History of Virginia Tech

Founded in 1944, Virginia Polytechnic and State University has striven to achieve excellence in instruction, research, and service. With approximately 23,000 students and 5700 faculty and staff members, this community follows a proud heritage.

In 1872, the Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College was established. Funding for the college was provided by the Morrill Land Grant Act. Jointly under this act and the first board of visitors made a requirement to study military tactics. This made the population exclusively male and members of the corps of cadets until the mid 1960's. The change in curricular emphasis resulted in the new name given to the college, "Virginia Polytechnic Institute" which was enacted in 1944. The "State University" was added in 1970.

Today, the university's population is 40 percent women and encompasses 67 departments and seven academic colleges. This new look for Virginia Tech has not forgotten the past. The Corps of Cadets and College of Agriculture are still prominent institutions on campus.

Virginia Tech is located in Blacksburg Virginia. It is 38 miles from Roanoke in scenic south-western Virginia. The central campus is made up of 2,600 acres with about 600 adjoining acres of agricultural research land.

Alpha Sigma Phi received provisional status with the IFC last spring semester.

Virginia Tech Colony History

The first interest was shown by Vincent Peters and Shawn Barry after talking to Ed Danis, who at the time was president of the Coastal Carolina colony. Our first meeting consisted of 21 undergraduate members and was held on Wednesday, January 27. We discussed the possibility of forming Alpha Sigma Phi at Tech. This meeting was followed by a visit from Jeff Owens and brothers from the Radford chapter. Jeff discussed the fraternity, what it had to offer, and how to begin a chapter at Tech.

At our next meeting we decided to become an official interest group. We registered as an interest group at Virginia Tech and the National Chapter. Over the course of the next several meetings, we laid the foundations for the future. We quickly grew to 29 members and petitioned to become a colony of Alpha Sigma Phi. On October 30, 1993 we had our official ceremony to become a colony, with a banquet that followed. In the course of the next semester we strived to create an order to be followed for years to come. Mainly we were concerned with the central organization of this fraternity. Now we have developed to enhance the lives of seventy-one brothers.

We have worked hard to participate in as many Greek events as possible. The brothers of Alpha Sigma Phi have been involved in the KKG Tug-Of-War, AΦ soccer tournament, ΠBΦ and ΣAE Hoopfest, and KΔ pool tournament. Within the last academic we have not only participated in these philanthropic events, but have taken first place in the ΔΔΔ Decathlon, ZTA whiffle-ball tournament, AΔΠ Safari Hunt, KΔ bowl-a-thon costume contest, XΩ twister, and Grand Champion of the ΔΓ National Philanthropic event, Anchor Splash. Members have also competed on intramural teams in basketball, soccer, water polo, softball, and flag football as a fraternity sponsored team. Our service projects includes the dime roll, in which the Virginia Tech colony participated with the Radford Chapter to raise money for the March of Dimes, and we are currently arranging our own philanthropic event called Pie-Wars which is to be held in September. We have adopted a spot extending along Prices Fork Road and participated in Broomin'-and-Bloomin'. Along with these events, various socials with sororities, our first semi-formal, an annual camping trip, numerous other brotherhood events/retreats, and an annual Valentine's Day Rose sale, we now feel organized enough to petition for our charter.

The Constitution of
The Virginia Tech Colony of
Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity

Preamble

We, the active members of Alpha Sigma Phi at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, in order to provide for effective management and legislation in the operation of the chapter, do hereby adopt and approve this constitution.

Article I Name, Purpose, and Objects

- Section 1.** The name of this organization shall be the ???
???? chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity.
- Section 2.** The purposes for which this fraternity is formed are to foster education, maintain charity, and promote patriotism.
- Section 3.** The objects secondary to its purpose are to promote culture and scholarship, assist in the building of character, promote college loyalties, perpetuate friendship, cement social ties and develop true brotherhood among its members.

Article II Membership

- Section 1.** Membership in the chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi is open to any registered undergraduate male student at Virginia Tech regardless of race, national origin, religious preference, age, handicap, veteran status or political belief.
- Section 2.** Categories of Membership
- a.) *Active*
 - b.) *Faculty*
 - c.) *Alumnus*
 - d.) *Inactive*
- Section 3.** Definitions of Membership
- a.) *Active-* is any undergraduate male at Virginia Tech that has completed all required pledge responsibilities.
 - b.) *Faculty-* are members that shall be on the faculty or administrative staff of Virginia Tech, who receive no more than 1/3 negative votes of the active members present.
 - c.) *Alumnus-* is any initiated active member who is

no longer enrolled as an undergraduate at Virginia Tech.

d.) *Inactive-*

- 1.) Any member who does not meet the financial obligations of the chapter can be classified as an inactive member by a 2/3 majority vote of the active membership present.
- 2.) A member may be granted inactive status by a 2/3 majority vote of the active membership present at his own request.
- 3.) Inactive members lose all privileges and benefits of active status
- 4.) Inactive members may be reinstated by a 2/3 majority vote of the active membership present. In order to regain active status all past debts must be paid.

Section 4. No member shall be a member of another Greek letter social fraternity except of a professional or honorary nature.

Article III Chapter Meetings

Section 1. Meetings of this chapter shall be held at least once a week during the academic year, with the excepting of conflicting holidays.

Section 2. Special meetings may be called at the discretion of the president, or by the Prudential committee upon the request of an active member.

Section 3. All meetings shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order, Newly Revised and Virginia Tech policies.

Section 4. A quorum to hold a meeting shall consist of a majority of the total active membership.

Section 5. Only active members have the right to vote.

Article IV Officers and Advisors

Section 1. The elected officers of this chapter shall be all officers and committee chairmen.

Section 2. The officers shall be elected by a majority vote of the active membership present.

- a.) Only full time students carrying twelve or more hours may hold office.
- b.) The annual elections shall be held at the second meeting of the spring semester.

- c.) Nominations will be accepted one week prior to the election.
- d.) Officers shall assume their duties at the first meeting after elections.

Section 3. In the event of a vacancy in the office of President, the Vice-President shall assume the duties of President and a Vice-President will be elected at the next regular meeting. In the event of a vacancy in any other office, election will be held at the next regular meeting. Any lower ranking officer may be nominated for a higher office. No inactive member may retain his office.

Section 4. Duties of Officers

- a.) *President*- Presides over all meetings; he shall cast no votes at regular meetings except in the event of a tie. He holds a position on the Prudential committee and co-signs all checks written by the treasurer for chapter purposes. He is responsible to the University and the Grand Council as the official representative of the chapter. He also is required to attend all round table meetings that IFC requests.
- b.) *Vice-President*- is to assist the President. He presides over meetings in the absence of the president. He chairs the Prudential committee and is responsible for coordinating committee activities insuring that they perform their assigned duties.
- c.) *Recording Secretary*- shall keep the minutes of all meetings and keep the records of the chapter. He is responsible for posting the minutes of each meeting. He shall keep accurate membership records. He shall give notice of special meetings. He shall see that the property of this chapter is cared for at all times and shall keep an accurate inventory thereof.
- d.) *Corresponding Secretary*- shall communicate all correspondence to the chapter at each meeting. He shall complete and submit all reports which are requested by National Headquarters, and shall see that all correspondence is answered or acknowledged.
- e.) *Treasurer*- shall keep and maintain financial records of the chapter, collect dues from all members, pay all outstanding debts, present a financial status report at each meeting, and submit a budget at the beginning of each semester. He shall be responsible for preparing yearly financial reports in conjunction with the advisor. He chairs the Financial committee, and holds a position on the Prudential committee.

- f.) *Editor*- shall submit material for Fraternity publications by the appropriate deadlines. He shall also be responsible for an annual chapter scrapbook.
- g.) *Scholarship Director*- shall take charge of the chapter's scholarship program, supervise tutorial programs, study programs, chapter reference material, and reports to the National Headquarters on the status of the scholarship program. He chairs the Scholarship committee, and is responsible for turning in grade reports as well as the overall chapter average.
- h.) *Alumni Director*- shall be responsible for providing communication between alumni brothers and the chapter. He is responsible for informing alumni and distinguished others of chapter events.
- i.) *Advisor(s)*- shall be selected from the faculty or staff of Virginia Tech. The advisor shall be selected on the basis of whom the members feel will best aid the fraternity. The purpose of the advisor shall be to work closely with the members in coordinating activities to insure that they are conducted in compliance with University policies and the laws of the United States, the Commonwealth of Virginia and the city of Blacksburg. He is responsible for working with the treasurer to see that yearly financial reports are completed. The advisor(s) shall be approved or removed by a majority vote of the active membership present.
- j.) *Marshall*- shall be in charge of all ritualistic equipment and ceremonies conducted by the Virginia Tech chapter.
- k.) *Sergeant-At-Arms*- shall be in charge of maintaining order within the chapter meetings outlined in Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised. He is also responsible for insuring that the chapter room is in proper condition. He is also responsible for monthly reports on the work of each officer. He is also responsible for disciplinary action within the chapter and presides over the Judicial Committee upon the request of the chapter.
- l.) *Pledge Educator*- is responsible for the education of all pledges in matters dealing with the Greek system and Alpha Sigma Phi as a National Organization and as a local chapter.
- m.) *Rush Chairman*- is responsible for establishing rush goals, securing lists of potential pledges, supervising follow-up rush, conducting rush workshops, keeping brothers informed of rush activities, evaluating of rush programs and to inspire the chapter to excel at its rush program.

- n.) *Social Chairman(External)*- shall be responsible for providing a well-rounded social program based on an approved budget and in compliance with all University, ABC, state and local regulations. He is in charge of all functions with sororities.
- o.) *Social Chairman (Internal)*- is responsible for all co-sponsered and self-sponsored events in compliance with all University, ABC, state and local regulations. He is in charge of all social functions with other fraternities.
- p.) *Athletics Chairman*- shall be responsible for organizing chapter teams for competition in Greek Intramural, practice sessions, notification of game times, enforcement of rules, regulations and eligibility requirements. He shall announce the results of athletic events at chapter meetings.
- q.) *Fund-raising Chairman*- is responsible for organizing and implementing all fund raising activities conducted by the chapter. He sees that all laws and regulations are followed.
- r.) *Brotherhood Chairman*- shall be responsible for arranging all brotherhood events, including annual events, in an effort to create and perpetuate brotherhood.
- s.) *Service Chairman*- shall be responsible for organizing projects for the chapter that may benefit either the campus or the community. He shall fill out and submit the forms necessary for consideration for all awards which the chapter is eligible.
- t.) *IFC Representatives*- shall be responsible for attending all Interfraternity Council meetings, and relaying the information to the chapter. They represent the opinions of the chapter to the Greek community.
- u.) *Historian*- shall photograph all chapter events to be placed in the annual scrapbook as a remanent record of the chapter's activities. The photographer may or may not be the editor.
- v.) *Special Events*- shall be in charge of all organizational processes in reference to Homecoming, Semiformals, Formals, Pie-Wars, and any other special event deemed necessary during the semesters.
- w.) *Housing Chairman*- shall be in charge of all procedures necessary for obtaining a house. He is also in charge of the maintenance of the house when it is acquired.
- x.) *Public Relations Chairman*- shall be in charge of all ads in the Collegiate Times or any other newspapers. Also is responsible for interaction in other organizations philanthropic events including T-shirt sales.

Section 5. In the event that an appointed office becomes vacant, it will be filled by a consensus of the chapter.

Section 6. The officers of the Virginia Tech Chapter can be removed from office for violation of university regulations or negligence of office. If an elected officer is found to be in violation of university regulations or in negligence of office, he shall stand for review by the Judicial Committee and if found negligent or in violation he will then stand for recall throughout election by a majority of the chapter's active membership. The officer in question shall continue to perform the duties of his office unless a decision against him is determined by the recall election.

Article V Committees

Section 1. The standing committees of the chapter shall be as follows:

- a.) *Prudential Committee*
- b.) *Finance Committee*
- c.) *Rush Committee*
- d.) *Service Committee*
- e.) *Scholarship Committee*
- f.) *Social External Committee*
- g.) *Social Internal Committee*
- h.) *Special Events Committee*
- i.) *Alumni Relations Committee*
- j.) *Athletics Committee*
- k.) *Fund-Raising Committee*
- l.) *Judicial Committee*
- m.) *Public Relations Committee*
- n.) *Housing Committee*
- o.) *By-Laws Committee*
- p.) *Brotherhood Committee*

Section 2. Definitions of Standing Committees:

- a.) The *Prudential Committee* shall consist of the President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Sergeant-At-Arms, ex-President, and two members elected from the active membership by a majority vote. Nominations for these two at-large positions shall take place immediately following election of officers, and voting shall take place at the next regular meeting. The Vice-President shall serve as Chairman. The *Prudential Committee* shall deal with all matters of programming policy, finance and budgeting, making subsequent

recommendations to the chapter.

- b.) The *Finance Committee* shall be chaired by the Treasurer. The committee is composed of two members in addition to the chairman, ex-Treasurer, and President. The duties of this committee are to present the chapter's financial plan to the Prudential Committee for approval and then to the chapter for final approval.
- c.) The *Rush Committee* shall be chaired by the Rush Chairman, and shall be composed of from three to five members including the chairman. The duties of this committee are the implementation of the chapter's rush program each year.
- d.) The *Service Committee* shall be chaired by the Service Chairman and will be made up of no less than three members. The duties of this committee are to assist the Service chairman in the planning and execution of social service projects.
- e.) The *Scholarship Committee* shall be chaired by the Scholarship Director, and is to be made up of no less than three members, including chairman. The committee is charge with assisting the Scholarship Director in providing a well-balanced scholastic program. The committee will also present an award each year to a member of the chapter for scholastic achievement.
- f.) The *Social Committee(External)* shall consist of no less than three members including the social chairman. The social committee(external) shall develop a program of activities with all Panhellenic sororities each term that is of benefit to the chapter.
- g.) The *Social Committee (Internal)* shall consist of no less than three members including the chair. The social committee (internal) shall develop a program of activities with any IFC Fraternity each term that is of benefit to the chapter.
- h.) The *Special Events Committee* shall consist of no less than three members including the chairman. The special events committee shall set up a proposal for Homecoming due in mid-spring and also prepare every special event down to the last detail.
- i.) The *Alumni Relations Committee* shall consist of no less than three members including the Alumni Director. This committee is charged with seeing that ties between undergraduates and alumni are maintained, and that the alumni are informed of chapter activities.
- j.) The *Athletics Committee* shall be made up of no less than three members including the Intramural Chairman. The duties of this committee are to organize the chapter's intramural program.

- k.) The *Fund-Raising Committee* shall be made up of no less than three members including the Fund-Raising Chairman. The committee plans and executes fund raising projects with the approval of the Prudential Committee and the chapter.
- l.) The *Judicial Committee* shall be composed of five members. This committee will only meet when violations of specific polociies are in question. This committee shall consist of the Sergeant-At-Arms who serves as a chairman, the President, the ex-Sergeant-At-Arms, and other members appointed until the committee consists of five brothers uninformed of the violations.
- m.) The *Public Relations Committee* shall consist of no less than two members including the chair. The public relations committee is in charge of all philanthropic events with other organization, this includes but is not limited to organization of teams, sale of T-shirts, and posting of times.
- n.) The *Housing Committee* shall consist of no less than two members including the chair. The housing committee is in charge of obtaining a house for the centralization of the Fraternity and the maintenance of it once it is acquired.
- o.) The *By-Laws Committee* shall consist of no less than three members including the chair. The by-laws committee is in charge of any updating of the by-laws and also the maintenance of the designated driver program.
- p.) The *Brotherhood Committee* shall consist of no less than three members including the chair. The brotherhood committee is responsible for all activities within the Fraternity that exclude non-members.

Section 3. All Active members are required to be available to serve on at least one committee.

Section 4. A quorum for committee meeting is constituted by a majority of committee members.

Section 5. Special Committees, consisting of three or more members to perform special or current duties which cannot be referred to one of the standing committees, may be appointed by the president. Special committees shall only deal with matters of current importance to the chapter and shall cease to exist when their mission is accomplished.

Section 6. Standing and special committees shall be directly responsible to the Vice-President. It shall be his duty to see that committees function properly and fulfill their functions.

Article VI Responsibility

The Virginia Tech chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi fraternity shall adhere to all Virginia Tech policies, regulations for the City of Blacksburg, the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia and the Constitution and laws of the United States of America.

Article VII Interfraternity Council

The Virginia Tech chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi fraternity shall hold membership and abide by all policies of the Virginia Tech Interfraternity Council.

Article VIII Finances

- Section 1.** The revenue of this chapter shall be derived from dues as set forth by the active members of this chapter, and from funds generated through fund raising activities.
- Section 2.** All revenues shall be controlled by the Prudential committee with recommendations coming from the Finance Committee.
- Section 3.** Distribution of dues and other revenue will be as follows: Checking, General Saving, Educational Fund, Sinking Fund and a Special Allotment Fund.
- Section 4.** Revenue will be budgeted for the following purposes: National Assessments, IFC dues, Rush, Social, Brotherhood, Ritual, Scholarship and Awards, Pledge Education, Intramurals, Alumni Relations, Editor and Photography, Advertising, Sinking, Supplies, Social Service, and other necessary purposes the chapter deems appropriate.
- Section 5.** The dues will be collected at the beginning of each semester by the Treasurer.
- Section 6.** The Prudential committee may require any member in arrears to the chapter to sign a promissory note.
- Section 7.** Indebtedness to the Virginia Tech chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi fraternity by any chapter member may be handled in accordance with the National Constitution and By-laws regarding the expulsion and suspension for non-payment of dues.

Article IX Constitutional Procedures

- Section 1.** This constitution of the Virginia Tech chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi fraternity may be amended in part or in full by a 3/4 majority vote of the active membership present. The amendment shall be submitted in writing, read before the chapter meeting, and tabled for one week. At the following meeting, the amendment shall be discussed and acted upon. The Amendment will then be submitted to the Dean of Students Office for Approval.
- Section 2.** Any provision of this constitution which is found to be in conflict with the current National Constitution and By-laws of Alpha Sigma Phi fraternity shall be declared non-operative.
- Section 3.** A copy of this constitution shall be filed with the Executive Director of Alpha Sigma Phi fraternity, the dean of Students Office and the Interfraternity Council.

By-Laws for
The Virginia Tech Chapter of
Alpha Sigma Phi

Finances and Fines

- a.) Three dollar fine for those who are on the Prudential committee but do not show up.
- b.) Five dollar fine for missing a meeting without obtaining an excuse form the president or vice-president prior to the meeting, and contacting the Sergeant-At-Arms.
- c.) Any IFC representative missing an IFC meeting is responsible for paying the fine.
- d.) Any active who is in debt to the chapter must go before the Prudential committee to make arrangements for payment of the debt.

Meeting Procedures

- a.) Smoking or chewing tobacco is not allowed at chapter meetings or meetings concerning fraternity matters.
- b.) There will be a brief period for announcements at the conclusion of new business.
- c.) Eating and drinking is prohibited at weekly chapter meetings.
- d.) An unexcused absence for a meeting will have a five dollar fine. Excuses must be given before-hand to the Sergeant-at-Arms.
- e.) Tardiness to a meeting is a loss of voting priviledges.
- f.) Strikes at a meeting will be given by the Sergeant-at-Arms for:
 - 1.) For disrespect of speaker
 - 2.) Talking or whispering
 - 3.) Speaking out of turn
- g.) Three strikes at a meeting means loss of voting priviledges for the remainder of the meeting. After any further disruption the brother will be fined five dollars.
- h.) Mandatory events missed must be properly arranged. If missed the brother will be fined five dollars.
- i.) Persistent cases of tardiness or absences will be referred to the Prudential committee for consideration of Judicial

action.

Committee Meetings

- a.) Chairman is in charge of time, place, and day.
- b.) Meeting will be checked up on by the Sergeant-at-Arms by checking the record book of the chairman. Missing of a meeting will result in a five dollar fine.
- c.) Committees must have a calendar of events submitted at least three weeks before the end of the semester.

Officers

- a.) The By-Laws Chairman is responsible for distributing copies of the by-laws as they change.
- b.) To run for an elective office one must have a 2.2 GPA.

Fund-Raising

- a.) During any raffle sponsored by the chapter no brother or relative is eligible to win any prize.
- b.) Brothers must pay admission at any fraternity sponsored fund-raiser, but may be served free beverages.

Social

- a.) A brother may invite one guest free of charge to a chapter social where guests are allowed. Additional guest must pay three dollars to attend the event.
- b.) Guests will not be allowed at socials with other Greek Organizations.

Inactive Brothers

- a.) May not vote.
- b.) May not participate in any ritualistic activity.
- c.) Must pay to attend fund raising parties and must pay for beverages.
- d.) May not attend a social as a guest of a brother. They must pay a rate to be determined by the president and the social chairman.
- e.) May not attend major banquets or picnics except by a

majority vote of the chapter. They must pay to attend.

- f.) They may not attend retreats.

Bidding

- a.) Any male undergraduate enrolled at Virginia Tech may be extended an invitation to pledge by a majority vote of the active members present.

Initiation

- a.) To be eligible for initiation as an active member a pledge must have completed one semester at Radford University, and every prospective initiate must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better from this institution.
- b.) Pledges without a 2.0 may complete their pledgeship. A pledge will be voted to the status of 'academic pledge' at the same time the vote for brotherhood is taken. The same rules apply to this vote as to the brotherhood vote. Once the GPA of the academic pledge is 2.0 or better he may then be initiated at the next scheduled initiation.
- c.) The status of academic pledge shall not last longer than two semesters at which time the pledge may make further arrangements with the chapter, if the chapter agrees.
- d.) Academic pledges may not vote or attend any ritual other than the pledge ceremony, they may attend all social events of the chapter.

By-Law Amendments

- a.) The by-laws of this chapter may be amended by a simple motion made during any chapter meeting carried by a majority vote.

**Virginia Tech Chapter of
Alpha Sigma Phi
Judicial Board Policies and Procedures**

Purpose

The purpose of the Alpha Sigma Phi Judicial Board shall be to investigate and take action against any brother(s) or pledge(s) of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity, Virginia Tech Chapter, in connection with any and all offenses of misconduct relating to Virginia Polytechnic and State University and/or Alpha Sigma Phi, Virginia Tech Chapter. Hereafter, and throughout this Constitution, the Alpha Sigma Phi, Virginia Tech Chapter, Judicial Board shall be referred to as 'the Judicial Board'.

**Article I
The Judicial Power**

The Judiciary Power of the Alpha Sigma Phi Judicial Board shall be vested in one Judicial Board, consisting of and chaired by the Sergeant-At-Arms, ex-Sergeant-At-Arms, President, and other elected members until the board consists of five members not involved in the violation.

**Article II
Responsibility and Authority of the Judicial Board**

- Section 1. The Judicial Board shall have the responsibility and authority to investigate any and all reported incidents of misconduct and/or any Criminal or University infractions involving a member or pledge of Alpha Sigma Phi, Virginia Tech Chapter.
- Section 2. Definition of Responsibility: Each and every member, as well pledge, of the Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity is responsible for their individual and group action(s). It shall be the responsibility of each member or pledge to act appropriately to the rules, regulations, and coeds of conduct of Alpha Sigma Phi, and Virginia Tech, as well as to abide by all Federal and State Laws.

**Article III
Members of the Judicial Board**

- Section 1. Members of the Judicial Board
- A. The judicial Board shall consist of five voting members of Alpha Sigma Phi and two alternates.

In the event that the accused or accuser are members of the Judicial Board, then alternates shall replace them during necessary Judicial Proceedings.

- B. All at large members of the Judicial Board shall be appointed by the President.
- D. A majority vote by the general membership shall be required to elect a member to the board.
- E. All members and alternates of the Judicial Board shall serve for a term of one year. If a member should graduate, become inactive, or leave the Fraternity or University for any other reason prior to the expiration of their term, they shall be replaced by an elected representative. The alternate's vacancy shall be filled according to the procedures for regular Judicial Board membership.
- F. Alternate members shall have full responsibility in the absence of a regular member.
- G. There must be five members of the Judicial Board present to take action on any case.
- H. A Judicial Board member or Alternate may be removed from the board by a unanimous vote of the other board members.

Article IV

Procedures for Filing Charges

Section 1. Procedures for Filing Charges

- A. Any member, Pledge, or Advisor of the Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity may initiate charges against any member(s), or pledge(s) of the fraternity.
- B. These charges or allegations are to be presented to an Advisor of the Fraternity for review. The Advisor will make a determination as to whether the charges are valid. If the Advisor finds probable cause in the allegations, he/she shall forward the case to the Judicial Board for a hearing.
- C. The Judicial Board shall notify the individual(s) involved, in writing, of the charges against them along with the name of the accuser, and any pertinent evidence.

- D. Evidence must be presented to an Advisor within 14 days of the violation or within 14 days of the time at which the individual(s) involved in an incident are identified.
- E. At least one Advisor must find probable cause in an incident before it is forwarded to the Judicial Board.

Article V

Hearing Procedures

Section 1. The Judicial Chairman shall choose words appropriate to ensure honesty and truth throughout the proceedings and have all involved promise to do the same.

- A. In the event that the accused or accuser is the current chairman or presiding officer, then the lowest roster number, Judicial Board member in attendance shall become the presiding officer.

Section 2. Procedures

- A. The Chairman or presiding officer of the Judicial Board shall read the charges to the accused.
- B. The accused shall enter a plea to the charges.
- C. The accuser(s) shall present their evidence of the alleged violations.
 - 1. The Judicial Board shall have the opportunity to question the accuser(s).
 - 2. The accused shall have the right to question the accuser(s).
- D. The accused shall present his evidence to the alleged incident(s).
 - 1. The Judicial Board shall have the opportunity to question the accused.
 - 2. The accuser(s) shall have the opportunity to question the accused.
- E. Witnesses for the accuser may be called.
 - 1. The Judicial Board may question the accuser's witnesses.

2. The accused may question the witnesses for the accuser.
- F. Witnesses for the accused may be called.
1. The Judicial Board may question the witnesses for the accused.
 2. The accuser may question the witnesses for the accused.
- G. The accuser(s) shall have the opportunity to give any additional information pertaining to the alleged incident(s).
- H. The accused shall give their summation of the incident.
- I. The accuser(s) shall give their summation of the incident.
- J. The Board shall go into deliberations.

Section 2. Findings of the Judicial Board

- A. A majority of the Board is required to return a guilty verdict.
- B. The Board shall read their finding of guilt or innocence to the accused.
- C. The Board shall read their sanction to the accused.
- D. The Judicial Board's decision is binding.

Article VI
Rights of the Accused

Section 1. Rights of the Accused

- A. The accused has the right to an advocate. The advocate must be an active member of the Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity.
- B. The accused has a right to be informed of any and all charges in writing.
- C. The accused may present witnesses on their behalf. If the witness is not a member of the Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity, the judicial Board

shall make a ruling of whether to hear the testimony based on relevancy to the case.

Article VII

Offenses and Possible Sanctions

Section 1. Offenses

- A. The following is a list, but is not limited to, possible judicial offenses.
 - 1. Any action or offense that causes dishonor or disrespect to the Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity
 - 2. Misuse of Fraternity Funds
 - 3. Hazing
 - 4. Destruction of Fraternity property
 - 5. Disregard for seriousness of ritual events
 - 6. Failure to pay Dues or Fraternity Fines
 - 7. Drug Use
 - 8. Theft
 - 9. Disrespect to Brothers, Pledges, or Advisors
 - 10. Failure to abide by the rules and oath of Alpha Sigma Phi
 - 11. Assault upon another member of the Fraternity
 - 12. Conviction of an alcohol or drug related offense while leaving or in route to a Fraternity related function, while wearing Alpha Sigma Phi letters, or that resulted in an accident occurring in the University Community.
 - 13. Misrepresentation or abuse of Fraternity name or letters

Section 2. Sanctions

- A. The following is a list of possible Sanctions that the Judicial Board may determine. The list is not inclusive of all sanctions available to the board, but rather a guide line for Board

consideration and reference.

1. Service House for the fraternity
2. Community Service Hours
3. Counseling/Substance Abuse Program
4. Disciplinary Probation (This includes banning from social functions, loss of voting privileges, and banning from intramural sports activities. It may also, at the recommendation of the Board, include suspension from meetings and Fraternity projects.)
5. Suspension for a specific time period
6. Indefinite Suspension (This shall be an automatic referral the Nations. This referral shall include the endorsement of the Delta Theta Chapter for permanent removal from the Fraternity.

Article VIII

Amendments

Section 1. Amendments

- A. Amendments can be made to the Judicial Policies by the Judicial Board, subject to the final approval of the Prudential Committee.
- B. The general membership may propose amendments/suggestions to the Judicial Board for consideration.
- C. A majority vote is required by the Judicial Board to pass an amendment. The amendment shall then be forwarded to the Prudential Committee for final approval.
- D. Five members of the Board are required to take action on any proposed amendment.




Workshops and Other Productive Retreats

Over the course of our two years of growth we have had the opportunity to hold a few retreats in which we covered much of the ground work of common knowledge on how to do things. In a recent retreat, held on January 28, 1995, we covered such things as: how to rush correctly, development of recruitment strategies, plans to fulfill the Fraternity mission, and setting short and long term goals of the colony. Actually, this effort was spurred by an enthusiastic weekend at the PAL conference in Charlotte. Many of the techniques were discussed and applied in the January 28 retreat, and much was accomplished. There is a seminar planned for April 2, 1995 to learn and review proper parliamentary procedure. This is also incorporated in the pledge period so as to have educated brothers on a fraternity basis. One thing is for certain. We could not have gotten where we are today without the help and support of the Walker family. They have set up a scholarship of \$1000 per year, and attended many of our events. They also invite all of us to their house for an annual Fourth of July bash. With all of this taken into consideration, we as Alpha Sigma Phi of Virginia Polytechnic Institute would like to ask of Alpha Sigma Phi Nationals to make a concession and allow Lyle and Jason Walker, Jeff's father and brother, to be inducted into our chapter to be part Jeff's vision at Virginia Tech. This would mean very much not only to the Walkers, but to our colony as well.

This letter comes in support of the request for charter by the Virginia Tech colony of Alpha Sigma Phi.

I have been truly amazed at how quickly these young men have organized themselves, come together as a group, and become an integral part of Greek life on the Virginia Tech campus. In just over two years, a handful of young men has grown into Alpha Sigma Phi, and made an impact in Blacksburg.

This colony has accomplished much. Starting from scratch, they have become an IFC provisional member and become extremely active in all facets of campus life.

Let me outline some of their accomplishments to date.

Regarding service, the Virginia Tech colony has worked closely with the Radford University chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi's March of Dimes Dime Roll. They have organized a haunted house for elementary school children, organized philanthropic events, and are very active in town and community beautification projects. In addition, the colony has been an active participant in other campus and Greek philanthropic events, winning at least four contests/tournaments of which I am aware.

Beyond service, the brothers are working to increase their understanding of others and themselves. Mandatory seminars have been attended or conducted on topics such as hazing, alcohol, and AIDS.


These young men are very serious about organization of the fraternity and perpetuating brotherhood. During a recent brotherhood retreat, they worked through their goals and visions for Alpha Sigma Phi. This was looked at from both a colony/chapter point of view and how they can create and perpetuate brotherhood within the national framework. Fraternity financial and scholarship records are now computerized. A quarterly system of evaluation has been instituted for each office and committee chair to ensure fulfillment of responsibilities and goals. Through social events, brotherhood retreats, intramural sports, etc., the Virginia Tech colony is creating a real feeling of community and brotherhood.

As for academics, the colony has instituted mandatory study hours, with additional study hours for those brothers whose GPA falls under 2.25. A time management seminar, which will be mandatory, is scheduled for mid-February. A tutoring system has also recently been set up within the brotherhood and the group will recognize new inductees into three different honor societies this semester.

Chartering is the next logical step for these young men. I hope their dream comes true.




