## INSTRUCTIONS TO PETITIONERS

Petitions are prepared on paper furnished at cost by Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity to bodies desiring to make application to it for a Charter.

In preparing the following petition observe the directions carefully.

1. Make up one petition for each of our Chapters, one for our Grand Corresponding Secretary one for our Grand Secretary, one for our Grand Junior President. Send all to our Grand Junior President.

2. Have all the data furnished filled in on the typewriter, with black record ribbon. These directions must be followed very carefully. Do not use carbon or different colored ribbons.

3. Bind with silk cord or tape in order that they may be opened, reports inserted, and recommendations attached.

4. Individual statements should be on original, not carbon copies.

5. Arrange every copy of the petition in the same manner.

6. Alumni members of the petitioning body should be set forth in that part of the petition reserved for such in the form of a "Who's Who," giving the surname first and Christian and middle name, together with all information as to what he did in college, when he graduated, degrees, honors, and positions held since leaving college.

7. Assemble the petition in the following order:

A short history of the educational institution.

A history of the organization petitioning.

Individual statements.

Alumni lists.

A petition signed by every member of the petitioning body with his full name.

Pictures of the campus, house, group, etc. in their proper places.

## **FUNDS**

The following sums should accompany the petitions when sent in:

Charter fees	- - - - -	\$40.00,
Pins for members	- - - - -	4.25 each,
Plaques for members,	- - - - -	3.15 each,
Paraphernalia for members,-	- - - - -	2.00 each,
Paraphernalia for chapter,	- - - - -	48.00,

Investigation expenses,	- - - - -	50.00, indemnity

The investigation expenses may be larger than is actually required, but in any event it will not exceed the actual traveling and hotel expenses of the investigating committee and any sum in excess thereof will be refunded.

If the charter is not granted all sums in excess of actual expenses of investigation will be refunded.

To the Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity.

Gentlemen and Brethren:

Through the delay in Xi Chapter in making their report nearly seven weeks late, I have been unable to present to you before the enclosed petition of the Alvarado Club of Stanford University at Palo Alto, California.

The reports have been in my possession for many months, but reached me too late to present to you last spring. I hand you herewith the petitions together with the Committee's report.

You will note that no approval of the Grand Prudential Committee is attached, and the reason is that the Grand Prudential Committee itself is so widely scattered in the United States and in Military Service as to preclude the possibility of getting its approval in a formal way, although each of the three members have seen the petitions and approved them personally.

In view of the unsettled conditions of our Country, I ask that you give these petitions your immediate approval. If the Alvarado Club is to come in at all, it is quite essential that the work of installation be completed before Christmas due to the fact that our installing officers on the Pacific Coast expect to be ordered to France soon thereafter. I ask the immediate action of all the Chapters upon this petition.

Dear Sir:-

Your letter of January 10th, asking me to act as Official Investigator for the Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity, of the Alvarado Club, located at Stanford University, Palo Alto, California, together with a copy of the petition of said Club, reached me in due time.

I wish to report that I have carefully investigated the generalfraternity conditionsat Stanford University and in particular the standing and quality of the members making up the Alvarado Club, petitioning for a Charter in our Fraternity.

I found that there are more than 1500 men students at Stanford University, that the campus of the University is separate from the town of Palo Alto, the main building of the University being nearly a mile from the city, and that practically all of the students live on the campus. That there are 21 Fraternities now in Stanford, having a total membership of a little less than 600; leaving more than 900 non-fraternity members now on the campus. I found that the general quality of the Stanford students is very high, that the University itself is attempting to raise the standard of scholarship among its students and members, aiming ultimately to provide only for graduate work and the last two years of under-graduate work; and requiring for admission to the University the completion of what is coming to be known as the "Junior College Work". I find avery close mark is kept upon all the students' activities and only those doing a high class of work are permitted to remain in the University. I believe that under these general conditions a chapter of our Fraternity could well be established at Stanford University.

I investigated in particular the quality and character of the men making up the membership of the Alvarado Club. I personally met each of the members of the Club, and I unhesitatingly say that they represent a high type of vigorous and energetic American College Students. They are all clean-cut, clear-eyed, straight-forward, aggressive, good-natured, courteous and business-like.



I find that they are engaged in various students' activities and possess that spirit that makes a successful college fraternity. I personally visited the office of the Registrar, and examined the scholarship records of each of the members of the Club. I have also been furnished by the Assistant Registra with charts specially prepared by him for my use, showing the individual scholarship records of the members of the Alvarado Club and the comparative scholarship records of the members of all fraternities at Stanford. This chart shows the average scholarship for members of the Alvarado Club for the semester ending May 1916 to be 77.44 while the average scholarship of all fraternities on the campus for that semester was 72.2. There are but two fraternities on the campus having a higher average scholarship than that of the Alvarado Club, the other nineteen fraternities showing a lower scholarship.

I found that the club is well located for a new club, well housed, and in a favorable situation to attract good men to its membership. I also found that the standard of scholarship among the younger members of the Club was higher than that of the Junior Senior Students, thus indicating an improvement in the right direction.

My recommendation, therefore, is that the members of the Alvarado Club be received into our Fraternity and that a charter be granted to them.

## HISTORY OF THE INSTITUTION.

### Leland Stanford Junior University.

Leland Stanford Junior University was founded in 1891 by Senator Leland Stanford and Jane L. Stanford as a memorial to their only son Leland, Junior. It is located on the Palo Alto estate 30 miles south-east of San Francisco. The University is endowed by the entire Stanford fortune, amounting to more than thirty million dollars.

### Departments.

The work of the University is embraced in the following departments divided into groups, as indicated.

- (1) Greek, Latin, Germanic Language, Romanic Language, English.
- (2) Botany, Physiology, Histology, Zoology, Entomology, Bionomics, Medicine, Anatomy, Bacteriology.
- (3) Psychology, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Mining.
- (4) Philosophy, Education, History, Economics, Law.
- (5) Applied Mathematics, Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Electrical Engineering.

### Degrees.

### Students.

The student body last year numbered 2054, including 297 graduates, 1702 undergraduates, and 65 specials. The women are limited in number to 500, so that the total enrollment of men is over 1500.

### Buildings

The University buildings are arranged in the form of a quadrangle. They are built of brown sandstone and are in an adaptation of the California Mission architecture. The buildings are ample in size and equipment for all needs. The best known buildings are the Memorial Church, seating 1700 and noted for



its interior decorations;the Library,containing 213,000 volumes;and the Museum which contains one of the best historical and art collections on the Pacific Coast.

Besides.the above general fraternities the following honor or professional fraternities have chapters at Stanford. There are also ten national sororities at Stanford.

### Prospects for a new chapter.

The twenty-one fraternities have a membership of about 550,Encina Hall,the men's dormitory provides living accomadations for about 400 more.The balance,about 600 live in private boarding houses either on the campus or in Palo Alto.As the University is some distance from a city practically none of the students live at home.

The 600 men outside of fraternities and Encina Hall are unusually good fraternity material,containing many leaders in college activities.The fraternities also draw to some extant from Encina Hall.The petitioners feel confident that the fraternity situation at Stanford is potentially strong for a chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi.





## HISTORY OF PETITIONING BODY.

### Alvarado Club.

Alvarado Club was organized in November 1915. For a year previous many of the men were associated together in Alvarado Hall, a private men's dormitory. In January 1916 the Club moved into the house formerly occupied by the Theta Xi Fraternity, located at 16 Alvarado Row. The house--a three story frame building--was unfurnished, so a complete set of furniture was purchased and is now owned by the Club. The Club is in excellent financial condition, owing to the fact that there are no outstanding debts or bills.

The reports of the investigating committees, recommendations of members of faculties, other fraternities, etc. together with a finding from the G. J. P., etc., are attached.

These should be studied by every member of your Chapter to the end that he will be prepared to give proper consideration to the petition. Remember copies hereof are in the hands of your fellows in every Chapter and a prompt reply is not only due the petitioners, but also all within our own circle. Your reply should be in the form of a report under the hands and seals of your president and secretary directed to the G. J. P. and sent to him. Observe the provisions of the Fraternity Constitution in taking and reporting these votes. A majority vote of the members present decides the way in which your Chapter votes. Petitions can only be considered at regular meeting of your Chapter unless every active member is present at a special meeting called for that purpose.
