find them to be respected and well thought of by the students generally. They are considered both sociable and fraternal and of possessing a high standard of college spirit. I found, on inquiry among the men themselves, that they are most active in debating, literary and musical circles, though a number of their members are active in the athletic events of the University. Four of their number are on the University Glee Club and a number of others play various musical instruments. For the last several years they have had representatives on the University Debating Team and Carnot Debate, the two principal forensic contests of the school.. I am informed that in scholarship they ranked third among the clubs and fraternities in the University last year, being excelled only by one club and one fraternity. I am personally acquainted with an instructor in French in the University, who, on investigation, I find was President of the Atherton Club some eight or nine years ago. He is a man of high qualities and in discussing the club with him I find that he is proud of having been one of its members and officers, and makes very frequent visits to the club. On the whole I am well pleased with the quality of membership of the club and recommend that a charter be granted to it.

THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

The University of California, founded first in 1860 as a private school, known as the College of California, assumed its present form in 1868, when, by an act of the state legislature, it was created the state university. In 1869 it had ten instructors and thirty-five students. In 1911 it had 717 officers and 4,702 students. These figures tell better than words the story of the growth of the institution from a small college to a great, and a real, university, fit to rank beside the greatest institutions of learning in the world. The United States Commissioner of Education in his report for 1910 ranked the University of California fifth among the Universities of the nation, in point of efficiency. The Carnegie Institution has given it similar ranking. In the number of students, it is today second only to Columbia, and it surpasses even that University in the number of undergraduate students. At the present time there are in the Colleges at Berkeley, alone, 636 officers and 4,233 students; and there are over 100 officers and 1000 students in the various other departments of the University.

Subtract from this grand total 75 duplicate names, and it leaves the actual enrollment of the University, in its regular courses, last year, 4,707.

There are at present ten colleges in the University at Berkeley, and seven affiliated departments, while three more colleges are in the process of formation. The existing colleges are:-- the College of Letters, which offers the old classical course leading to the B.A. degree; the College of Social Sciences, which comprises the literary course leading to the B.L. degree; and the following Colleges which grant the B.S. degree; the College of Natural Sciences, which offers a general scientific course; the College of Agriculture, which affords technical training in Agriculture; the College of Commerce, which provides a training for business; the College of Chemistry, for the training of expert chemists; the College of Medicine, which grants the M.D. degree after three years of post-graduate work; and the three Engineering Colleges, Mechanical, Mining, and Civil, in which are offered technical courses in the different branches of Engineering. In addition to these, schools in Architecture, Jurisprudence, and Domestic Science are now in the process of becoming separate colleges. Affiliated with the University are the Colleges of Law, Medicine, Dentistry, and Pharmacy, in San Francisco, a medical College at Los Angeles, the University Farm School at Davis California, and, lastly, the San Francisco Institute of Art.

In addition to the Bachelor degrees already mentioned, the University grants the following degrees:-- LL.B., M.D.S., Ph.G., M.A., M.L., M.S., M.E., B.R., C.R., and the honorary degree LL.D.

The University receives state aid to the amount of approximately \$1,000,000 annually. In addition to this sum, it had, on June 30, 1911, an endowment valued at \$4,886,780.48, which in that year produced an income of \$255,081.76. Many private gifts are made from time to time by citizens of the state, and, in fact, nearly all the buildings on the campus have been erected through such private gifts. There are at present approximately forty buildings on the campus. One of these cost over \$1,000,000, two others cost about \$400,000 each, while half a dozen more have been erected at a cost of more than \$200,000 each. Three new buildings, a Campanile, a Hall of Chemistry, and a General Recitation building, are about to be erected.

There are 28 national fraternities represented at the University of California, a larger number than is to be found at any other University in the country. The following are the fraternities already represented here, with the date of the establishment of the California Chapter:-- Zeta Psi, 1870; Chi Phi, 1875; Delta Kappa Epsilon, 1876; Beta Theta Pi, 1879; Phi Gamma Delta, 1881, re-established 1886; Phi Delta Theta, 1873, Re-established 1886; Sigma Chi, 1881; Sigma Nu, 1892; Sigma Alpha Epsilon, 1894; Chi Psi, 1895; Kappa Alpha, 1895; Delta Upsilon, 1896; Delta Tau Delta, 1898; Phi Kappa Psi, 1899; Alpha Tau Omega, 1900; Theta Delta Chi, 1900; Kappa Sigma, 1900; Psi Upsilon, 1901; Phi Kappa Sigma, 1901; Acacia, 1904; Alpha Delta Phi, 1905; Phi Sigma Kappa, 1909; Pi Kappa Phi, 1909; Theta Chi, 1910; Delta Chi, 1910; Sigma Phi Epsilon, 1910; Pi Kappa Alpha, 1911; Sigma Phi, 1912.

There are fifteen men's Clubs on the Campus, to wit;-- Abracadabra, Achaean, Atherton, Bacheloron, Casimir, Babylonica, Bel Rey, Dwight, Hilgard, Los Amigos, Malanda, Pirates, Pyra, Skulls, and Unity. Thus, there are a total of forty-three men's fraternal organizations at this University, each with a membership ranging from fifteen to forty men. The average membership is perhaps twenty-two making thus a total of about 1,000 men affiliated with these organizations out of a total enrollment of men students of a few more than 2700. The twenty-eight fraternities have a membership of about 700.

With such a body of men students to pick from, there would seem to be ample room for a chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity at this University. The fraternity spirit is naturally strong at California, and with right management a chapter should prove highly successful. The Atherton Club has been gradually improving the quality of its initiates, until it at present ranks very high among the organizations, both as an organization, and because of the records and standing of its individual members. The size of our University, the variety of the activities, give ample room and opportunity to an individual or an organization to come to the front, if it possesses any individual traits of its own to give it standing. To a fraternity with real purpose behind it there is ample room here, and as a chapter of your Fraternity, it would be the Atherton Club's chief desire to take advantage of the opportunity, and to attempt to realize individuality and definiteness of purpose.

THE HISTORY OF THE ATHERTON CLUB.

The Atherton Club was organized on its present basis in the fall of the year of 1904. For three years previous to this time the dozen University of California fellows who formed the nucleus of the new club had been boarding together at the Seafide Theological Seminary in Berkeley. These students and those of the Seminary had a loose organization for boarding accommodations and social good times. From this affiliation developed the present Atherton Club. The purpose of the club as stated in the constitution adopted in 1904 is "to promote the good fellowship that is to be gained from the association of congenial persons of kindred aims and like ideals, and to obtain all other advantages pertaining to such organization."

The prominence and energy of the organizers was a great help to the new club and at the end of the term the club included nineteen active members. On January first, 1905, the club took a three year lease of a large house one block from the campus. The first year was a highly successful one and the club was immediately ranked among the best clubs on the campus, and it has kept the same high standing ever since. The members took part in the various college activities, including football, baseball, basketball, track, rowing, debating, journalism, dramatics and politics. Ever since this time it has been the policy of the club to have each man go out for at least one of these activities, whether he is apt to attain distinction or not makes no difference. In the spring of the first year one of the seniors won on the crew. The custom of giving social functions was also inaugurated the first year and continues in full force to-day. The number of social functions given each year is five or six.

During the year 1905-6 there were twenty members, including five new men, residing at the house. In the spring term one of the Seniors was elected president of the 1905 class and is now permanent president of that class. One of the members was also elected to Phi Delta Kappa honor society in that year.

With a few changes in membership in the year 1906-7, eighteen men resided at the house. The year saw the introduction of rugby football as the intercollegiate game. The club had five men out for the new game, one making the freshman team, and another the Varsity. Another member rowed in the Varsity crew in the spring, and two more were on the Track team.

There were seventeen men residing at the clubhouse during the year 1907-8. In January 1908 the club moved to 2435 Piedmont Avenue. The club was represented by one man on the Varsity football football team, another on the Freshmen football team, three men on the Varsity track team. One of the seniors was elected to Tau Beta Pi Engineering honor society. Another was elected Vice President of the Associated Students.

During the year 1908-9 there were twenty two resident members. One member played on the Varsity football team, two more were point winners on the Track team and one was coxswain of the Freshman crew.

The club began the year 1909-10 with twenty resident members, eighteen living in the house and two associates. One of the members broke the intercollegiate record in the mile this year, another was in the track team and one freshman debuted on his class debating team.

In the year 1910-11, there were eighteen men in active affiliation with the Club. One man was Captain and Director of the University Band; while several members were out for the different branches of athletics. One man, initiated in 1911, was a member of the Carnot Debating Team, in the Intercollegiate Debate with Stanford. One of the freshmen was president of his class.

In the fall of 1911, the Club moved into its new house, and present home at 2514 Dwight Way. This house was especially built for the use of the Club, and was designed by one of the resident members. The Club has a five year lease on the house, which cost about \$10,000. It is considered the best clubhouse on the Campus, and for the use of such an organization, is surpassed only by a few of the wealthier fraternities. This house has ample room for twenty men, and half a dozen more can be crowded in, if necessary.

In the year 1911-12 the membership was eighteen, and the policy of wise selection of members began to show its effect in the increasing standing of the Club. One member debated on both the Intercollegiate teams of the year; another won the Bonnheim Dissestation and Discussion prizes amounting to \$125. One man was president of the Architectural Association; another president of his debating society, and a member of the University Debating Council. One of the Seniors was elected to the English Club, the literary and dramatic honor society of the University; another to the honorary law fraternity, Phi Delta Phi. Both these men graduated with honors; one in History and Political Science, the other in Jurisprudence. Two of the freshmen were on the freshman track team; another freshman was elected to the Glee Club. One of the Juniors won a wrestling championship. One of the Sophomores was a frequent contributor to the Pelican, the University comic paper, and was appointed to serve on the Josh staff of the Blue and Gold, the Junior Annual, in the current year.

Two of the seniors were elected to a local honorary Law Club. Two more of the seniors were Captains in the Cadet Regiment, and the Company of one of them won the banner in the competitive drill of the year. One freshman was on his class debating team; another was on the staff of the Daily Californian.

With the beginning of this year, the Club has entered upon what promises to be the best year of its history. The membership has been increased to twenty-four, and the Club is expecting soon to take in half a dozen more men, who have been undergoing investigation for some time. The Club has now four men in the Glee Club, and one of them is one of the leading soloists of that organization. One senior has been for the second time selected to play fullback on the Varsity soccer football team. One of the Sophomores is captain of his class track team; another is an Associate Editor of the Daily Californian; and yet another has been given the best political job in the gift of his class, the chairmanship of the Sophomore Hop Committees. Nearly all the members of the Club are actively engaged in one activity or another, and many of them are sure to make good in their respective activities. The Club is not only holding up its end among college activities, but is also ranking very high in scholarship. The recorder's office issues once each year a list of the ranking in scholarship of the different organizations. Last term the Atherton Club stood second among the forty-three men's organizations on the Campus. This year it hopes to attain first place. To conclude, the Club, after eight years continuous existence, in which practically every year has been a successful one, now seems about to attain even higher ranking than it at present possesses. It is for this reason that the Club feels that it would not detract from the standing of your fraternity, were its petition for a chapter granted.

The present officers of the Atherton Club are the following;--- President, A. I. Gates; Vice-President, T. A. Greig; Secretary, C. W. McCleamp Corresponding Secretary, A. G. rinn; Treasurer and House Manager, T. J. Ledwich. J. H. mitchell, T. J. Ledwich, and T. B. Kittredge, are all past presidents of the Club.

The Atherton Club has upon its rolls as Alumni members some fifty three names, which are given in the following pages. At least thirty of them, the Atherton Club would desire to initiate into the Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity, should it be granted a chapter of that Fraternity.
